He wants to go to school, or he wants to get a job.
- Fragment 7. While he was reading the book.  
While he was reading the book, he listened to music.
- Run-on 8. I failed the test I didn't study.  
I failed the test, because I didn't study.
- Fragment 9. The salesman wearing the red tie.  
The salesman wearing the red tie was very helpful.
- Run-on 10. The play was long we didn't stay until the end.  
The play was long, so we didn't stay until the end.
