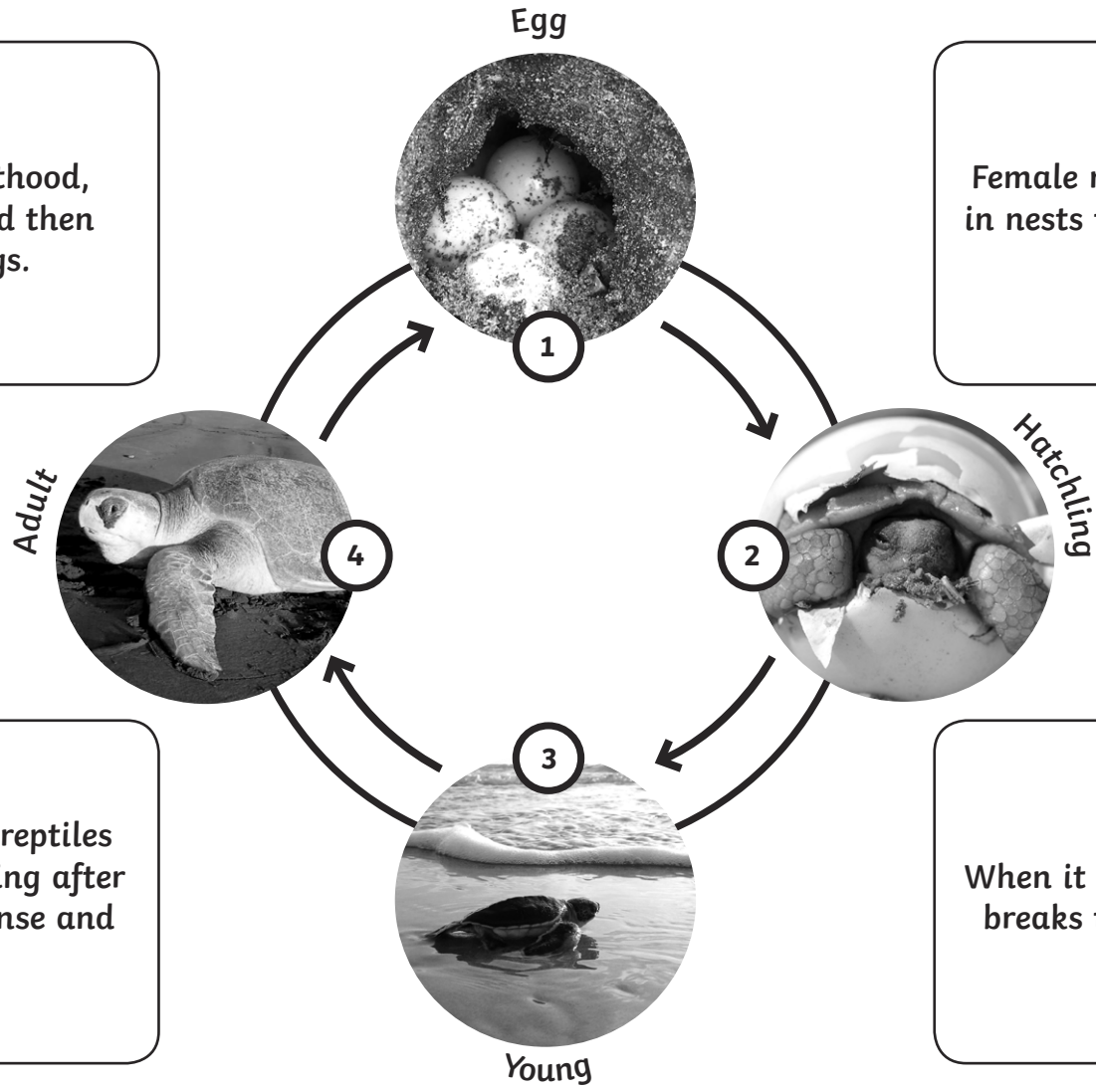


The Reptile Life Cycle

Once a reptile reaches adulthood, it will look for a partner and then reproduce their own eggs.

Female reptiles usually lay their eggs in nests to protect them until they are ready to hatch.



Unlike human babies, infant reptiles are born fully capable of looking after themselves. They can even sense and avoid danger.

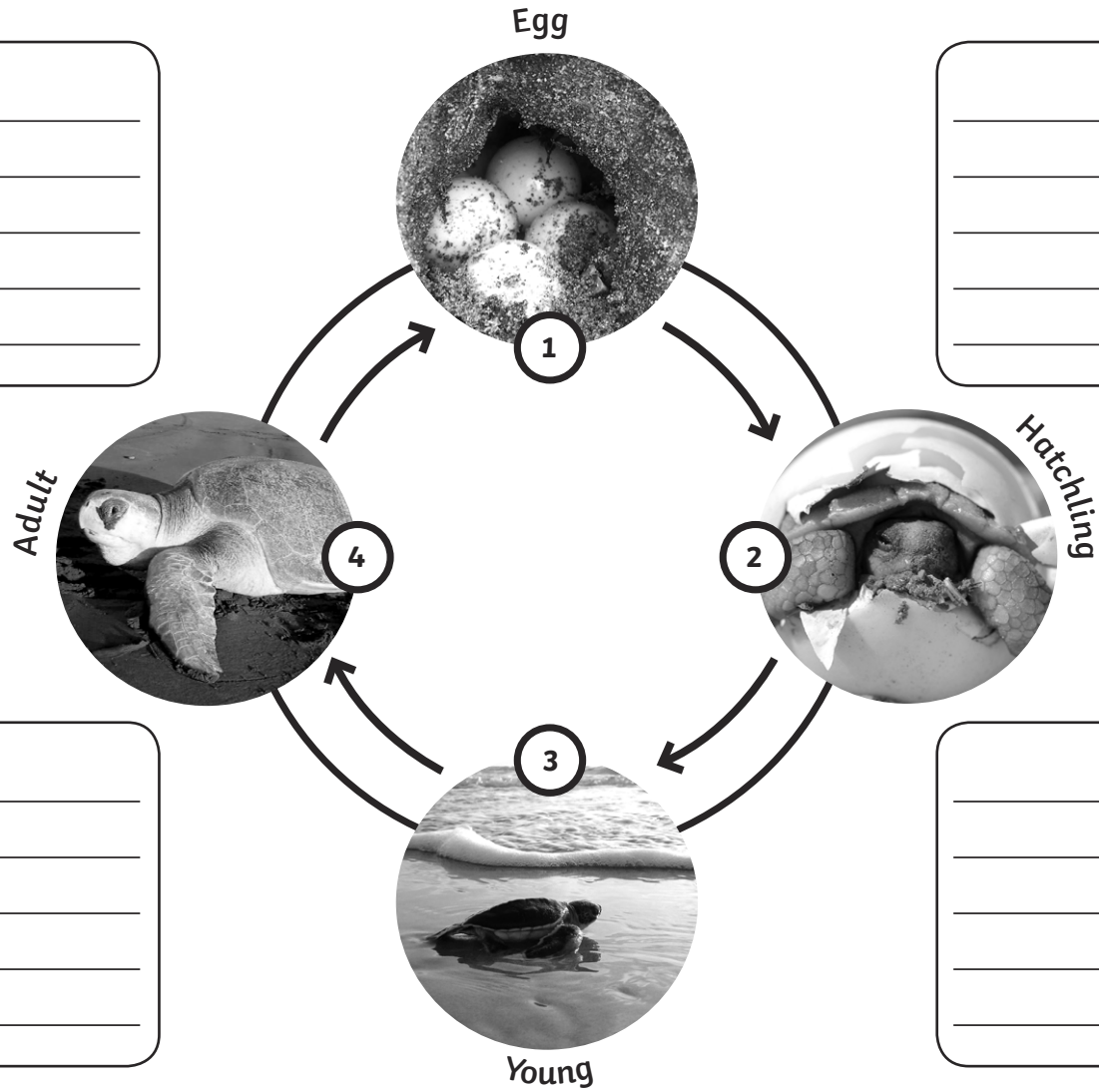
When it is ready to hatch, the embryo breaks through the egg and is born.

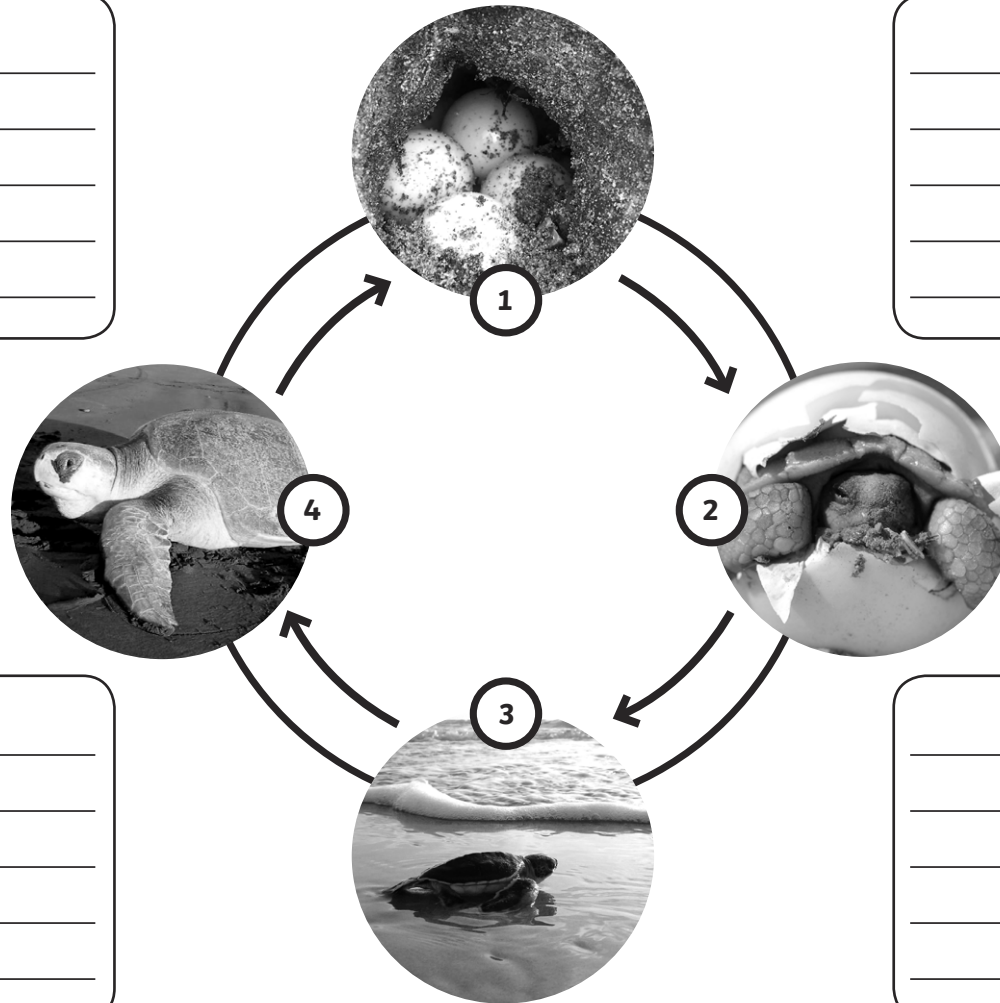

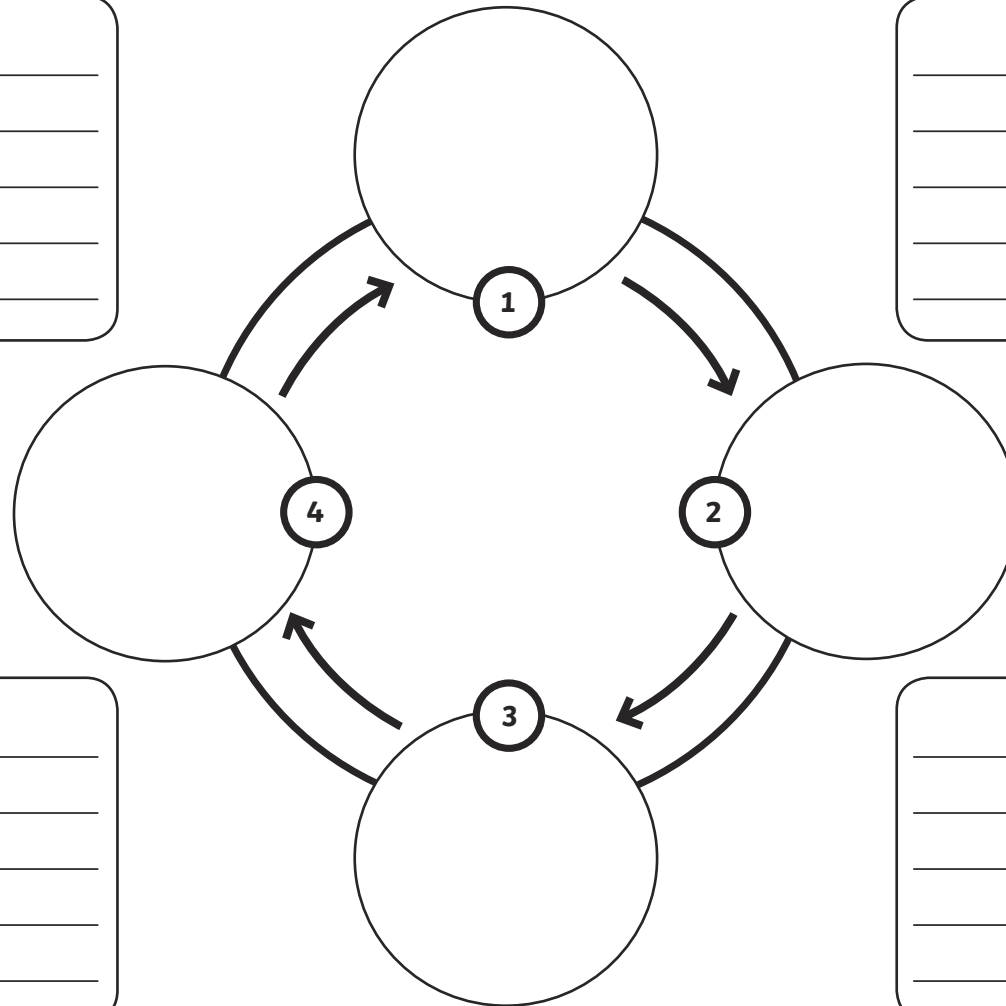
