1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 It's 100 Acre Wood time again. On behalf of the 30-member organizing committee, we want to thank you for choosing this event. We hope to make it a great one for everyone. We can't do this without the support of 200+ volunteers, so be sure to thank them whenever you see them. This event takes place in Dent and Washington counties in Missouri and it would mean a lot to us and them if you could support them whenever you can. Whether you need hotel rooms, food, drinks, gas, car parts, or souvenirs, try to get them in Salem, Potosi, Cherryville, Sligo, Jadwin, or even Viburnum and Bixby.

We have many property owners along the stages, most of whom appreciate the show that the competitors put on as they race by, but do remember to be sensible and safe during recce when the roads are open to everyone and while traveling around the area. Most rally attendees are visitors to the area so do your best to courteous and respectful to our hosts.

2 DESCRIPTION & ORGANIZATION

- 2.1 This event will be held under the current American Rally Association (ARA) Rules. The Rally in the 100 Acre Wood (100AW) will consist of two days of competition and is part of the ARA National Championship Series. The concurrent two-day Super Regional event is part of the Central Regional Championship. The regional event will also count toward the Eastern Ozark Rally Cup which is a three event series of Missouri rallies.
 - 2.1.1 This event will offer an open recce.
 - 2.1.2 Jemba notes will be available for an additional fee.
 - 2.1.3 Any additional changes or additions to these Supplementary Regulations will be announced only by numbered and dated bulletins. The Organizers and/or the Stewards shall decide upon any conditions not foreseen in these regulations.
 - 2.1.4 The route will be approximately 330 miles in length with approximately 101 miles of competitive stages. All competitive stages will be held on roads that consist primarily of gravel, and will vary somewhat in width and tightness. Roads vary from sweeping, well-groomed roads to tight and twisty.
- 2.2 As has been seen over the past several years, Missouri weather patterns can best be described as capricious. The committee is prepared to conduct this event under any circumstances and will give the contestant competition regardless of weather conditions.
- 2.3 There will not be a physical notice board. The Official Notice Board can be accessed via the Sportity App using 100AW2022 as the password. All official documents, bulletins, start orders, provisional results, inquiries and responses will use the Sportity App.

4 ENTRIES

4.1 Entry Procedure:

Entry and payment must be made online at http://rallylicense.com/. ARA will send an email blast to ARA license holders announcing the opening of entry. For assistance with online event registration, contact ara@ara-rally.com. No entry payments can be accepted at the event.

Entries will be accepted for this rally beginning on January 27, 2022. Entries with late fees will be accepted until February 28, 2022.

The maximum number of entries accepted will be 95 cars, due to the number of tracker units ARA has. Initially, 90 entries will be accepted with the last 5 spots held until February 21 for the top 5 national teams from the 2021 ARA Championship. If more than 95 cars enter, a wait list will be used and teams will be notified if their entry is accepted by March 1, 2022. No late fees will be charged to wait listed teams if entered by February 21. Wait listed entries not accepted will receive a full refund.

Competitors wishing to purchase extra service spaces may do so for \$200 each.

Competitors may purchase Jemba notes for a \$150 fee. Printed copies will be at check-in.

4.2 Withdrawal Policy:

- 4.2.1 Entries that are withdrawn before 11:59 PM CST on March 2, 2022 will have the entry fee refunded.
- 4.2.2 Non-wait listed entries that are withdrawn after March 2 and before the start of competition will be refunded minus a \$100 processing fee.
- 4.2.3 No refunds will be made after the start of competition.
- 4.2.4 Competitors who are withdrawing from the competition are required to complete and submit and ARA Rally Withdrawal Slip to Scoring, Clerk of the course, a Time Control or Sweep Team.

5 INSURANCE

- 5.1 Third party liability insurance covering bodily injury and property damage, effective during the competition, will be provided by a policy secured by ARA and displayed on the Official Notice Board.
- 5.2 Competitors must provide documentation showing bodily injury and property damage liability in amounts equal to or exceeding limits as stated in the current ARA rules for both the rally car and any service vehicles.
- 5.3 Competitors, service crew members, and all event participants including officials, marshals, staff, stewards and all other volunteers who have obtained an ARA license, signed an ARA waiver and have been issued and are in possession of an event wristband confirming the signature of the waiver will be covered by a secondary ARA participant accident insurance policy which covers excess medical expenses to their primary medical insurance provider.

6 ADVERTISING AND IDENTIFICATION

6.1 Vehicles must comply with ARA RTR Rule 3.2

Rally in the 100 Acre Wood will use the event sponsor advertising space allowed by the current ARA rules. Teams may refuse the rally sponsor's advertising by contacting the chairman and paying a \$500 fee. All ARA series advertising must be properly displayed on competition cars.

7 FUEL

- 7.1 Fuel with an octane rating of 93 (R+M) is available in Salem and Potosi and some other surrounding towns, but is not available in Viburnum or at the Berryman Store.
- 7.2 Any competitor who does not wish to refuel in the fuel depot in service may choose to purchase fuel at commercial gas stations noted in the route book on the transit sections.
- 7.3 VP Fuel will be available for pre-purchase and delivered to the event and must be ordered at least 2 weeks beforehand. Details are found at https://bit.ly/3FJVgWZ. Pick up time and place will be addressed in a bulletin when the details are known. Please pick up ordered fuel by 7pm, Thursday March 17. The event is not responsible for any fuel not picked up and will be donated to the Fire Dept.

8 RECONNAISSANCE

A reconnaissance session will be held on Thursday, March 17 starting at 7:00 AM in accordance with Section 1.2.1 of the RCR. This reconnaissance session will be open to all competitors. The session is open and you are permitted to drive the stages more than once. All recce must be completed by 7pm, Thursday March 18. Any crew found on the stages after 7pm will be fined \$100 for regional teams and \$500 for national teams.

- 8.2 Both driver and co-driver need to check-in together in their recce vehicle at recce check-in.
- 8.3 An itinerary for this reconnaissance will be provided at recce registration, along with any additional bulletins governing the session. You don't have to follow the prescribed route but it will expedite your way to each stage. All competitors taking part in the reconnaissance session must attend check-in.
- 8.4 The vehicles used shall have no lettering or advertising which would call undue attention to it and must have quiet exhausts, i.e. nothing that could be mistaken for a rally car by locals.
- The speed limit on stages during recce will be monitored with the 2022 ARA Recce tracking system. Speeding penalties will be assessed per ARA RCR 1.2.1.g.
 - 8.5.1 As a point of general information, the un-posted speed limit in the state of Missouri is 55 miles per hour for paved roads.
 - 8.5.2 35 mph is the speed limit for all unpaved roads during recce.
 - 8.5.3 All speed limits are noted in the route book and take precedence.
- 8.6 All recce roads will be open to the public. Inconsiderate or irresponsible driving may result in exclusion from the event.

9 ON-SITE CHECK-IN

- 9.1 Competitor Check-In will be per schedule in section 3.All entry information, including Crew Members, must be complete by March 11, 2022. Onsite registration will not be available.
- 9.2 On-site Recce Check-In will be done as a drive through process at the Dent County Commons pavilion. Follow signs when arriving and stay in your vehicle.
- 9.3 A single email address will be specified by each team to be used for all event communications.
- 9.4 On-site crew registration will be inside the Dent County Fire House.
- 9.5 Do **not** bring your trailer to Check-In at the Fire House.
- 9.6 Volunteer check-in will be at the Crossroads Inn & Suites meeting room on Thursday, Friday and Saturday. See https://rally.100aw.org/ for details.

10 SCRUTINEERING

10.1 Scrutineering will be held at the Salem Fire House, 2 South Main St., Salem, MO. Do **not** bring your trailers. You may park trailers temporarily at Dent County Commons for loading and unloading for tech.

10.2 Scrutineering will be held at the following times:

Thursday, March 17, 12 Noon to 7:00 PM.

We will schedule times based on entry order in the following manner in order to minimize wait times.

5pm to 6pm Entry 75-90

A bulletin will be issued just before the event to finalize the tech appointments.

<u>Friday, March 18: BY APPOINTMENT ONLY</u>. To set up an appointment, contact the Chief Scrutineer found in section 2.6.

10.3 Log Books will only be issued at the event by appointment with the Chief Scrutineer. If you need a log book it is strongly recommended that you make an appointment by contacting aratechdoug@gmail.com as soon as possible.

11 SERVICE AREAS

11.1 There will be two service locations for the event.

Friday's service location is the Potosi Lions Park 10386 MO-185, Potosi, MO 63664. It is located on the west end of town at the intersection of Hwy 185 and Hwy 8. All service spots are on grass. Hot food and soft drinks will be available all day.

Saturday's service location is Dent County Commons, 162 County Rd. 2300, Salem MO, 65560. It is located on Hwy 72, 1.1 miles north of the junction of Hwy 72 & 32. Almost all service spots are on pavement. Hot food and soft drinks will be available all day.

The schedules for the service area are included in Appendix 1 – Itinerary and service area location is shown in Appendix 2 – Maps.

- 11.1.1 All service crew are required to have an ARA license and register for the event at http://rallylicense.com/. Crew may only obtain their license electronically at this website.
- 11.2 Any teams needing to use a service space larger than 20 feet by 50 feet will be charged \$200, payable with your registration fee.
- 11.3 Service spots will be assigned prior to the event or during Service Check-In. We will contact teams in advance to help work out the logistics of assigning service spots. Teams with special

service needs or problems should contact the event chair or Service Coordinator before March 7, 2022.

11.4 Parking will be limited due to spectators being allowed in service this year. A valid service vehicle decal must be displayed on the passenger side of any service vehicles to gain entry into service areas.

11.5 TRAILERS:

Trailer parking will be available to competitors across the street from the Salem TCRC, 1200 West Rolla Road (State Hwy J), in Salem, and is shown in a map in Appendix 2 – Maps

Trailers are <u>not</u> allowed to be kept at the Crossroads Inn in Salem. In addition, trailer parking at other motels may be limited.

Trailers are allowed into the service area.

- 11.6 It is recommended that competitors use a plywood or metal support plate underneath their jack stands while using them in service areas.
- 11.7 Service crew must notify the service area coordinator when they leave to retrieve a car.

12 SHAKEDOWN, PRESS, AND TESTING STAGES

- 12.1 There will be no shakedown stage this year.
- 12.2 We plan to offer a test session to all competitors on Wednesday, March 17. All test sessions will be on a first paid, first served basis with paid entry. Reservations and details for this will be announced via bulletin.

13 FEATURES OF THE RALLY

- 13.1 A Parc Exposé will be held as part of the starting ceremonies for each day's competition.
- 13.2 The locations and times for Parc Expose are:

Friday, March 18 Downtown Potosi, at the county courthouse 102 N Missouri St, Potosi, MO 63664

11:30 - 13:45 Required arrival time 12:30pm

Saturday, March 19: Fourth Street, downtown Salem, MO

8:00AM – 10:00AM Required arrival time 8:45am

Each Parc Expose will open prior to required arrival time for all competitors. Maps describing the areas are provided in Appendix 2, and will also be provided in the competitor route books and service packets.

Drivers and Co-drivers are required to be present in driving suits to show their cars and discuss the sport with spectators and press.

No refueling may take place within the Parc Expose zone, regardless of whether the Parc Expose has started or finished.

- 13.3 All control operations will be conducted per section 4 of the ARA RCR and employ RallySafe consoles and tablets.
- 13.4 An advance packet will be emailed to each team approximately 15 days before the event.
- 13.5 Rejoining the event/Re-entry after retirement (RAR).
 - 13.5.1 Teams that have DNF'd and wish to re-enter the second day may do so as a non-competitive re-entry. The Chief Scrutineer must approve and Clerk of the Course will place them safely in sequence.
 - 13.5.2 Competitors who have missed one or more controls and are Restarting After Retirement or rejoining under other circumstances are required to complete and submit and ARA Rally Re-Entry slip to the Clerk of the Course before they restart. The Clerk of the Course and Chief Scrutineer will verify that the team meets the safety requirements and has any required tracking or monitoring equipment before issuing a time card for the Rally Re-Entry
- 13.6 The Power Stage is stage 12, Scotia South Long
- 13.7 Official Finish:
 - 13.7.1 The Official Finish for each day's competition will be at the MTC IN at the service area.
 - 13.7.2 The Official Finish, on Saturday, is an impound.
- 13.8 The committee would like to remind competitors and crews that Salem has an "open bottle" ordinance that prohibits any open container of beer, wine, or other alcoholic beverage from being outdoors within the city limits. We ask that all associated with the rally show respect for both our hosts and the local laws throughout your stay and comply with this ordinance. The Dent County Commons is not within city limits.
- 13.9 Speed Limits:
 - 13.9.1 As a point of general information, the un-posted speed limit in the state of Missouri is 55 miles per hour for paved roads.

- 13.9.2 Due to the variety of county ordinances, we have set 35 mph as a maximum transit speed limit in the route book for all unpaved roads, except when they are being used for special stages as part of the rally.
- 13.9.3 All speed limits are noted in the route book and take precedence.

13.10 Car In Stream Procedure

If your car ends up immovable in a stream, you must show the SOS to the next car and report to them "Car In Stream", then follow the normal SOS procedures.

14 PRIZES/TROPHIES

- 14.1 The Awards Banquet will be held at The Dent County Commons, beginning at about 8:00 PM on Saturday, March 19 for all competitors, crew and volunteers. ARA will award trophies to the top finishing teams in all national classes.
- 14.2 The event organizers will award trophies for the Regional winners. The number of trophies awarded will be determined by the number of cars per class. To award first through third, at least 5 cars will need to be entered in a class. If there are 3 or 4 cars entered in a class, only first and second will be awarded, and only first for 2 or less. There will also be awards for the top 3 overall regional teams.

15 FINAL CHECKS AND PROTESTS

15.1 Post-rally inspections and teardowns of any competing vehicle will be performed at the discretion of ARA.
