# COMMENTS

Since our last meeting, The Park Foundation met and formally committed donating funds to the City in the amount of 125K for the Unity Park Entry and Kids Kastle Entry Area. Attached is the letter from the Parks Foundation confirming their commitment.

#### Moving forward,

La terra studio will start designing the Unity Park Entry and Kids Kastle Entry Area immediately.

<u>Staff</u> has identified that combining the following construction projects/tasks will potentially provide cost-saving opportunities.

- Unity Park pond and drainage work
- Entry feature improvements
- Kids Kastle demo

By combining the construction projects/tasks noted above, Kids Kastle will potentially close sooner than expected.

The construction date for Kids Kastle will <u>be determined</u> by the progress of the pond and drainage project and coordinating efforts with the contractor.

Mr. Leavitt:

The purpose of this letter is to confirm the commitment of the Highland Village Parks Foundation ("**HVPF**") to provide support for the Kids Kastle Entry / Plaza project your staff recently proposed.

A quorum of the Board of Directors of the HVPF met at a properly-called meeting on February 2, 2019. During the meeting, Mr. Robichaux made the following motion:

The Highland Village Park Foundation shall commit to the City of Highland Village \$125,000 for the sole purpose of contributing to the planning and construction of the "Kids Kastle Entry / Plaza" project to be constructed simultaneous with the overall reconstruction of Kids Kastle, contingent upon the following conditions:

- HVPF board to confirm the final plans to be significantly consistent with the concept plan presented by the City of Highland Village staff to the HVPF Board on November 11, 2018, with estimated cost at least \$180,000; and,
- The City of HV must arrange funding for the remainder of the project.

The motion was seconded by Charlie Turner. The motion passed by unanimous vote of 3-0. The above is reflected in the official minutes of the HVPF. In my capacity as Secretary of the Highland Village Parks Foundation, I confirm the above is true and correct.
