How can I use this with my children?

By combining the poster and word mat for each type of word (adjectives, adverbs and verbs) your child has a visual reminder of the definition of each and a comprehensive collection of examples to use.

How does this help my children's learning?

When your children write their own sentences, they can benefit from having adventurous examples of words to use, helping to build up the quality of their writing and developing a wider vocabulary.

Ideas for further learning:

Your children may want to create their own posters. They could begin by putting 'adjective', 'adverb' or 'verb' in the centre of the page, then surround this with their own examples of each word type.
