## **Adult Teaching Suggestions**

### Strand A

In a familiar story/rhyme, **the pupil can**, when being read to by an adult (one-to-one or in a small group), **indicate correctly pictures of characters and objects in response to questions, such as 'Where is (the).....?'** 

#### Task

#### Activity One – I Spy!

Use the I Spy with My Little Eye Activity to encourage pupils to find characters and objects. If the pupil is finding it difficult to scan the whole page draw a circle to define the search area and ask the pupil to find characters and objects within this area.

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#### Activity Two – Sharing Stories and Rhymes

When reading a range of fiction and non-fiction books with the pupil that reflects their interests, spend a few minutes looking at the pictures and discussing what is happening on each page. Use The **Gingerbread Man eBook**, sharing the story. Use The **Gingerbread Man Stick Puppets** to see if pupils can match the characters and name some of the key objects, such as the cottage/house, the river, the oven etc. If pupils are secure with matching, ask them to identify the characters without the use of the picture prompts. You could ask: 'Where is the man?'; 'Where is the dog?'; or 'Where is the river?'



#### Activity Three – Picture It

Use the **Airport Can You Find Poster**, **Farm Can You Find Poster** and **Swimming Pool Can You Find Poster** to ask the pupil to identify objects and characters within a variety of topics and settings.

### Strand B

In a familiar story/rhyme, the pupil can, when being read to by an adult (one-to-one or in a small group), show anticipation about what is going to happen (e.g. by turning the page).

#### Task

#### Activity One - Sequencing Picture Cards

Use the **At the Circus Sequencing Cards** to encourage pupils to anticipate what will happen next. Place the cards in order on the table face down. Turn the first card over and describe what is happening in the picture. Before turning the next card over, ask the pupil what might happen in the next picture. Make the activity more engaging for the pupil by helping them to get excited about what might happen next.

#### Activity Two – Reading from an eBook

Use **The Zoo Vet eBook** or any of the Twinkl eBooks available to encourage children to use technology and anticipate what will happen next. Create excitement by inviting different pupils to 'click' to turn the page during reading time.

#### Activity Three - Classroom Modelling

Demonstrate the turning of pages while reading stories to the class or to small groups, using a variety of big books.

























## Sequencing at the Circus

### Instructions


Cut out the pictures on the page, turn them face down on the table.

The child can then turn over the first picture of the sequence, placing it on the left-hand side of the table. Always work from left to right. Discuss with the child what is happening in the picture and create a sentence together about the picture.

Before you turn over the next picture, ask the child what might happen next and get their thoughts before turning over the card. Repeat the above steps until the sequence is complete.


It is a great opportunity, whilst working on sequences, for the adult to use time language, such as what happened first, next and last, or beginning, middle and end. You could also ask the child to think of a different ending to the sequencing cards.


















































# **Adult Teaching Suggestions**

## Strand C

In a familiar story/rhyme, the pupil can, when being read to by an adult (one-to-one or in a small group), join in with some actions or repeat some words, rhymes and phrases when prompted.

### Task

#### Activity One – Act it Out

Puppets, such as stick puppets and hand puppets, are a great way to cue pupils into the words they should say. Sing a range of familiar action songs and rhymes with the pupils, encouraging them to join in with the actions, noises and words. Use the If You're Happy and You Know It Song PowerPoint and If You're Happy and You Know It Nursery Rhyme Picture Flashcards along with the Old MacDonald Had a Farm Stick Puppets. When singing each song, leave a pause where the animal is mentioned, hold up the stick puppet and ask the children to say the animal's name, before continuing the song.

#### Activity Two – Adding in Actions

Encourage children to join in with the actions in the **Little Red Riding Hood PowerPoint**. Once the children have become familiar with the words and phrases, reduce the visual prompts of the actions and use alternative prompts, such as the **Little Red Riding Hood Page Stick Puppets**. Retell the story and leave pauses for the children to join in using the puppets.

#### Activity Three – Acting Out the Story

Role-play familiar stories using props and costumes to enable pupils to get into character. Encourage the pupils to act out a story using **The Enormous Turnip Role Play Masks** and **The Enormous Turnip eBook** to see if they can follow and act out the key events of each story. Remember to pause when reaching the familiar phrases in each story to assess whether the children can say the words without prompting.
