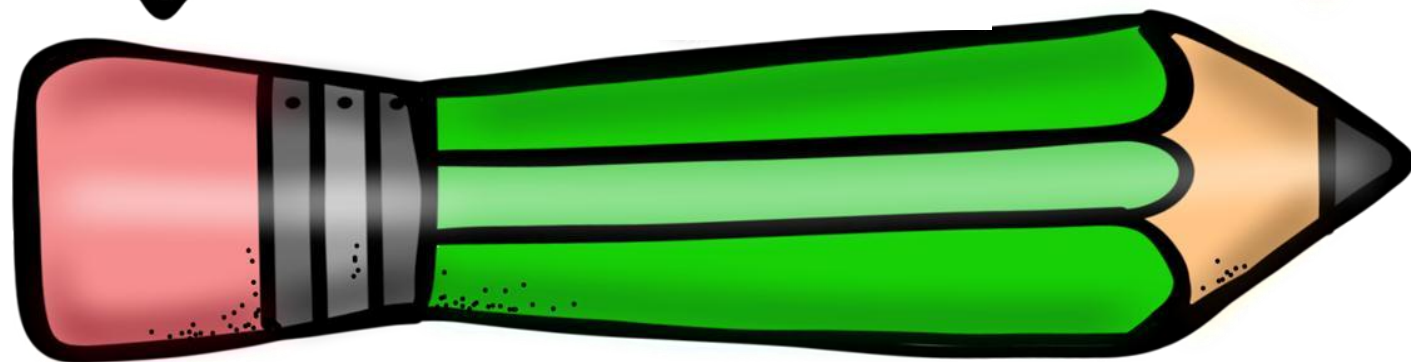

TIP: Remember, **Regular past tense** is when we add -ed to a verb to show that *something already happened*.

Remember, **Possessive nouns** are nouns that show ownership. *The noun owns something*.
