2020 Year-End Review

- Covid 19 Mandatory Golf Course Closure (3/26/20 – 5/4/20)
- Hazardous Air Quality Course Closed (09/11/20-09/15/20)
- Extreme 100-degree heat: Last week of July
- All 2020 Community Events Cancelled
- Total Revenue \$217K vs. budget of \$275K (\$58K) vs. prior year of \$222K (\$5K)
 - Revenue Shortfall to budget attributed to the above stated external contingencies resulting in 45 total days of mandatory course closure vs. prior year
- Reduced F&B revenue YOY understood due to "Bite" taking over F&B operations
- Total Expenses: \$341K vs. budget of \$391K
- NOI at approximately \$(117K) vs. budget of \$(116K) – speaks to expense controls and operational efficiencies


2020 SUMMARY OF CLAIMS








OSHA INCIDENT RATES 2010 THROUGH 2020
