





After they'd finished their hot dogs, it was time for the fairground rides.




Everything was so colourful and noisy. Bo couldn't decide what to go on first!

Who chooses to go on the carousel?






Everyone gathered around the bonfire as the Guy was placed on top and the fire was lit.
