X	Subjective	Objective
First Person	I, we	me, us
Second Person	you	You
Third Person	he, she, they, it	him, her, them, it

Case: what role the pronoun has in a clause.

<u>Subjective</u>: when the pronoun takes an action. Ex: I, we, you, he, she, they, it

We went home.

<u>Objective</u>: when the pronoun does not take an action. Ex: me, us, you, him, her, them, it

Mike hit <u>me</u>.

Perspective: The point of view of the sentence.

<u>First Person</u>: First hand account, directly from the speaker. Ex: I, we, me, us, my, mine.

We love school.

<u>Second Person</u>: When someone else is speaking for you. Ex: you, your, yours

You feel good when you do your homework.

<u>Third Person</u>: Other pronouns not referring to I, we, or you. Ex: he, she, they, it, his, her, its, their(s), him, her, them

<u>She</u> left. <u>It</u> is my favorite.
