Lesson:

Step 1: Click this link or type this web address into your web address bar:

. Watch the School House Rock Video to review pronouns.

Step 2: Say to your students, "Class, we are now going to complete a quick write. You will need a sheet of paper and a pencil. First I want you just to think about this question, Why are pronouns important to use? Think back to the video and what the speaker said about pronouns." Give them a few seconds to think then ask them to write as much as they can think of about why pronouns are important within 30 seconds.

Step 3: Now say to your students, "Now we are going to do a timed pair share with a partner. (If they are not sitting with a partner have them standup, put their hand up, and high-five someone to work with and go to the perimeter of the class). When I say go, You will each have 20 seconds to share your ideas. Quickly decide which partner will go first sharing about why pronouns are important. Go!"

Step 4: As they are sharing walk around the room listening to conversations to check for understanding.

Step 5: Discuss with the class the importance of pronouns then say, "Now that we have discussed why pronouns are important, let's take a few notes about pronouns."

Step 6: Provide practice sentences and have the students highlight the pronouns one color and the antecedents another color. Option: It works best if the entire class uses the same color for pronouns and antecedents. Also, If the students do not have highlighters, have them underline the pronoun and circle the antecedents.

Step 7: Have students complete the challenge activity and quiz their partners.







Did you see him?


