Kimball Senior Center

- Kimball Senior Center remains closed and continues to be used by the County of San Diego for Covid-19 testing.
- Activity packets with resource information for seniors, crossword puzzles, coloring sheets and jokes were mailed to over 300 registered participants.
- Weekly calls are made to registered participants who requested social wellness calls.

• El Toyon Recreation Center is still hosting Ballet Folklorico Spring Season. This new program now has a total of 50 registered participants.

Special Events

The City of National City will be hosting their 7th annual Community Service Day event, except this year we will be celebrating it the entire month of April. Registration opened February 22nd to March 26th. A total of 53 households registered for this event. Each household received a cleaning kit to participate during the entire month of April. Teams were encouraged to organize their own cleanups with their households at their own time and in their own neighborhood or city parks.

Manuel Portillo Casa de Salud Youth Center

- Casa de Salud continues to partner with Feeding San Diego to provide free emergency lunches. We are currently distributing 160 free meals Monday-Friday for youth 18 and younger. Meals include a hot lunch item, milk, fruit, vegetables and a breakfast item for the next morning.
- The youth center staff held many fun recreational activities.
- Casa de Salud is running a free day camp for members of the youth center who are National City residents. The day camp is limited to 12 youth and all County protocols are being followed. Our day camp runs from 3 pm to 7 pm Monday through Friday with walking field trips to Kimball Park on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- In the month of March, we had a fun visit from the National City firefighters. The firefighters showcased their equipment and even allowed our youth to try on some of the gear.



Public Works

- Work completed in March 2021: weeds sprayed at parks and outer areas, ballfield maintenance, irrigation repairs, removal of homeless camps; fertilize parks, daily sanitizing of benches and playground equipment, weed abatement at Paradise Creek Park and restroom gate repairs.

Kimball Senior Center

Special Programming in Kimball Park

Las Palmas Pool Report

- We continued to host the Sweetwater Union High School District for their water polo season, and began allowing spectators on the deck to watch the games.

Manuel Portillo Casa de Salud Youth Center
