environment

The area in which people, animals or plants live.

flowering

When the colourful part of a plant grows.



non-flowering

A plant that does not produce flowers.

plants

A living thing that grows in the ground and produces seeds.



animals

Living beings that move, eat, breathe, grow and reproduce, such as birds, fish, reptiles, insects and mammals.

vertebrate

An animal with a backbone such as a fish, reptile or bird.



fish

A cold-blooded animal that lives in water with a backbone, gills, fins and skin covered in scales.

amphibian

An animal that lives on land but breeds offspring in the water, such as a frog or toad.



reptile

A cold-blooded animal that lays eggs on land, such as a snake or crocodile.

bird

A two-legged animal with feathers and wings which lays eggs and can usually fly.



mammal

A warm-blooded animal such as a human, dog or whale. The female produces milk to feed its babies.

invertebrates

An animal without a backbone such as an insect, worm or octopus.



snail

A slow-moving mollusc with a spiral shell.

slug

A mollusc without a shell.



mollusc

An invertebrate with a soft body such as a snail, slug or octopus.

worm

A small invertebrate with a long thin body and no limbs.



spider

A small eight-legged invertebrate that spins webs.

insect

A small invertebrate with six legs that usually has wings, such as an ant or fly.



mosses and ferns

Small flowerless plants.

nature reserves

A place where plants and animals are protected and undisturbed.



ecologically planned parks

Parks designed to maintain and protect plants and animals.

garden pond

A pool of still water in a garden.



population

The number of living things in a specific place.

development

The growth of something.



litter

Items of rubbish carelessly dropped in public places.

deforestation

The cutting down and destruction of trees and forests.



arachnid

A small eight-legged invertebrate such as a scorpion or spider.

annelids

A small invertebrate with no limbs whose body is made of many segments, such as a worm.
