# Plural Possessive Apostrophes With Plural Words

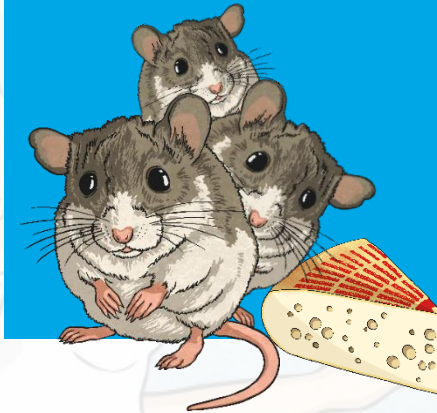

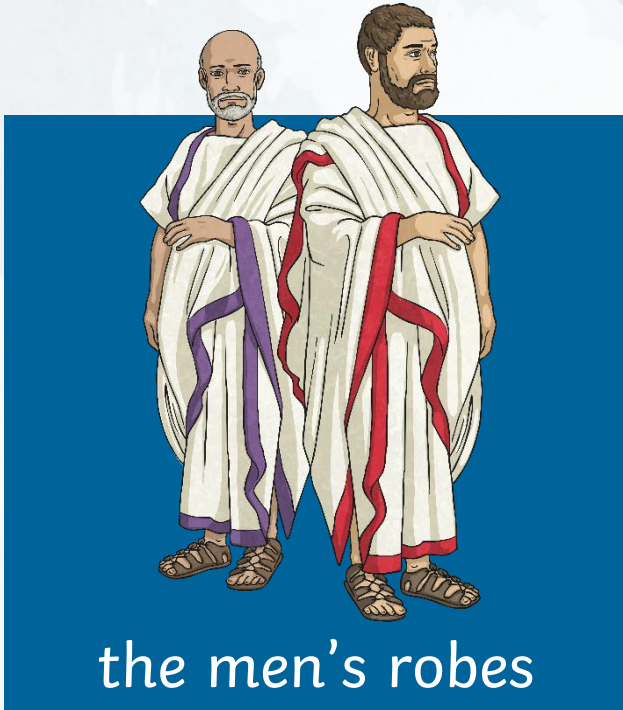

**These words are all plural. This means 'more than one'.**

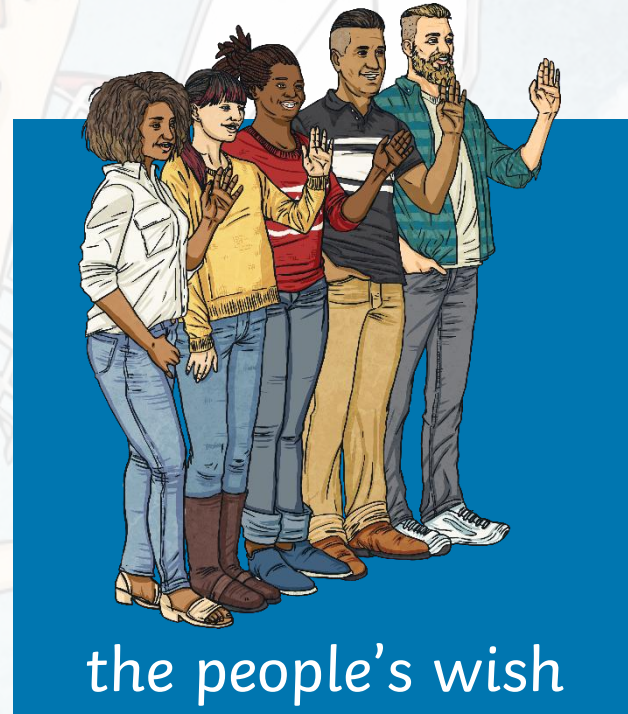
What does the apostrophe do?  
**The use of a plural possessive apostrophe shows that something belongs to a group of more than one thing.**



Some plural nouns are irregular and don't end in an 's'. For example:



the men's robes



the people's wish

Usually, when a plural noun doesn't end in an 's', we add the possessive apostrophe at the end of the word and add an 's'.

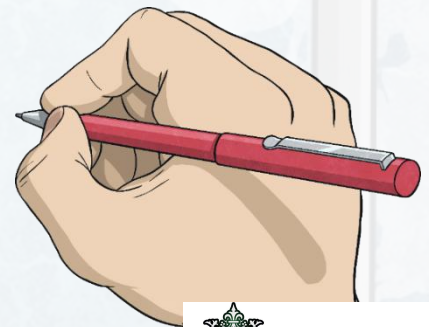

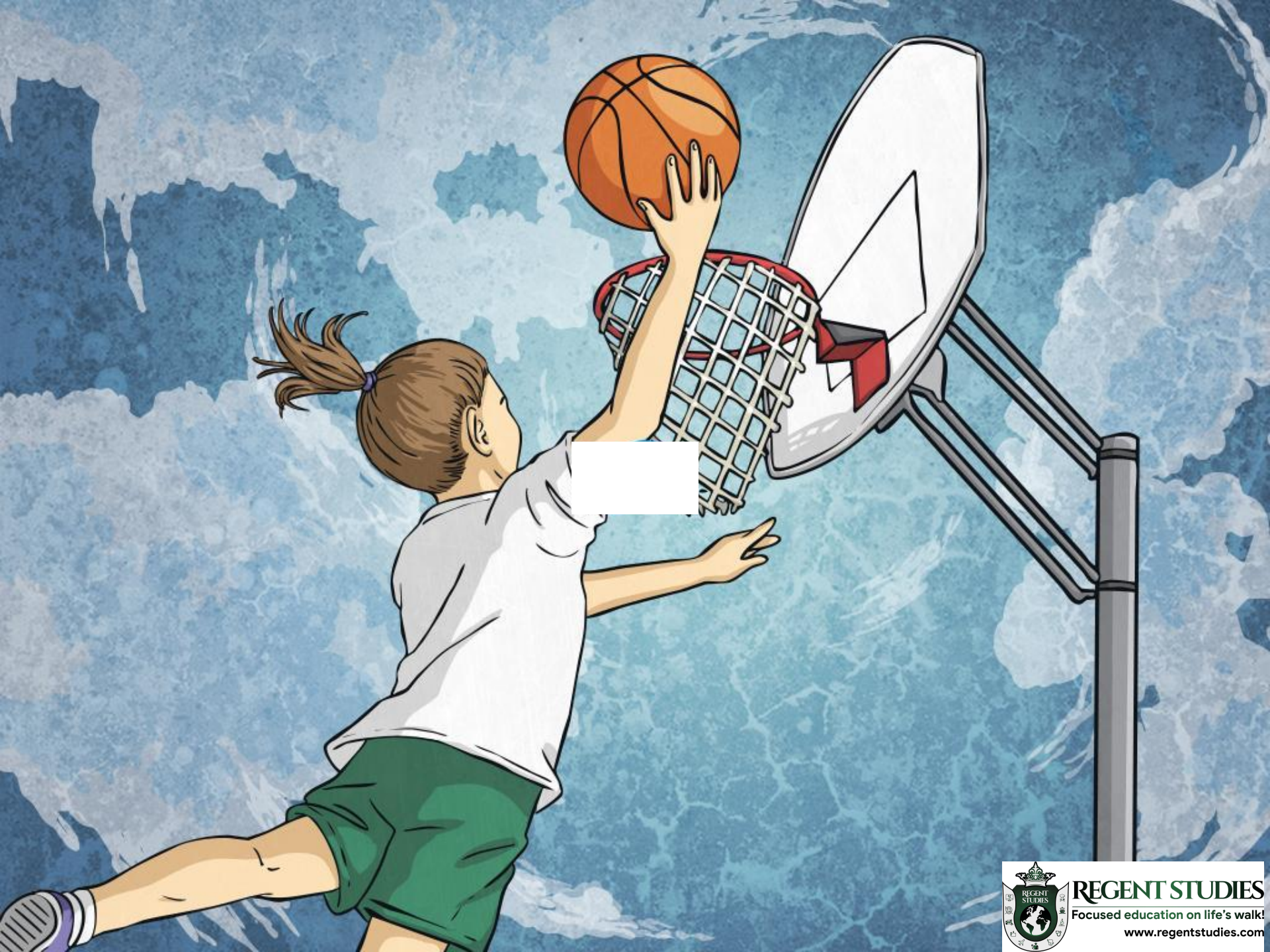
