If a workshop is scheduled, the subject and time of the workshop will appear on the agenda. The Mayor and Council members also sit as the Chairperson and Members of the Board of the Community Development Commission (CDC).

PUBLIC COMMENTS: The Successor Agency will receive public comments via e-mail at clerk@nationalcityca.gov regarding any matters within the jurisdiction of the Successor Agency. Written comments or testimony from the public (limited to three minutes) must be submitted via email by 4:00 p.m. on the day off the Successor Agency Meeting. All comments received from the public will be made a part of the record of the meeting. The time limit established for public testimony is three minutes per speaker. The Mayor or Chairperson may limit the length of comments due to the number of persons wishing to speak or if comments become

repetitious or unrelated.

WRITTEN AGENDA: With limited exceptions, the Elected Body may take action only upon items appearing on the written agenda. Items not appearing on the agenda must be brought back on a subsequent agenda unless they are of a demonstrated emergency or urgent nature, and the need to take action on such items arose after the agenda was posted.

CONSENT AGENDA: Consent calendar items involve matters which are of a routine or noncontroversial nature. All consent items are adopted by approval of a single motion by the City Council. Prior to such approval, any item may be removed from the consent portion of the agenda and separately considered, upon request of a Councilmember, a staff member, or a member of the public.

Explanation:

On June 20, 2017, per Successor Agency Resolution No. 2017-90, the City of National City entered into an Agreement with Ensafe, Inc., to provide environmental engineering, site investigations and remediation support services to assist staff with obtaining final regulatory approvals and implementation of the Property Mitigation Plan for environmental remediation of the Westside Infill Transit Oriented Development (WITOD) / Paradise Creek Park redevelopment area in National City, pursuant to the Disposition and Development Agreement by and between the Community Development Commission of the City of National City and Paradise Creek Housing Partners, LP. The original Agreement is for a not-to-exceed amount of \$200,000 and a term of two years, with the option to extend for an additional period of up to one year.

On May 7, 2019, per Successor Agency Resolution No. 2019-102, the First Amendment to the Agreement was approved increasing the not-to-exceed amount by \$300,000, for a total Agreement amount of \$500,000, and extending the term of the Agreement by one year to June, 19, 2020.

Due to the immediate need for project support services to continue based on delays caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, staff is requesting City Council approval of a Second Amendment to the Agreement with Ensafe, Inc., extending the term of the Agreement by six months to December 19, 2020, with no changes to the total contract amount.

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SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION AS THE NATIONAL CITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY AND ENSAFE, INC.

THIS SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT is entered into this 16th day of June, 2020, by and between the SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION AS THE NATIONAL CITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY, a public body, corporate and politic (the "SUCCESSOR AGENCY"), and ENSAFE, INC., a corporation (the "CONSULTANT").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, The SUCCESSOR AGENCY and the CONSULTANT entered into an Agreement on June 20, 2017, ("the Agreement") per Successor Agency Resolution No. 2017-90, to provide environmental engineering, site investigations and remediation support services to assist staff with obtaining final regulatory approvals and implementation of the Property Mitigation Plan for environmental remediation of the Westside Infill Transit Oriented Development (WITOD) / Paradise Creek Park redevelopment area in National City, pursuant to the Disposition and Development Agreement by and between the Community Development Commission of the City of National City and Paradise Creek Housing Partners, LP for a not to exceed amount of \$200,000 and a term of two years, with the option to extend for an additional period of one year; and,

WHEREAS, on May 7, 2019, per Successor Agency Resolution No. 2019-102, the First Amendment to the Agreement was approved increasing the not-to-exceed amount by \$300,000, for a total Agreement amount of \$500,000, and extending the term of the Agreement by one year to June 19, 2020

WHEREAS, the parties desire to extend the term of the Agreement for six months, to December 19, 2020, due to the immediate need for services to continue based on delays caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree that:

- 1. The term of the Agreement is hereby extended to December 19, 2020.
- 2. The First Amendment to this Agreement, approved by Successor Agency on May 7, 2019, increased the contract amount of this Agreement to \$500,000 and the same is, and shall continue, the total not-to-exceed amount of this Agreement.

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3. The parties further agree that, other than the foregoing exceptions, each and every term and provision of the June 20, 2017 Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

ITEM

Staff Report: Successor Agency's Investment Report for the quarter ended March 31, 2020.

BACKGROUND

The California Government Code (§ 53646(b)) requires that, when the treasurer or the chief fiscal officer of a local agency renders to the legislative body of the agency a quarterly report on the agency's investment portfolio, such report shall include the following information regarding all securities, investments, and moneys held by the local agency:

- > type of investment;
- > issuer (bank or institution);
- > date of maturity;
- > dollar amount invested; and
- > current market valuation as of the date of the report.

In addition, the Government Code (§ 53646(b)(2)) requires that the report states the City's compliance with its investment policy and includes a statement regarding the ability of the local agency to meet its pool's ability to meet its expenditure requirements Code (§ 53646(b)(3)).

OVERVIEW OF SUCCESSOR AGENCY INVESTMENTS

The Successor Agency invests most of its funds with the California Treasurer's Local Agency Investment Fund ("LAIF"). This is a liquid investment pool, which allows participants to earn market rate returns of large investments, while retaining access to funds within 24 hours of a withdrawal request. For the quarter ended March 31, 2020, the LAIF's interest rate was 2.03%. The 2020 first quarter Statements of the Successor Agency's investment portfolio are attached.

COMPLIANCE STATEMENT

All of the Successor Agency's investments are in compliance with the City's investment policy (City Council Policy No. 203) and the California Government Code (§ 53601 et seq).

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Total LAIF gains/(losses), realized and unrealized, for the period were \$45,457.

EXPLANATION:

Expenditures for the Successor Agency (SA) are governed by the Recognized Obligation Payment Schedules (ROPS) that are proposed by the Successor Agency, approved by the Oversight Board, and submitted to the State Department of Finance (DOF) for authorization. The budget before the Successor Agency today totals \$4,720,540 and reflects amounts authorized for ROPS 20-21, covering the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. ROPS 20-21 was approved by the State Department of Finance with one disallowance and a lesser amount of Redevelopment Property Tax Trust Fund (RPTTF) resources than requested. Item 47 in the amount of \$20,000 for legal services was disallowed and instead of receiving the requested \$3.4 million in RPTTF, \$1.1 million was authorized. The SA was directed to utilize unexpended funds of \$2.3 million from prior ROPS periods to make up the difference. Adopting an annual budget is not required under the redevelopment agency dissolution legislation, but is recommended by staff in order to effectively track expenditures and revenues in the City's general ledger. The proposed budget includes amounts for scheduled debt service payments, environmental remediation obligations pertaining to the Westside Infill Transit-Oriented Development (WI-TOD) property (Paradise Creek Park site portion), legal services, professional services, City administrative services, and other miscellaneous expenses. See Exhibit A to the resolution for budget details.
