Mayor David Hill called the meeting to order.

Jason Curry, President TBHC Foster Care and Adoption, gave the invocation. Mayor Hill led the Pledge of Allegiance and the Texas Pledge of Allegiance.

4. Public Comments

Paula Justice, 602 Cantrell, Waxahachie, Texas, expressed opposition to the City siting their RV park to be non-compliant with zoning regulations.

Alan Fox, 327 University, Waxahachie, Texas, commended City administration and Mayor Hill for prioritizing citizen safety during the Beto O'Rourke Drive Across Texas event held in downtown Waxahachie. Mr. Fox also thanked Waxahachie Police Officers at the event for their professionalism.

Cami Clay, 602 Cantrell, Lot 4, Waxahachie, Texas, spoke in concern of losing her home, as well as other residents who rent at the RV park, if the City proceeds with closing the park for non-compliance with zoning.

Paul Christenson, 110 Williams, Waxahachie, Texas, expressed his disagreement that Certificates of Obligation are ethical, although they are legal. Mr. Christenson requested transparency, bonds approved by citizens, prioritized projects funded by the General Fund, and accused the City of mismanagement of funds.

Bruce Zimmerman, 2821 Howard Road, Waxahachie, Texas, thanked City Council for their service and spoke in support of allowing the tenants to continue living at the RV park at 602 Cantrell.

Ms. Pruitt presented the case noting the applicant is requesting a Site Plan approval to construct a two-story assisted and senior living facility on 5.215 acres at 110 Park Hills Drive. The proposed development includes 78 dwelling units for independent living, 59 assisted living beds, and 28 memory care beds. The proposed facility includes four outdoor courtyards and a pool for residents. Additionally, on-site amenities including a restaurant, fitness center, yoga studio, theater, game room, dog park, salon, and activity space are proposed with the facility. Ms. Pruitt noted the western portion of the property, along Highway 77, is covered by an 80-foot TXU electric easement and the owner has received permission from Oncor to place a dog park and additional parking spaces within the easement. The applicant provided two (2) exterior elevation options for the proposed development with both options featuring natural stone and stucco as the primary materials, with siding and board and batten accents. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the Site Plan with exterior elevation option 2 and staff concurred.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A SPECIFIC USE PERMIT (SUP) TO PERMIT A DRIVE THROUGH ESTABLISHMENT USE WITHIN A PLANNED DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT- GENERAL RETAIL (PD-GR) LOCATED AT 996 W HIGHWAY 287 IN THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, ELLIS COUNTY, TEXAS, BEING 1.66 ACRES KNOWN AS PROPERTY ID 142134, AND ORDERING THE CHANGING OF THE ZONING MAP THEREOF IN ACCORDANCE WITH SAID CHANGE.

Ms. Pruitt presented the case noting the applicant requests a specific use permit to expand an existing heavy machinery and equipment sales and rental business (Pro Star Rental of Waxahachie). The property owner plans to purchase and acquire an additional 0.5 acres from the Northside Church of Christ to integrate into the site and expand the business's equipment rental and sales storage area. Ms. Pruitt explained the applicant is requesting a variance to allow for gravel on the perimeter of the new storage area instead of using concrete as proposed in the remainder. The applicant is also requesting a variance to not screen the outdoor storage along the western property line since the property on the west currently uses that area for outdoor storage, causing minimal visual impact where no screening is proposed. Staff and the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval per the following staff comments:

- 1. Approval of a variance request to utilize gravel in areas shown on the site plan.
- 2. Approval of a variance request to not screen the newly incorporated outdoor storage area along the western property line as shown on the site plan.
- 3. The applicant shall include a landscape plan for the living screen with the civil plan application submitted to the City of Waxahachie Public Works and Engineering Department.
- 4. The applicant shall obtain an irrigation permit from the City of Waxahachie Building Department prior to construction.

Mayor Hill opened the Public Hearing.

- 2. The structure shall, in any case, not be leased or sold and shall not be separately metered.
- 3. The applicant will need to ensure that the structure is habitable.
- 4. The applicant shall obtain a permit from the City of Waxahachie Building Department prior to renovating the accessory structure.

Mayor Hill opened the Public Hearing.

Ms. Pruitt presented the case noting the applicant is requesting to construct a +700 sq. ft. (1,500 sq. ft.) accessory structure to the rear of a single-family residential lot and staff and the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval per staff comments:

- 1. The accessory structure shall not be used as a dwelling.
- 2. The accessory structure shall not be used for commercial purposes.
- 3. The accessory structure shall not be leased or sold separately from the primary residence and shall not be separately metered.
- 4. The concrete will be extended from the driveway to the accessory structure.
- 5. The applicant shall obtain a permit from the City of Waxahachie Building Department prior to the construction of the accessory structure.

Ms. Pruitt stated the use of the building to operate a business is prohibited.

Mayor Hill opened the Public Hearing.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A SPECIFIC USE PERMIT (SUP) TO PERMIT AN ACCESSORY STRUCTURE EQUAL TO OR GREATER THAN 700 SQUARE FEET USE WITHIN A SINGLE FAMILY-1 (SF-1) ZONING DISTRICT, LOCATED 116 SPRING CREEK DRIVE, BEING PROPERTY ID 206166, IN THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, ELLIS COUNTY, TEXAS, BEING LOT 11A, IN THE ROCK BOTTOM RANCH ADDITION, AND ORDERING THE CHANGING OF THE ZONING MAP THEREOF IN ACCORDANCE WITH SAID CHANGE.

Council Member Billie Wallace moved to approve Ordinance No. 3336 per staff comments. Council Member Patrick Souter seconded, All Ayes.

18. Public Hearing on a request by Gregory Nehib, Big Blue Truck, LLC, for a Zoning Change from Single Family Residential-2 (SF-2) zoning district to Central Area (CA) zoning district, located at 206 and 208 N Jackson Street (Property ID 170695 and 170696) - Owner: BIG BLUE TRUCK, LLC (ZDC-80-2022)

Ms. Pruitt presented the case noting the applicant is requesting to rezone approximately 1.98 acres of land located at 206 and 208 North Jackson Street from single-family-residential-2 (SF-2) district to Central Area (CA) district to reuse the existing building for indoor amusement. The property owner has a tenant who would like to operate a haunted house (Reindeer Manor) and a skate park. The applicant has noted they do not plan to make any exterior changes to the building or site improvements. Instead, the prospective tenant intends to make interior changes to occupy the building. Ms. Pruitt stated although the zoning change from SF-2 to Central Area District is appropriate, staff is concerned with the haunted house use and the lack of enhancement or improvements to the existing building given the property's close proximity to downtown. Staff informed the applicant that a site plan will be required if the property owner makes any site and building improvements. Staff received 7 letters of support, 2 letters of opposition, and 1 letter undecided. Staff recommended denial due to staff concerns. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval by a 5-1 vote.

Mayor Hill opened the Public Hearing.

Greg Nehib, 1023 W. Main, Waxahachie, Texas, requested to change the zoning to Central Area District to match the zoning across the street. He explained the 18,000-sf. building is fully sprinkled and commercial taxes are paid on the property although it is zoned Single-Family-Residential.

Those who spoke in support: Coy Sevier, 311 Brown Street, Waxahachie Carl Goss, 603 N. Rogers, Waxahachie Alan Fox, 327 University, Waxahachie Alex Lohman, 801 W. Main, Waxahachie, potential operator of seasonal haunted house proposed

Those who spoke in opposition: Brett Hess, 327 Blue Ribbon Road, Waxahachie

Council Member Billie Wallace inquired about parking on-site and Mr. Nehib explained consideration has been given to allow for employee parking. There is potentially space for 100 parking spots; however, they are not weather proof.

Council Member Travis Smith, Mayor Pro Tem Chris Wright, and Council Member Patrick Souter expressed concern with a straight Central Area District zoning change which would allow a multitude of uses in that area by right. They expressed support for changing the zoning through a Planned Development to remove unwanted uses from the Central Area District zoning for that site.

Mr. Nehib explained there are 3 buildings on-site that could possibly have 3 different uses and would be restricted with a Planned Development.



Council Member Smith asked Mr. Nehib if he is willing to work with staff to identify specific uses for the site and Mr. Nehib agreed.

Mayor Pro Tem Wright expressed his concern with lack of parking and spoke in support of a Planned Development for the site.

Council Member Souter spoke in support of a haunted house and skatepark but voiced his concern for those uses at the proposed site. He expressed his concern regarding parking, the negative affect on surrounding businesses, and lack of exterior improvements to the site.

There being no others to speak for or against ZDC-80-2022, Mayor Hill closed the Public Hearing.

19. Consider proposed Ordinance approving ZDC-80-2022

Mayor Pro Tem Chris Wright moved to deny ZDC-80-2022 as presented. Council Member Billie Wallace seconded, All Ayes.

20. Consider setting Proposed Tax Rate and Dates for Public Hearing

Finance Director Chad Tustison reported, as part of the annual budget process, Chapter 26 of the Property Tax Code requires taxing units to comply with the truth-in-taxation laws in adopting their tax rates. He stated the FY 2023 proposed budget includes a proposed tax rate of \$0.63000. Staff recommended taking a record vote to propose an ad valorem tax rate of \$0.63000 for FY 2023 and schedule a public hearing for Tuesday, August 30, 2022 at 5:30 p.m. in the City Council Chamber. City Council will consider adoption of the tax rate for FY 2023 on September 6, 2022 at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Pro Tem Chris Wright moved to set a proposed tax rate of \$.63000 per \$100 valuation, schedule a public hearing on the tax rate for August 30, 2022 at 5:30 p.m. in the City Council Chamber, and vote to adopt the tax rate on September 6, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. in the City Council Chamber. Council Member Billie Wallace thanked the Fire Department for their quick assistance installing window units to a local non-profit. Council Member Wallace explained she voted against the proposed tax rate as a voice of the tax payers and noted the City can provide more relief due to the inflated property values.

City Manager Michael Scott thanked Senior Planning Director Jennifer Pruitt and her team for all their work.



Mayor Pro Tem Chris Wright announced his phone number and encouraged Paul Christenson to contact him to discuss his concerns.

Council Member Patrick Souter thanked the Police Department for how they handled the Beto O'Rourke Drive Across Texas event downtown. Council Member Souter opposed Mr. Christenson's accusations of unethical behavior noting the law identifies projects allowed to be funded through Certificates of Obligations and the City follows the statutes for the benefit of the citizens.

1. Call to Order

Mayor David Hill called the meeting to order.

2. Conduct a briefing to discuss items for the 7:00 p.m. regular meeting

City Manager Michael Scott reviewed the following agenda items:

- Item 5d, event application for 2022 Junk in the Trunk events to be held September 17, 2022 and November 19, 2022.
- Item 5e, event application for Downtown Jamboree to be held October 15, 2022 at Railyard Park.
- Item 5f, event application for "Run to be Proactive" Veteran's Oath to be held October 15, 2022 at Getzendaner Park.
- Item 5g, event application for Hike for Life 2022 to be held October 22, 2022 at Brown Singleton Park.
- Item 5h, award of bids for one-year contracts with Befour Chemicals and Polydyne for wastewater polymers and Pencco, Inc. for hydrofluorosilicic acid.
- Item 6, proclamation proclaiming August 23, 2022 as "Martin Van Buren Davis, Sr. Day."

Brad Barnes, Assistant Director of Parks and Recreation, reviewed Item 5i, requesting approval of a supplemental appropriation for insurance reimbursement to the Parks Department Budget in the amount of \$29,152.48 for roof replacement at the Ellis County Woman's Building.

Richard Abernethy, Executive Director of Administrative Services, reviewed Item 5j. requesting approval of a resolution approving a negotiated settlement agreement between the Atmos Steering Committee and Atmos Energy, Mid-Tex Division.

Jennifer Pruitt, Senior Director of Planning, reviewed the following cases:

• SUB-58-2022, the applicant is requesting to plat one (1) residential lot in the Rhodes Addition, being 1.00 acres. The applicant is requesting a variance for a 25' Front Building

Line setback due to an existing structure encroaching into the required 40' Front Building Line setback. All City lot size and dimension requirements have been met. Staff and the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval as presented.

- SP-55-2022, the applicant is requesting Site Plan approval to construct a two-story assisted living facility on 5.215 acres with units including 78 dwelling units for independent senior living, 59 assisted living beds, 28 memory care beds, and several amenities. She noted the western portion of the property is covered by an 80-foot TXU electric easement. The applicant has received permission from Oncor to place a dog park and additional parking spaces within the easement. The applicant is proposing to provide a sidewalk easement along Highway 77 in order to provide sidewalks that comply with City of Waxahachie requirements. Staff and the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval as presented.
- ZDC-47-2022, the applicant is requesting a Specific Use Permit to modify the drivethrough circulation and configuration for the existing Chick-fil-A located at 996 W. Highway 287. Staff and the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval per staff comments.
- ZDC-52-2022, the applicant is requesting a Specific Use Permit to expand an existing heavy machinery and equipment sales and rental business. She noted the applicant is requesting a variance to allow for gravel along the perimeter of the new storage area intended to be used to park and store heavy equipment. The remainder of the expansion will be paved. The applicant is also requesting a variance to not screen the outdoor storage along the western property line since the property on the west currently uses that area for outdoor storage, as well. Staff and the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval per staff comments.
- ZDC-76-2022, the applicant is requesting a Specific Use Permit to utilize an existing accessory structure as an accessory dwelling unit. The accessory structure has been used as an accessory dwelling unit for several years, but was just recently brought to the attention of code enforcement. Staff and the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval per staff comments.
- ZDC-83-2022, the applicant is requesting a Specific Use Permit to construct a +700 sq. ft. accessory structure to the rear of a single-family residential lot to be used as a barn for livestock and storage. Staff and the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval per staff comments.
- ZDC-80-2022, the applicant is requesting to rezone approximately 1.98 acres of land located at 206 and 208 North Jackson Street from Single Family Residential-2 (SF-2) to Central Area (CA) district to potentially use the location for indoor entertainment. The property owner has a prospective tenant that is interested in relocating his haunted house business to downtown Waxahachie. The plan is to operate a haunted house in October and use the facility as a skate park the remainder of the year. Ms. Pruitt noted the applicant does not plan on making any exterior changes to the building or site improvements. The tenant intends to make interior changes to occupy the building. If the request for zoning change is approved, the applicant would not be required to provide onsite parking. Although staff recognizes that the zoning change from SF-2 to CA is appropriate, staff is concerned with the use of the site, lack of enhancements and improvements to the existing building and site, and the property's proximity to the downtown core which should contribute to the character of the downtown area. If approved, all uses allowed in the use chart for Central Area District would be allowed for this location. Due to staff concerns,

staff recommended denial. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval by a 5-1 vote.

Chad Tustison, Finance Director, reviewed Item 20, explaining as part of the budget process, Chapter 26 of the Property Tax Code requires taxing units to comply with truth-in-taxation laws in adopting their tax rates. Staff recommends taking a record vote to propose an ad valorem tax rate of \$0.30000 for FY 2023 and schedule a public hearing on Tuesday, August 30, 2022 at 5:30 p.m. in the City Council Chamber. The City Council will consider adoption of the tax rate for FY 2023 on September 6, 2022 at 7:00 p.m.

City Manager Michael Scott gave the invocation. Council Member Travis Smith led the Pledge of Allegiance and the Texas Pledge of Allegiance.

4. Public Comments

Barry Jacobs, 610 Kaufman, Waxahachie, Texas, spoke in opposition to rising taxes and requested City Council to decrease the rate to at least .61 cents to provide property tax relief to citizens.

Randy Donathan, 507 Farley, Waxahachie, Texas, spoke in opposition to rising tax appraisals and asked for a moratorium on growth in the City until there is adequate infrastructure. He recommended removing or reducing funding to new parks, sports complex, and salaries.

Mark Bielamowicz, 307 Seneca, Waxahachie, Texas, spoke in opposition to tax abatements due to direct conflicts with The Constitution.

Gary McKinney, 117 Acuba Lane, Waxahachie, Texas, spoke in opposition to the proposed property tax rate and asked for a reduction. Mr. McKinney expressed his concerns with growth in the City and the impact on infrastructure, especially streets and lack of thorough fares.

Charles Whitaker, 214 Meagan Street, Waxahachie, Texas, spoke in opposition to the proposed tax rate.

5. Public Hearing on the proposed Tax Rate for fiscal year 2022-2023

Finance Director Chad Tustison reviewed the proposed tax rate at \$0.63000 per \$100 valuation, which is a three cent decrease from the current rate. He explained the rate provides for additional

funding for operating costs to keep pace with growth and to fund capital needs throughout the city. He explained \$0.40650 is for Operations and Maintenance (including Sims Library) and \$0.22350 is for Interest and Sinking. He noted the proposed rate exceeds the no-new-revenue rate of \$0.54083 but does not exceed the voter-approval tax rate of \$0.63035.

Mayor Hill opened the Public Hearing on the proposed Tax Rate for fiscal year 2022-2023.

Those who spoke in opposition to the proposed \$0.63000 rate:

There being no others to speak for or against the Public Hearing on the proposed Tax Rate for fiscal year 2022-2023, Mayor Hill closed the Public Hearing.

6. Public Hearing on the City of Waxahachie proposed Budget for fiscal year 2022-2023 and vote to set the date for adoption

Mr. Tustison presented the following FY 2023 proposed budget:

- General Fund \$60,088,570.00
- Waste Water Fund \$12,858,229.00
- Water Fund \$18,911,293.00
- Sokoll Fund \$6,719,809.00
- Waxahachie Community Development Corporation (WCDC) Fund

\$6,749,250.00

- WCDC Debt Service Fund \$1,739,541.00
- General Debt Service Fund \$11,601,250.00
- Hotel/Motel Fund \$963,461.00
- Refuse Service Fund \$1,933,926.00
- Mid-Way Regional Airport Fund \$504,765.00
- Cemetery Fund \$309,734.00

Mr. Tustison explained the 9-month budget process begins in January with staff and departmental meetings. City Council held their first budget work shop in April where Council made recommendations to the proposed budget. After the second budget meeting in August, there were no additional changes to the budget. Mr. Tustison requested a vote to set the adoption date of the FY 23 tax rate and budget for Tuesday, September 6, 2022 at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Hill opened the Public Hearing on the City of Waxahachie proposed Budget for fiscal year 2022-2023.

There being no others to speak for or against the Public Hearing on the City of Waxahachie proposed Budget for fiscal year 2022-2023, Mayor Hill closed the Public Hearing.

Action:

Mayor Pro Tem Chris Wright moved to set the date for adoption of the City of Waxahachie Budget for fiscal year 2022-2023 and the Tax Rate at the City Council meeting of September 6, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. Council Member Patrick Souter seconded, the vote was as follows: Ayes: David Hill, Chris Wright, Patrick Souter, and Travis Smith. Noes: Billie Wallace.

The motion carried.

7. Comments by Mayor, City Council, City Attorney and City Manager

Council Member Travis Smith explained City Council is aware of the rising appraisals and with all the growth, the no new revenue rate is not sufficient; however, he is supportive of a lower tax rate. He reported City Council has been reviewing tangible relief options for tax payers. He explained tax rate caps are placed at the state level and encouraged citizens to contact their state representatives.

Council Member Billie Wallace explained the adoption date is set and she is not supportive of the proposed tax rate at \$0.63000. She encouraged City Council to consider adopting a lower rate to provide relief to citizens.

Mayor Pro Tem Chris Wright expressed his dismay with the state representative issuing a general letter supporting the no new revenue rate. Mayor Pro Tem Wright explained City Council is listening to residents and discussing options to alleviate some of the tax burden on citizens. He encouraged citizens to attend the Comprehensive Plan Advisory Committee meetings that discuss future growth and the means to sustain new and existing infrastructure.

Council Member Patrick Souter explained he understands the burden of inflation on citizens and noted the City feels that burden as well. Mr. Souter echoed comments that City Council is reviewing ways to reduce the tax burden to citizens but noted growth and inflation have to be addressed.

Mayor David Hill explained the City Council will vote on the tax rate at the September 6th meeting considering the best interest of the City. He reported the tax rate has reduced over his 9-year tenure on City Council and the City must adjust to appraisals. Mayor Hill echoed sentiments that City Council is reviewing options to provide relief to citizens and thanked those in attendance.

8. Adjourn

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 6:21 p.m.

Re: Appointment of Waxahachie Police Chief

As you are aware, Police Chief Wade Goolsby has submitted his intention to retire after a 42-year long career. We certainly appreciate the noticeable positive contribution Chief Goolsby has made on the department and this community during his tenure here. We wish him well in his well-served retirement.

This presents the need to appoint a new Chief of Police to lead the department into the next chapter. Section 143.013(a)(1) the Texas Local Government Code is applicable to Texas cities that have adopted in the Civil Service processes. This statute stipulates that the Police Chief position is appointed by the municipality's chief executive and is confirmed by the governing body. Therefore, the selection is made by the City manager with confirmation by the City Council.

As such, since receiving notice of Chief Goolsby's intention to retire, I began considering several factors related to the Waxahachie Police Department including, but not limited to: the current state of the department, the desired direction for the department, the needs of the community related to policing, morale of the department, accessibility and community involvement of the department and its administration, and overall safety of the community. In considering these factors, I determined the best course of action would be to promote the most qualified individual from within the department to continue and build on the positive direction the department is currently on.

One very positive success of this department has been the ability to build a strong team of professionals that are able to seamlessly promote into growth opportunities when they become available. We have experienced this in a number of promotion opportunities over the past couple of years and with this opportunity, it is no different.



PLANNING ANALYSIS

The Applicant is requesting to replat three existing lots (approximately .12 acres) into one lot to build a single-family home. In addition, the Applicant is requesting two variances regarding right-of-way dedication and minimum lot size. The site plan for the single-family home proposed on the subject property is in the staff report for informational purposes.

The Applicant is requesting a variance not to dedicate right-of-way. The ultimate right-of-way width for Coats street is fifty-four (54) feet. Therefore, based on the ultimate right-of-way width for Coats Street, the Applicant would be responsible for dedicating twenty-seven (27) feet measured from the centerline of the existing pavement. Given existing conditions, the Applicant is requesting not to dedicate an additional thirteen (13) feet. Staff is recommending approval of the variance since it would be challenging to get the necessary right-of-way dedication from adjoining properties and to expand the road in the future due to the location of the existing homes in proximity to the road.

The Applicant is requesting a variance to not comply with the minimum lot size required in the Infill Ordinance (Section 3.25 of the City of Waxahachie Zoning Ordinance). Per the infill ordinance, the minimum lot size cannot be less than ten (10%) percent of the average lot size of properties located within 50 feet. The average lot size is 10,553 square feet, and the subject property is 5,451 square feet (54' X 100' lot size). Staff recommends approval of the variance due to the site's physical constraints. Additionally, the Applicant has met all other provisions of the infill overlay.





PLANNING ANALYSIS

The applicant is proposing to construct a +700 sq. ft. (1,361 sq. ft.) accessory structure to the side and rear of a single-family residential lot at 195 Brookbend Dr. The Ellis County Appraisal District states that the primary structure on the property is 3,693 square feet. Per the City of Waxahachie Zoning Ordinance, an accessory structure that is equal to or greater than 700 square feet requires a Specific Use Permit (SUP) to be approved by City Council.

Proposed Use:

The proposed accessory structure is comprised of 1,361 square feet of fully enclosed space. The applicant is proposing to construct the structure out of masonry that will match the primary structure. The structure is intended to be used for as a garage and personal shop.

The accessory structure is 23.5' in height, and the interior floor plan does indicate a small storage area that is accessible by stairs. ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A SPECIFIC USE PERMIT (SUP) TO PERMIT AN ACCESSORY STRUCTURE EQUAL TO OR GREATER THAN 700 SQUARE FEET USE WITHIN A SINGLE FAMILY-1 (SF-1) ZONING DISTRICT, LOCATED AT 195 BROOKBEND DRIVE, BEING PROPERTY ID 208145, IN THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, ELLIS COUNTY, TEXAS, LOT 89, IN THE BROOKBEND GROVE PHASE 2 ADDITION, AND ORDERING THE CHANGING OF THE ZONING MAP THEREOF IN ACCORDANCE WITH SAID CHANGE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, TEXAS:

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Waxahachie having heretofore adopted a zoning ordinance and map showing the classification of the various property located within the city limits of said City; and

WHEREAS, the described property is classified in said ordinance and any amendments thereto as SF-1; and

SPECIFIC USE PERMIT

Purpose and Intent

The purpose of this Ordinance is to provide the appropriate restrictions and development controls that ensure this Specific Use Permit is compatible with the surrounding development and zoning and to also ensure that the development complies with the City's Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Ordinance.

Specific Use Permit

FOR OPERATION OF A SPECIFIC USE PERMIT FOR AN ACCESSORY STRUCTURE EQUAL TO OR GREATER THAN 700 SQUARE FEET USE WITHIN A SINGLE FAMILY – 1 (SF-1) ZONING DISTRICT; the following standards and conditions are hereby established as part of this ordinance:

- 1. The site plan shall conform as approved by the City Council under case number ZDC-79-2022.
- The development shall adhere to the City Council approved Exhibit A Location Exhibit, Exhibit B - Site Layout Exhibit, Exhibit C – Site Plan Exhibit, Exhibit D – Architectural Plans, and Exhibit E – Staff Report.
- 3. The accessory structure shall not be used as a dwelling.
- 4. The accessory structure shall not be used for commercial purposes.
- 5. The accessory structure shall not be leased or sold separately from the primary residence and shall not be separately metered.
- 6. The applicant shall obtain a permit from the City of Waxahachie Building Department prior to the construction of the accessory structure.
- 7. The development shall maintain compliance with all Federal, State and Local regulations; including, but not necessarily limited to, all applicable standards and regulations of the City of Waxahachie Municipal Code and City of Waxahachie Zoning Ordinance.
- 8. If approved, City Council reserves the right to review the Specific Use Permit at any point in the future, if needed.

Compliance

- 1. It shall be unlawful for the owner, manager, or any person in charge of a business or other establishment to violate the conditions imposed by the City Council when a Specific Use Permit is granted, and the violation of those conditions could result in a citation being issued by the appropriate enforcement officers of the City of Waxahachie.
- 2. Furthermore, by this Ordinance, if the premises covered by this Specific Use Permit is vacated and/or ceases to operate for a period exceeding six months (6 months), a new Specific Use Permit shall be required to reestablish the use.

An emergency is declared to exist in that needed and approved improvements will be unnecessarily delayed if this ordinance is not effective upon passage and this ordinance is to be effective upon passage.



ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, TEXAS, ABANDONING AND VACATING CERTAIN RIGHT-OF-WAY ALONG FLAT STREET; MAKING FINDINGS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Waxahachie, Texas ("<u>City</u>"), is a duly organized political subdivision and home-rule municipality of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, the City, by virtue of a prior dedication, owns a certain unused portion of a street/alley known as Flat Street, which street/alley is located within the corporate limits of the City; and

WHEREAS, Section 311.001(a) of the Texas Transportation Code generally provides that a home-rule municipality has exclusive control over and under the public highways, streets, and alleys of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, Section 311.007 of the Texas Transportation Code provides the authority for a home-rule municipality to vacate, abandon or close a street or alley within the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the City has received a petition from the abutting landowners requesting that the City abandon and close an unused portion of Flat Street; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Waxahachie, Texas ("<u>City Council</u>"), finds and determines that the unused portion of Flat Street, which consists of approximately .51 acres as shown on *Exhibit A* attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes (hereinafter referred to as the "<u>Unused Road ROW</u>"), should be abandoned, vacated, and closed; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the Unused Road ROW should be abandoned and vacated as a roadway/alley, and that any and all rights that the City may have in the Unused Road ROW should be released, which abandonment and vacation the City Council has determined is in furtherance of the public health, safety and welfare of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council also finds, pursuant to Texas Local Government Code Section 272.001(b)(2), that it is appropriate for the City to deed to the adjacent property owners along the Unused Road ROW their respective portions of the Unused Road ROW, with approximately .253 acres to be deeded to the owner of the abutting property to the west of the Unused Road ROW and approximately .257 acres to be deeded to the owner of the abutting property to the abutting property to the east of the Unused Road ROW, and to authorize the City Manager to execute such real estate conveyance documents and other related documents to accomplish such property transfer.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY

OF WAXAHACHIE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1

All of the above premises are hereby found to be true and correct legislative findings of the City Council and they are hereby approved and incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

SECTION 2

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, any and all rights and interests that the City may have in the Unused Road ROW, as described in the attached *Exhibit A*, are hereby abandoned and vacated by the City for street, roadway, alley, and public travel purposes, and the City hereby disclaims any interest in the Unused Road ROW.

SECTION 3

The City Manager, or his designee, is hereby authorized to execute all documents necessary to transfer all title and property interests that the City has in the Unused Road ROW to the abutting property owners as described in this Ordinance, and the City hereby authorizes such transfers.

SECTION 4

All ordinances, orders or resolutions heretofore passed and adopted by the City Council are hereby repealed to the extent that said ordinances, resolutions, or parts thereof, are in conflict herewith.

SECTION 5

If any section, subsection, clause, phrase or provision of this Ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, shall to any extent be held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unconstitutional, the remaining sections, subsections, clauses, phrases and provisions of this Ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, shall remain in full force and effect and shall in no way be affected, impaired or invalidated, and the City Council hereby declares that it would have passed such remaining portions of this Ordinance despite such invalidity, which remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, as provided by the laws of the State of Texas, and the City Charter of the City of Waxahachie.



Re: Consider Proposed Ordinance Approving Revised Budget Figures For Fiscal Year 2021-2022 And Approving The Budget For Fiscal Year 2022-2023

This agenda item is for the City Council to consider the approval of revised budget figures for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 and the proposed budget for Fiscal year 2022-2023. The proposed budget represents the City's funding plan for the next fiscal year, beginning October 1.

The process of developing the annual budget is a comprehensive effort that involves input from the Mayor and City Council, and all City departments. The process also provides residents an opportunity to speak on the budget during a public hearing held before budget adoption.

On April 25, staff held a work session with the City Council on the preliminary Capital Improvement and Debt Management Plan. On June 30, a budget work session was held to provide City Council an overview of the preliminary budget, including all major funds, proposed five-year operating and capital plans, major revenue sources, as well as an opportunity to discuss the proposed tax rate. On August 4, staff provided a budget update, including changes to the draft budget presented at the work session. The City held a public hearing on the proposed budget on August 30.

Staff recommends approval of this item.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, TEXAS, APPROVING REVISED BUDGET FIGURES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022, FUNDS APPROPRATED FOR STREET MAINTENANCE AND PROFESSIONAL SERVICES WILL BE USED FOR THAT PURPOSE, EITHER BY ENCUMBRANCE OR BY TRANSFER TO CAPITAL PROJECT FUND FOR STREETS; APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2022 AND TERMINATING SEPTEMBER 30, 2023, AND MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR EACH DEPARTMENT; REPEALING CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING A SAVINGS AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Manager of the City of Waxahachie, Texas (hereinafter referred to as the "City") has caused to be filed with the City Secretary a budget to cover all proposed expenditures of the government of the City for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2022, and ending September 30, 2023, (hereinafter referred to as the "Budget"); and

WHEREAS, public notice of the public hearing on the proposed annual budget, stating the date, time, place and subject matter of said public hearing, was given as required by the Charter of the City of Waxahachie and the laws of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, such public hearing was held on August 30, 2022, prior approval of such date being hereby ratified and confirmed by the City Council, and all those wishing to speak on the Budget were heard; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has studied the Budget and listened to the comments of the taxpayers at the public hearing therefore and has determined that the Budget attached hereto is in the best interest of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1.</u> That all of the above premises are found to be true and correct and are incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if copied in their entirety.

Section 2. That the revised budget figures, prepared and submitted by the City Manager for the 2021-2022 budget, be, and the same are hereby, in all things, approved and appropriated, and any necessary transfers between accounts and departments are hereby authorized, approved, and appropriated.

<u>Section 3.</u> That the Budget attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes is adopted for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2022, and ending September 30, 2023; and there is hereby appropriated from the funds indicated such projects, operations, activities, purchases and other expenditures as proposed in the Budget.

Section 4. That the City Manager shall file or cause to be filed a true and correct copy of the approved Budget, along with this ordinance, with the City Secretary and in the office of the County Clerk of Ellis County, Texas, as required by State Law.

<u>Section 5.</u> That the distribution and division of the above-named appropriations are made at the departmental level in all budgeted funds for the payment of operating expenses and capital outlay as set out in the municipal budget.

Section 6. That at any time during the fiscal year, the City Manager may transfer part or all of any unencumbered appropriation balance among or between general classifications within a department. The City Manager may not authorize transfer of part of all of any unencumbered appropriation balance among or between departments or funds of the City. The City Manager may recommend such transfer to the City Council. The City Council may, at the recommendation of the City Manager or on its own volition, transfer part or all of any unencumbered appropriation balance from one department or fund to another department or fund by resolution.

<u>Section 7.</u> That any and all ordinances, resolutions, rules, regulations, policies or provisions in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed and rescinded to the extent of conflict herewith.

Section 8. That if any section, article, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word in the Ordinance, or application thereto my person or circumstances is held invalid or unconstitutional by a Court of competent jurisdiction such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance; and the City Council hereby declares it would have passed such remaining portions of this Ordinance despite such invalidity, which remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 9. That the necessity of adopting and approving a proposed budget for the next fiscal year as required by the laws of the State of Texas requires that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage, and it is accordingly so ordained.

Re: Consider ordinance setting Water and Wastewater rates and fees and setting an effective date of October 1, 2022

This item is for the City Council to approve the water and wastewater rates and fees included as part of the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

The water and wastewater funds provide for the administration, operation and maintenance of all City water services including distribution, wastewater collection, water and wastewater treatment activities, meter management, and billing services. Revenue to support these operations is generated primarily through water and sewer usage rates, as outlined in City ordinance.

As part of the budget process, city staff recommends that City Council vote to affirm these rates annually and amend the rates and fees when necessary. The Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Budget includes a rate increase of four percent to water and wastewater rates and fees. The proposed ordinance includes a Sokoll rate fee of 1.61 per 1,000 gallons. Updated annually, this rate is charged to the City and Rocket SUD to recover each entity's proportional cost to operate and maintain the Sokoll Water plant.

Staff recommends approval of this item.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE SETTING WATER AND WASTEWATER FEES, BY AMENDING VARIOUS SECTIONS OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, AND SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF OCTOBER 1, 2022 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE TEXAS:

That Section 33 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Waxahachie, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 33-33. Deposits required.

Residential: A deposit of ninety-six dollars (\$96.00) is required for regular residential service. A deposit of seventy-two dollars (\$72.00) is required for accounts with wastewater and trash collection service. A deposit of forty-five dollars (\$45.00) is required for trash collection service only. The billing department may adjust the amount of deposit based on payment history.

Residential New Construction: A deposit of one hundred sixty-five dollars (\$165.00) is required for each new construction residential account.

Apartments, Commercial, and Industrial: The billing department may require higher amounts; however, deposits are generally based on meter size as follows:

up to 1" water meter	\$248.00
1 ¹ / ₂ " water meter	\$371.00
2" water meter	\$618.00
3" water meter	\$1,234.00
4" water meter	\$2,468.00

*Customer will be responsible for the cost of any damages incurred while meter is in their possession.

No interest shall be paid on deposits. No deposit is required for other government entities. The billing department may waive the deposit for separate irrigation meters.

That Section 33-36 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Waxahachie is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 33-36. Water and Wastewater Rates.

(A) Water inside city: From and after the effective date of this ordinance, uniform monthly water rates which shall prevail to all City of Waxahachie water customers are:

That Section 33-40 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Waxahachie is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 33-40. Late charges; service restored upon payment of bill; fee for returned checks; fee for replacement of cut-off valve; fire hydrant meter set fee; broken curb stop fee; cut lock fee; reread meter service charge; tampering penalty.

(a) Late Fee. Payment for utility service shall be due fourteen (14) days after the billing date. Any account with a balance due fourteen (14) days after the due date shall be assessed a penalty of \$10.00. If such date falls on the weekend or legal holiday, then payment is due the next business day.

(b) Disconnection for Nonpayment: Any account with a balance due greater than \$135.00, twentyone (21) days after the billing date, shall be subject to disconnection. The past due amount plus a reconnect fee of \$43.00 (\$77.00 after regular office hours) must be paid prior to reconnection of services.

(c) Return Connection Fee: <u>Customers are encouraged but not required to be present (or have a representative present) anytime service is reestablished</u> (This is recommended in order to prevent flooding and water damage that could result from interior faucets being left in the "on" position, hanging toilets floats, leaks and other conditions that could arise subsequent to the disconnection.) In the event the customer or a designated representative (a) cannot be located on-site when the service is reconnected and (b) the meter registers usage after the service has been reestablished and thus presents the risk of water damage, the service will be turned back off and the customer will be notified of the problem and asked to reschedule the reconnection. Subsequent trips to reestablish service will be subject to a Return Reconnection Fee of \$43.00 each if performed during

working hours or \$77.00 if performed after working hours. This fee is applicable when service has been disconnected for nonpayment; when service to a new account is established or when service has been disconnected at the request of the customer.

(d) Return Check Fee. In the event the bank does not honor a customer's check for any service or good provided by the City, a \$36.00 fee will be charged.

(e) Replacement of Cut-off Valve. In the event a customer has damaged a cut-off valve or curb stop to the point the valve must be replaced, then, the customer shall be billed a \$77.00 replacement fee, plus the actual cost of materials to replace the damaged item. In the event a customer has broken a cut-off valve for the purpose of removing a lock, an additional tampering penalty of \$158.00 (see "(j)" below) must be paid before service is restored.

- (g) Meter Box Replacement Fee: \$66.00 plus actual materials cost
- (h) Cut lock fee: \$158.00
- (i) Reread meter service charge: \$19.00

The proposed rate of \$0.630000 is above the no-new-revenue rate of \$0.540834 and lower than the voter-approval rate of \$0.630350.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING FOR THE USE AND SUPPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT OF THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, TEXAS, AND PROVIDING FOR THE INTEREST AND SINKING FUND FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023 AND APPORTIONING EACH LEVY FOR THE SPECIFIC PURPOSE.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Waxahachie, Texas, that section 30-2 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Waxahachie, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 30-2. Tax Levy. There is hereby levied and there shall be assessed and collected for the Maintenance and Operation of the municipal government of the City of Waxahachie, Texas, and to meet Interest and Sinking requirements for fiscal year 2023, upon all property, real, personal and mixed within the corporate limits of the City subject to taxation, a total tax of \$0.63000 on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation based on 100% of market value of said property, said tax being so levied and apportioned to the specific purpose herein set forth.

- a. For the maintenance and operation of the general government including current expenses and for general improvements of the City and its property, known as the General Fund, \$0.38550 on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation of all taxable property, and
- b. For the maintenance and operation of a public library within the City, known as Sims Library, \$0.02100 on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation of all taxable property, and
- c. For the purpose of paying interest and principal for the redemption of bonds, warrants, and other long-term obligations heretofore legally issued by the City, known as the Interest and Sinking Fund, \$0.22350 on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation of all taxable property.

THIS TAX RATE WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE.

THE TAX RATE WILL EFFECTIVELY BE RAISED BY 3.42 PERCENT AND WILL RAISE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS ON A \$100,000 HOME BY APPROXIMATELY \$13.44.

All Taxes as set out above shall be payable as set out by existing city ordinances and statutes of the State of Texas.

In order to provide for the efficient, usual daily operation of the City by immediately levying the tax rates for the current fiscal year, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage.

Item Summary: The Ordinance revision is to revise the description of "Commercial Vehicle" which is associated with the word "Truck". This will update the "Commercial Vehicle" definition by revising the hauling weight from 1,500 lbs to 6,000 lbs.

It is also proposed to specify the streets the city wants to enforce prohibited truck traffic. Currently there are No Truck Traffic signs placed along Patrick Road and Spring Creek Drive. However, these signs are not enforceable without having the street names specified in the ordinance. ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 32, "TRAFFIC," OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES BY AMENDING SECTION 32-1, "DEFINITIONS," AND ADDING SECTION 32-248, "PROHIBITED TRUCK TRAFFIC"; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Waxahachie, Texas ("<u>City</u>"), is a Home-Rule Municipality located in Ellis County created in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Local Government Code and operating pursuant to the legislation of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, the City of Waxahachie City Council ("<u>City Council</u>") has determined that it is in the best interests of the City and its residents to update and amend the definition of "Commercial Vehicle," which is associated with the definition of "Truck," by updating and amending the hauling weight associated with a commercial vehicle; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has further determined that it is in the best interests of the City and its residents to designate certain streets in the City as streets where truck traffic shall be restricted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF WAXAHACHIE, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 32, "Traffic," of the City's Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

A. By amending the definition of "Commercial vehicle," in Section 32-1, to read as follows:

Commercial vehicle: Every vehicle designed, maintained or used primarily for the transportation of property with a weight in excess of six thousand (6,000) pounds.

B. By adding Section 32-248, "Prohibited Truck Traffic," which shall read as follows:

Thru truck traffic is prohibited on the following streets:

Street Name:	Extent:
Patrick Road	From Thornhill Drive to Marshall Road
Spring Creek Drive	From FM 813 (Brown Street) to FM 813

Exception: This section does not apply to vehicles owned and controlled by the city.



SECTION 2. That all provisions of the Ordinances of the City of Waxahachie, Texas, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same are hereby, repealed, and all other provisions of the Ordinances of the City not in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. That should any word, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this ordinance, or of the Code of Ordinances, as amended hereby, be adjudged or held to be void or unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of said ordinance or the Code of Ordinances, as amended hereby, which shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and the publication of the caption, as the law and charter in such cases provide.

Re: Consider the Approval of an Engineering Professional Service Agreement with Freese and Nichols, Inc. for the Cole Creek/Little Mustang Creek Sewer Basin analysis and the Water and Wastewater Master Plan

Item Description: Consider approval of the professional services agreement with Freese and Nichols, Inc. for engineering services associated with Cole Creek/Little Mustang Creek Sewer Basin capacity analysis and the water distribution and wastewater collection system master plan in the amount of \$650,000.

Item Summary: This project will develop wastewater flow projections for the Cole Creek and Little Mustang Creek Sewer Basin from the City's current wastewater model. The wastewater system will be evaluated under peak wet weather conditions to determine system response for potential surcharging and over flow events. Off-site improvement recommendations will be provided to serve proposed developments within the two wastewater basins.

The water distribution and wastewater collection system master plans portion of the project will include importing GIS from the City of Waxahachie's current system into the respective models. Four scenarios will be developed including; existing conditions, 5-year, 10-year and buildout planning periods. Water and wastewater plants will be evaluated for expansion needs and future plant locations for each phase of the model. CIP projects, costs and schedules will be based on model output and estimated future construction costs.

Fiscal Impact: The total amount of the professional engineering services agreement is \$650,000. This project is proposed to be funded by water impact fees in the amount of \$300,000 and wastewater impact fees in the amount of \$350,000. Staff recommends approval of this engineering services agreement in the total amount of \$650,000.

Re: Food Grade Salt Bid Award

Item Description: On Tuesday, September 6, 2022 an item will appear before the City Council for consideration of a bid award for food grade salt with Morton Salt Inc.

Item Summary: Food grade salt is used at the Robert W. Sokoll Water Treatment Plant for onsite generation of Sodium Hypochlorite which is the primary water treatment disinfectant chemical. Sealed bids were received and opened on August 11, 2022 and staff recommends awarding the lowest qualified responsive bidder. The City received four bids for this service, with Morton Salt Inc, being the lowest responsive bidder. Morton Salt Inc. is the City's current vendor for food grade salt and has performed satisfactorily, but current utilization due to increased water demands, has reached a threshold for the need to formally advertise this service.

Fiscal Impact: The contract period for the bid award would be through September 30, 2023. There is an option in the contract terms for one (1) additional one-year period at the city's sole discretion. The City anticipates it will purchase approximately 722,400 pounds of food grade salt from Morton. The proposed FY 2022-2023 operating budget has funds budgeted to cover the costs of this bid award. Staff recommends awarding the bid to Morton Salt Inc.
