CORONER**8.2 [18-0006](#)**

Joint resolution authorizing a two-year contract, with the option to renew for up to three additional one year periods, with Superior Ambulance Service, Elmhurst, Illinois, for deceased person removal services for the Lake County Coroner's Office in the estimated annual amount of \$125,000.

- The 2018 Budget, as approved, added funding for a deceased person removal service.
- This contract, the funding for which is included in the General Fund Coroner's Office Miscellaneous Contractual Services, will be managed by the Coroner's Office.
- It is anticipated that the cost of deceased person removal will be offset by a reduction in operational costs including a reduction in the purchase of body bags, decreased overtime, and cost avoidance for smaller vehicles in the future.
- Pursuant to Illinois Statute 55 ILCS 5/3-3003, the Coroner has statutory authority to procure the necessary services to perform the duties of the office. Accordingly, a review of vendor options and pricing was done, in lieu of a formal bidding process.
- This contract authorizes a two-year agreement for deceased person removal service, with three additional one-year renewal options, in an estimated annual amount of \$125,000 and approves the continued use of the contract based on the contracted removal rate of \$250 per deceased person.

Joint resolution authorizing the State's Attorney's Appellate Prosecutor Program for fiscal year (FY) 2018 for a continued participation fee of \$42,000.

- This is a renewal for the continued operation of the State's Attorney's Appellate Prosecutor Program.
- Through this program the State's Attorney's Appellate Prosecutor handles Lake County criminal appeals, provides investigative and prosecutorial support in criminal cases, provides comprehensive training programs for prosecutors, and provides monthly case law newsletters, legislative updates, and Uniform Complaint Book supplements.
- The Board of Governors of the State's Attorney's Appellate Prosecutor has voted to keep the Lake County State's Attorney's Office contribution for FY2018 the same as for FY2017 or \$42,000.
- The State's Attorney's approved FY2018 budget, includes the \$42,000 fee.

Joint resolution accepting the 2018 National Crime Victims' Rights Week (NCVRW) Community Awareness Project sub-grant and authorizing an emergency appropriation in the amount of \$5,000.

- Since 1981, National Crime Victims' Rights Week (NCVRW) has annually been observed in April and is intended to increase public awareness and knowledge about the wide range of rights and services available to people who have been victimized by crime.
- A \$5,000 sub-grant was awarded to the State's Attorney's Office by the National Association of Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Assistance Administrators (NAVAA) under a VOCA grant from the Office for Victims of Crime, within the Office of Justice Programs, United States Department of Justice.
- The 2018 NCVRW theme is "Expand the Circle. Reach All Victims."
- The program funds will be used during the 2018 NCVRW, April 8 - 14, 2018, to promote community awareness of crime victims' rights and services and will support the purchase of NCVRW promotional giveaways, event supplies, announcements, and recognition awards.
- The source of program funding is 100 percent federal VOCA; no match is required.

Joint resolution authorizing the Lake County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) to submit an application with the Illinois Department of Transportation for a Distracted Driving Mini Grant in the amount of \$12,090.96 for fiscal year (FY) 2018.

- The Illinois Department of Transportation Distracted Driving Mini Grant (Grant), in the amount of \$12,090.06, funds distracted driving enforcement campaigns to maximize

roadway safety.

- Traffic enforcement campaigns conducted by deputies will enforce Illinois Phone Use Laws that will remind drivers that distracted driving is unsafe.
- If awarded, the Grant will require a two-week, high visibility distracted driving crackdown between April 16 - April 30, 2018. A total of 14 enforcement details (7 during the day, 7 during the night) will be conducted, which amounts to 168 hours of distracted driving enforcement.
