Possessive Nouns (Level 1)

Possessive nouns are used to show who owns something. We create possessive nouns by adding an apostrophe(') and sometimes the letter(s) to the end of a word. (Gabby's, Mike's).

How to make possessive nouns:

For most singular nouns we add ('s) to the end of the noun. Example: person's, woman's, Toby's For most plural nouns we add (') to the end of the noun. Example: boys', dogs', students' For irregular plural nouns that do not end with (s) we add ('s) just like the singular nouns. Example: children's, sheep's, men's
