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Whole Class Activity Human Sentence Teacher Guide

Human Sentence activity is an activity to help students practice and strengthen their ability to use simple verb tenses. Introduce or review present, past, and future tenses within a whole group setting. This activity is ideal for kinesthetic learners or to add movement to your lesson.

How To Play Human Sentence

Optional: On colored paper, print the verb cards and the rest of the words on a different color to help differentiate between words.

- Distribute the set of cards to students at random.
- Read the sentence from the sentence guide omitting the verb.
- As the kids hear their word, they line up to make the sentence.
- Call out the various verb tense of the correct word. Students with a different spelling of the words also stand up.
- Ask the class which form of the verb is correct to complete the sentence.
- The student with the correct form of the verb joins the group.
- Ask students to explain their reasoning.
- Verify with the class the correct usage of the verb and read the complete sentence.

Optional

- Have each student write each sentence in the sentence recording sheet. Then analyze and discuss the changes the verb undergoes each time the subject changes.
- Reinforce other grammar skills.
