
# Perfect Progressive Tenses



#### **Past Perfect Progressive**

Also known as **Past Perfect Continuous**. Describes actions that were in progress up to the moment when another action took place.

Example: I had been walking the dog for an hour when her lead snapped.

### **Present Perfect Progressive**

Also known as **Present Perfect Continuous**. Describes events which started at some point in the past which may not be finished.

Example: I have been walking the dog for an hour.



### **Future Perfect Progressive**

Also known as **Future Perfect Continuous**. Describes events that will have taken place for some time and not yet finished.

Example: I will have been walking the dog for an hour by the time she meets me tonight.

## Perfect Tenses



### **Past Perfect**

Describes completed events of the past which happened before another action took place.

Example: I had already walked the dog when my friend rang.

### **Present Perfect**

Describes events which started in the past and continued up until now.

Example: I have just walked the dog.

### **Future Perfect**

Describes events that will be finished before another action takes place.

Example: I will have walked the dog by the time my friend rings.

### Future



### Past Progressive

Also known as **Past Continuous**. Describes events which happened in the past over a period of time.

Past

walking the dog

Example: I was walking the dog.

### **Present Progressive**

Also known as **Present Continuous**. Describes events which are happening right now in the present moment.

Example: I am walking the dog.

### **Future Progressive**

Also known as **Future Continuous**. Describes events which will take place over time.

Example: I will be walking the dog.

Present

### **Simple Past**

Past

Also known as **Past Simple**. Describes events which happened at a specific time but are now completed.

Example: I walked the dog earlier today.

### **Simple Present**

Also known as **Present Simple**. Describes events which happen often in the present.

Example: I walk the dog everyday.

## Future

#### **Simple Future**

Also known as **Future Simple**. Describes events which will take place.

Example: I will walk the dog tomorrow.
