## What Are Modal Verbs?

Modal verbs are auxiliary verbs which cannot usually work alone.
They are used within sentences with another main verb.

## Modal verbs can be used to show how possible something is, or how likely it is to happen/have happened.

For example:

It's snowing so it must be very cold outside.

He's very late. He could have missed the train.

They will lock the windows when they go out.

## Advice or obligation

Pupils must wear a uniform.
You should not smoke.

## Habits

I will often have cereal for my breakfast. We shall always enjoy a walk in the park.

## Permission

May I leave a few minutes early?
Could we go to the post box on the way?
You can have an ice-creamif you eat all your dinner.

## Ability

I can drive a tractor.
My grandfather could draw very well.
