The Role of a Novel Generation of Emollients, 'Emollients Plus', in Atopic Dermatitis

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


Atopic Dermatitis (AD) is a **chronic inflammatory skin disease characterized by dry skin, intense itching, and inflammatory skin lesions**, and can be highly heterogeneous in presentation.

Emollients are the mainstay maintenance treatment for atopic dermatitis.

EMOLLIENT CATEGORY	ACTIVES	FUNCTION
First- generation	Petrolatum, paraffin oil, and fatty alcohols	Hygroscopic and occlusive
Second-generation	glycerol, sorbitol, and natural moisturizing factor substitutes	Restore hydration and barrier function
Third - generation	Physiological lipids	Repair the skin barrier

A novel generation of emollients: 'Emollient plus'



Clinical Efficacy of "Emollient Plus"

Ten studies on nine emollients plus were identified, reporting data on average time to flare and/or flare-free period. The **longest average time to flare was reported as >180 days.**
