Task


Activity One – Phoneme Spotter Stories

Select an appropriate text from the **Phoneme Spotter Story Bumper Story Pack** and ask pupils to read it to you aloud. Listen and check for accuracy and fluency, making a note of anything they particularly find difficult.



Activity Two - Ronald the Rhino

Ask pupils to read **Ronald the Rhino eBook** aloud. Listen and check for accuracy and fluency, making a note of anything they particularly find difficult.



Activity Three - 60 Second Reads

Choose an appropriate text from the 60-Second Reads Bumper Pack and ask pupils to read it to you aloud. Listen and check for accuracy and fluency, making a note of anything they particularly find difficult.





60-Second Reads Guidance


Recent DfE Guidance stated that:

In age-appropriate books, a year 2 pupil working at age-related expectations should read words accurately and fluently without overt sounding and blending, at a rate of over 90 words per minute.

This resource aims to give you the ability to test a pupil's level of fluency to this expected standard. Each 60-Second Read Activity Card features a short extract of age-appropriate text with an average word count of 90 words. The cumulative word count for each line of text is shown in the left-hand margin of each card. Each of the cards also contains a set of comprehension questions that link to the KS1 reading content domains.

Each different question type has its own canine helper to remind children of what they need to do to answer a question appropriately:

Inference Questions with Inference Iggy


Inference Iggy will help you hunt for clues in a text about how someone might be feeling or why something is happening.

Predicting Pip tries to see the future and she will help you work out what might happen next.















Ronald the Rhino














"All of the animals have a grand trait, Something unique that makes them just great."

"I've got it!" he cries, with a smile on his face, And he wiggles and jiggles all over the place.




"I'll be a leopard with beautiful spots, All yellowish fur and dark brownish dots."

He soon finds some mud, all sticky and wet. "Great!" Ronald says, "I'll have my spots yet!"


He starts right away, painting on patches, Using his horn to scoop mud up in batches.

"What are you doing?" Leopard asks with a grin. "You've mud in great patches all over your skin!"










"I want to be like you, with spots on my face, To sleep in a tree; to run, leap and race!"

"You can't be a leopard, you're too big and grey. You're a Javan rhino in every way!"




Ronald looks sad, unsure what to do. He lets out a sigh; he's feeling so blue.




Leopard and Python see Ronald so glum, So they cook up a plan to cheer up their chum.


"We've got it!" they say, looking down at his face. Ronald wiggles and jiggles all over the place.



His skin is tough and looks like great armour. His eyes sparkle brightly – he's a real charmer!




His legs are so strong and his horn is the best. The animals love him, as you may have guessed.






"I want to be like him!" Ronald cries out, His eyes shining bright as his feet dance about.


So into the forest they set off to find This mystery animal that might change his mind.

Leopard says with a smile, "He lives just down there." Across the wet ground, he approaches with care.






Ronald moves closer to look at this beast, His heart all aflutter, his brow lined and creased.

He looks hard for a moment, his eyes flashing fast. The water is silty with mud flowing past.




He stops as he sees it and then gasps out loud. Leopard and Python could cry, they're so proud.














The Snail in the Rain




A contest was put on by the Queen, in spring. The snail and the dog with a tail, went to the start mark.




The aim was not to fail but to finish first. The main road was straight but full of bumps.

The snail felt bad. He went to pick up the dog. The dog was in pain.


The snail put the dog on his shell and went to the train.




The train took them to the end of a rail track. They went to the finish together.

It was hot. Clair sat on a chair to put on a pair of red flip-flops.




Then, she brushed her short hair and put in a clip.

Marvin and Arthur went to the park on a bright day. The park was not too far so they did not need the car.



The shark swam to harm them so they left the park.






On a farm, near the coast, a farmer kept animals. He had dogs, cats, sheep, goats and hens.




The hens laid eggs. In the winter, a red hen laid a big egg.

For his dinner, Chuck had seeds and nuts. The seeds and nuts went 'crunch'.




The last of her meerkats had big ears and a beard.

Tom got into his seat in the back of the car and the puppy got on his knee. Pete held his toy sheep. Off they went. Beep! Beep!


At the end of the street there was a big truck. It had lost a wheel. "Oh, no," said Tom. "We'll be here for a week!"

Dad went to speak to the driver to see if he could help. They put the wheel back on. Then Dad said, "I must hurry. We need to get to the beach."


At last they got to the sea. Tom and Pete had an ice-cream. Mum and Dad had a cup of tea. The puppy went to sleep under a tree.






In the north, was a town. Perth was the town.



In Perth, was a river. The river was long and led to a rock pool.




One day, in the winter, a man ran from the rock pool.

A crisp bag


A white sock

"All right," said Mum, "but you must hold the string tight."


On the green there was a light breeze and the kite went up, up, up, high in the sky. Then suddenly it came down, down, down...

CRASH! It fell into the duck pond!


The kite was fine, but Mum said, "I think it's time for tea. Let's go home."

Long ago, King Bing had lots of silver rings and chains. Bing had spent a lot of coins to get them.




His best ring was bright red. He put a cloth on it to polish it.




On a dark night, a gang put a brick in the glass. The glass went 'bang!'




The men got in and took the ring from the cabinet next to King Bing. In the morning, King Bing got up and was upset. He had lost his best ring.

"Don't worry," said Dad. "I know I can help him."


After tea, Dad went to the shed and got an old green coat and a thin rope. Jazz and Hal got the end of a loaf of bread.

Jazz and Hal gave Joe some of the loaf to eat. Old Joe was happy at last.








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
The Coin in the Soil




Long ago, a boat with a pointy mast set sail.



The men on the boat were looking for a land called Poin. They had heard that there was gold there.






The Fox and the Owl



In the big, green wood, was an owl and a fox.




The owl and fox wished to be king. All of the animals gathered together to pick a king.




"I will be the best king, as I am strong and clever. I am better than the owl. You cannot pick him!"




"I can swoop and look and see all the town from up high," went the owl. "Let me be king."



Just then he saw a strange shape. It looked suspiciously like a giant fish but it was just a shadow of a passing ship. The water moved like a water chute as the ship dashed past.





Beth has a mum and a dad. Her mum is Thelma and her dad is Seth.




Beth is three and she has fun. She has fun in her bedroom with her things. Her best thing is a doll.
