



For teachers for class discussion purposes:

Picture 1 shows soldiers and a First World War tank.

Picture 2 shows a painting from the National Collection of War Art in New Zealand.

Picture 3 shows soldiers in the trenches.

Picture 4 shows divers taking photographs of the wreck of a German U-boat.

Picture 5 shows recruitment posters that were used during the First World War.

Picture 6 is a biplane called a Morane-Saulnier BB 5181. The one in the photograph was brought down on 2^{nd} of August 1916.

Picture 7 is HMS Irresistible. This ship struck a mine on 18th March 1915.

Picture 8 shows 3 soldiers from the 51st (Highland) Division of the British Army. The 51st (Highland) Division fought in France. You can see that the soldier in the middle is wounded.

Picture 9 is a photograph of the launch of HMS Dreadnought. In 1915, this ship became the only one to sink a submarine.

Picture 10 is an observation balloon. These balloons were used to gather intelligence and to spot the enemies weapons and artillery.
