

# Regional Data 2019-2021







### July 4<sup>th</sup> Fireworks-Related Responses (ALL) 9pm – 1am ONLY










Meter box survey of Phase 1 complete




- Project Details
  - Network
    - Propagation analysis shows need for four towers to read all ~25,000 meters Citywide. Proposed locations:
      - City Hall (ballfield by KPD)
      - 54<sup>th</sup> and Olympia Reservoir
      - Thompson Hill Reservoir
      - Kansas Reservoir
    - Towers will be 55' or 75' poles with a whip antenna






- Project Status
  - Due to the number of required meter replacements it was necessary to split the project into two phases.
    - Phase 1 Stand up citywide network, implement analytics and customer portal software, replace 13,000 meters, retrofit 2,500 meters (install transmitters on both). After Phase 1 all customers will be on the new customer portal, only those with AMI meters will have granular data information
    - Phase 2 complete remaining 11,000 meter replacements and transmitter installs, granular data available to all customers.



#### Contracts

- Ferguson/Sensus contract for AMI Network, transmitters, and Analytics.
   Includes ordering of Badger Mechanical Meters
  - \$1,300,000 Meters
  - \$1,300,000 Meter Boxes / Lids
  - \$1,700,000 Transmitters
  - \$350,000 Network
  - \$1,100,000 Construction/Installation
- Water Smart contract to provide Customer Portal
  - \$96,000 (1<sup>st</sup> year cost including installation)
- Total Project Cost
  - Phase 1 ~\$6,000,000 (PWTFL)
  - Phase 2 ~\$5,000,000 (Bond, loan or grant)
- Project Schedule
  - Council Contract Award September 2021
  - Phase 1 Construction October 2021 October 2022
  - Phase 2 Construction 2023



### **Purpose of Project**

- Increase Capacity CCB Busiest Corridor
  - 40,000 vehicles/day
- Improve Safety Reduce Collisions
  - 44 in past 7 years at intersection
  - 6 in past 2 years at car wash driveway
  - Reduce backups and queueing




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### **Proposed Concept**

- Add right turn lanes to all approaches
- Provide for portion of future 3<sup>rd</sup> CCB lane
- Install raised center median on east leg of Deschutes, restricting driveway access

### Car Wash driveway concerns:


- Only 110' from major intersection
- Cars queue into CCB at times
- 60 vehicles in and out for peak hour traffic
- Few gaps for left-in/left-out movements
- Install median to restrict unsafe movements
- Consider moving driveway to east property line
- No reasonable place to turn around




### Car Wash Peak Hour Turning Movements







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### **Construction Costs**

Option 1: No mitigation (CCB intersection only) - \$1.2M

Option 2: With mini-roundabout - \$1.5M

### Funding

### Secured Federal grant for:

- Preliminary Engineering (Design) \$86,500
- Right-of-Way Acquisition \$173,000

Applying for funds for \$1.5M Construction phase

- Transportation Improvement Board (\$1.2M)
- Several legislative calls for projects (CCB corridor)
