Number and Place Value Roman Numerals Maths Mastery Game

- A game for two players. -

Instructions

Each player has nine Roman numeral cards: C, L, X, X, X, V, I, I, I.


Each player will shuffle their Roman numeral cards and place them face down, in a pile in front of them.

Shuffle the set of number cards and place them, face down, in a pile in the middle.

Turn over the top number card and place it so that both players can see it.

The two players will then take it in turns to pick and turn over a Roman numeral card. Each player will aim to make a number as close to the value on the number card as possible. The player with the closest number wins a point.

Players can turn over their Roman numeral cards until they choose to stop. The other player can carry on turning over their Roman numeral cards until they choose to stop.



Player 1 reveals cards X, I and L, which can be used to make XLI (41). **Player 2** reveals cards V, I, I, X, X and X, which can be used to make XXXVII (37).

41 is closer to 49 than 37, so player 1 wins a point.
