<u>Sentence Fragments</u>

A sentence needs to have a subject and predicate to be complete. If either the subject or predicate are absent, it is a sentence fragment. It doesn't matter how long or short a sentence is, as long as it has both parts.

To understand this concept, think of a pizza. A plain cheese pizza may not be very exciting, but it is still a whole pizza.



Meanwhile, a pizza slice can be loaded with delicious toppings, but is still just a slice rather than a full pizza.

The same is true for sentences.

Examples:

He ran.

"He" is the subject, and "ran" is the predicate. Therefore, even though there is little to no detail, this is a complete sentence.

Ran faster than a cheetah chasing its prey. While there is some interesting detail, this is missing a subject and is therefore a sentence fragment.
