

Identifying Appositives Numero Uno

An appositive **follows a noun** and GIVES **MORE INFORMATION ABOUT THE NOUN.** Commas are used to set off appositives from the rest of the sentence.

Place commas where they belong around the appositive phrases.

Example: Mrs. Sullivan, a math teacher, is in room 26.
