
Fronted Adverbials Matching Game

many animals came out of their hiding places.





our frightened cat climbed the tall tree to avoid my friend's dog.




the builders lowered the final support beam for the new roof.

we could hear our dog barking with excitement.







there were several old paintings and a battered chest.





our baby sister let us all know she was hungry.




