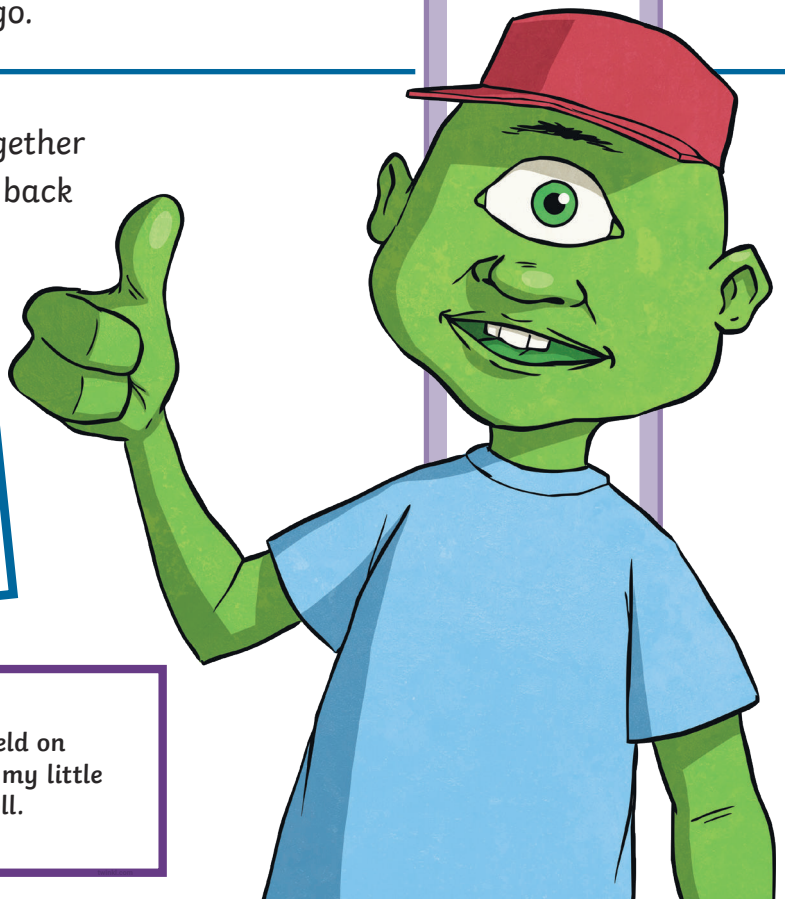


Fronted Adverbials Matching Game

1. Separate the cards into two piles: **main clauses** and **fronted adverbials**.
2. Spread the cards out, face down, into two separate six by six card groups.
3. Choose one main clause and one fronted adverbial card from each group.
4. If the sentence that they make together makes sense, keep the cards and have another go.
5. If the sentence that they make together doesn't make sense, put the cards back and give your opponent a turn.
