

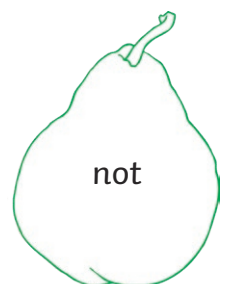
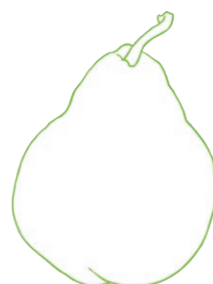
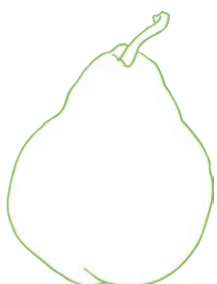
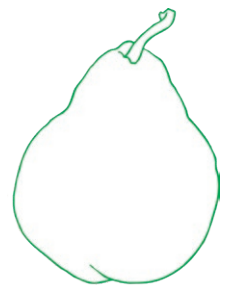
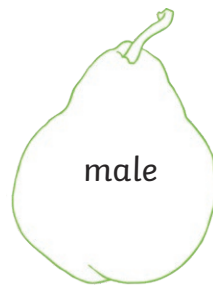
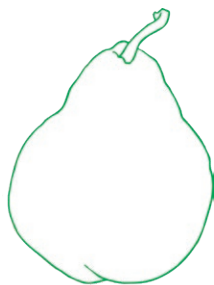
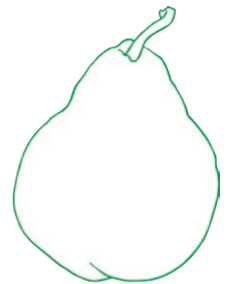
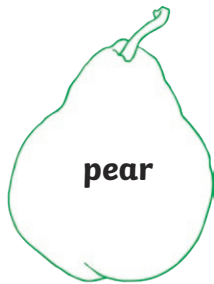
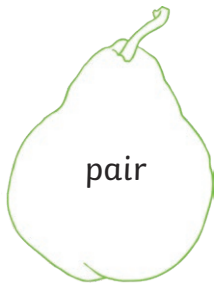
Spelling Bee's Pairs of Pears
