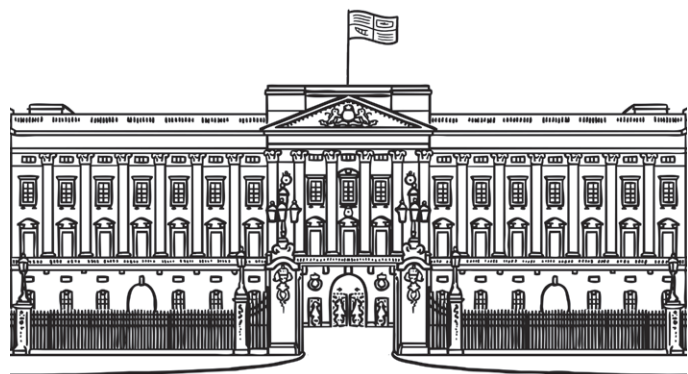

Trooping the Colour Parade

This parade is performed every year by the mounted Horse Guards.

It starts at Buckingham Palace and involves more than 1400 officers and 200 horses!

The parade is so important the guards have to practise a number of times before the day.

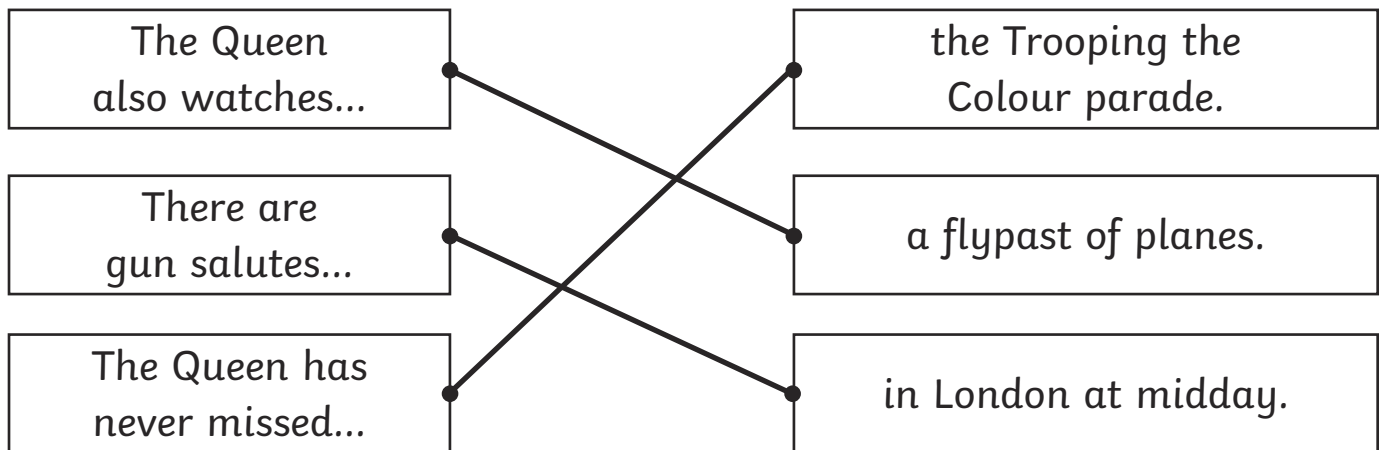

Did You Know...?

Kings and queens often have an official birthday on a day other than their actual birthday.



King Edward VII was born on 9th November but his official birthday was celebrated in May or June.



The Queen celebrates two birthdays each year. She has her actual birthday on the day she was born on 21st April but she also celebrates an 'official' birthday on the second Saturday in June with a big parade.

How Does The Queen Celebrate?

The Queen spends her actual birthday privately with her family and friends. Her official birthday in June is marked publicly by a gun salute in central London at noon.



There is also a spectacular parade called 'Trooping the Colour' where The Queen is saluted by over 1400 officers. There are also over 200 horses in the parade!



Our Record-Breaking Queen!

Queen Elizabeth II is Britain's longest reigning monarch, which means she has been queen for longer than anyone has been our king or queen before.



She has ruled our country for over 70 years and has beaten the record held by Queen Victoria.

The parade is so important, the guards have to practise a number of times in the weeks before the day. The Queen has also never missed the Trooping the Colour parade.



The Queen also watches a flypast of planes by the Royal Air Force from her balcony at Buckingham Palace later in the day.
