

Sunflower Poetry Project **Unit Overview**

About this Unit

This is a short scheme written with lower ability Year Seven students in mind. It is a good way to introduce poetry almost without the students realising it! Even if your class is intimidated by poetry or lacking in confidence, it will help foster understanding and enjoyment.

There is a booklet of sunflower poems which can be read in class and used for independent reading. The activities for each lesson are based around the topic of sunflowers.

By the end of the scheme, your class should be confident with adjectives, similes and personification and should be able to take their first steps to analysing a poem without fear.

If you want to be adventurous, you can even have your class plant a sunflower each so that by the end of the scheme, they will have their own sunflower poem plus a plant to take home!
