-ist	one who	chemist, cartoonist, journalist, physicist
-ity, -it	quality of	activity, equality, curiosity, reality
-ment	condition of	argument, retirement, movement
-ness	state of being	heaviness, happiness, sleepiness, usefulness
-ship	position held	fellowship, internship, ownership, friendship
-sion, -tion	state of being	transition, confusion, decision, revision

-ful	notable for	fanciful, wonderful, skillful, successful
-ic, -ical	pertaining to	musical, organic, historic, athletic, logical
-ious, -ous	characterized by	nutritions, cautious, nervous, mysterious, poisonous
-ish	having the quality of	babyish, stylish
-ive	having the nature of	creative, pensive, creative, expensive
-less	without	endless, fearless, penniless, restless
-y	characterized by	sleazy, hasty, smelly, tasty
