


Top Tip

The grapheme 'ea' makes the same sound as 'ee'. There is not a consistent rule for when to use 'ee' or 'ea' so you just need to learn which grapheme to choose.




Today, we are learning to read words that contain ea saying /ee/.

The graphemes 'e', 'ee' and 'ea' are all used to spell the /ee/ phoneme in words such as 'be', 'bee' and 'bead'. There is not a consistent rule for when to use 'ee' or 'ea' so children will need to learn which grapheme to choose.

Sometimes, **ea** can make the /ee/ sound. Click on the seals to reveal the **ea** saying /ee/ words.








Kit discovers that seals sleep in the sea. Can you spot any **ea** words in the sea?



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Sentence Time


What does Kit say to Mr Adams as he shows him his book? Read the sentence, then click 'Show' to reveal the answer!


