
This was Nigel's first step to becoming a real-life palaeontologist. It was the best Dinosaur Day ever!

Accept the answer A palaeontologist is a 'dinosaur expert'.

Why do you think Nigel thought this?

Accept answers which infer that Nigel thought this because he had sat through many boring talks that day and did not appreciate another one, e.g.

 Nigel thought this because he had already sat through lots of boring talks on Dinosaur Day.

Q4: What is the scientific name for fossilised dinosaur dung?

Accept the answer 'coprolite' only.

Q5: Find and copy a phrase which shows that Nigel had been disappointed by Dinosaur Day.

Accept the phrase '(that's why Dinosaur Day had been) such a let-down'.

Q6: 'Ja," he said after a short pause...'

Why do you think that Dr Doodoo paused for a short time?

Accept answers which discuss the fact that Dr Doodoo was shocked/stunned by Nigel's knowledge. He did not expect a student to know the answer and so it caught him off guard.

Q7: Why do you think that Mrs Fairfax was gobsmacked?

Accept answers which state that Mrs Fairfax was gobsmacked because Nigel hadn't shown any previous interest in Dinosaur Day or any of her lessons and he was suddenly enthusiastic and knowledgeable.

Accept answers which state that the author has chosen to write in this way to emphasise Dr Doodoo's 'foreign accent' and its difference to regular English pronunciation, e.g.

• The author writes in this way to emphasise Dr Doodoo's accent.

Q9: 'Well," Nigel said, rubbing his chin.' Why did Nigel rub his chin?

Accept answers which state that Nigel rubbed his chin as it is something that some people do when they are thinking and a stereotypical gesture associated with thinking, e.g.

• Nigel rubbed his chin because he was thinking of an answer and some people rub their chin when they are thinking.

Q10: How does Nigel feel when he realises the coprolite was from a Titanosaur?

Use evidence from the text to support your answer.

Accept answers which discuss that Nigel was shocked, surprised, excited or impressed and are supported by one of the following pieces of evidence from the text:

- · Nigel couldn't believe it.
- "What?" he gasped.
- · Wow!
- Nigel didn't feel bored after that.

Q11: Explain how Nigel's feelings change over the course of the story.

Accept answers which discuss that Nigel was initially bored by Dinosaur Day and did not find anything interesting. However, upon the revelation of a coprolite by Dr Doodoo, Nigel became interested in Dinosaur Day and was no longer bored.

Q12: Summarise the plot of this story in 20 words or less.

Accept any reasonable summary of the story, which includes Nigel being bored of Dinosaur Day but becoming interested upon being shown a coprolite by Dr Doodoo, in twenty words or less, such as:

'Nigel was bored of Dinosaur Day at school until Dr Doodoo brought in a coprolite.'

'A strange scientist brought a coprolite into school on Dinosaur Day and stopped Nigel being bored.'
