
Activity 1: (beginning) 10-15 min

Sorting : I recommend printing these on card stock or laminating them. Introduce the concept and check for the basic understanding. Since this is a formative assessment activity it should only take 15 min and if done with partners maybe 10 min. Go over the answers with your students spending time on the words you know that the students will find difficult. There are some irregular plural nouns so prep for this. Hope this is helpful for you and your studious minds!
