An electronic entry application must be confirmed by way of personal signature by the competitor by the latest at administrative checks. The entry form must be accompanied by a copy of the valid competitor's licence. A change of competitor is permitted up to the close of entries. All cars from FIA homologation list "plus 8 years" former N1-N3 & A5-A6 will be included in classes RC4 / RC5

- Cars homologated as Kit Car and Super 1600 are not allowed.
- For drivers entered with a Rally2 car complying with 2021 Appendix J, Art. 261, it will be possible to use the old part after applying a joker (except reliability and safety jokers).
- For drivers entered with a Super 2000-Rally car complying with 2013 Appendix J, Art. 255A, it will be possible to use lapsed errata without any penalty
- An FIA technical passport is mandatory for S2000, Rally2 and RGT cars. (optional for cars entered in a rally of an FIA Cup or Trophy)
- RGT cars in compliance with 2019 Appendix J, Art. 256 must have a valid FIA RGT technical passport.

Art. 4.3.2.1 Eligible national cars in ERT / ORM

National homologated cars may participate in the European Rally Trophy rallies when they fit into a national group/class of the organising country, without eligibility to score Trophy points.

Art. 4.4 Entry fees / entry fee packages

Art. 4.6 Entry fee refunds

The entry fee shall be refunded in full

- if the event does not take place
- to teams whose entry application is rejected

The organiser may partially refund entry fees (max. 50%), if a competitor cannot take part in the event due to a duly proved case of force majeure.

Art. 5. Insurance Cover

5.1 Group accident insurance:

Applies to all persons involved in the organization of the event (in particular officials and officials) and for (co-)drivers (rallies), as well as accredited journalists and photographers and owners of foreign driver's licenses, unless they have already been assigned to another domestic or foreign insurer upright accident insurance exists, with the following sums insured:

EUR 15.000,00 for the death

EUR 15.000,00 in case of permanent disability

EUR 10.000,00 for medical expenses.

5. 2 Civil Liability insurance:

Liability insurance with the following coverage amounts:

EUR 5.000.000,00 for personal injury and / or property damage.

Within this sum, there are also insured losses in the amount of EUR 20.000,00.

A statutory liability insurance is mandatory for all competition vehicles and must be provided by the owner of the vehicle. This liability insurance must cover all damages on roads, except special and shakedown.

The conclusion of a legal liability insurance is to be proven at the administrative check.

Service and support vehicles with rally plate are not insured by the organizer liability insurance.

Insurance cover will come into effect from the start and will cease at the end of the Rally or at the moment of withdrawal or disqualification of the Competitor.

Art. 6. Advertising and Identification

See Appendix 4 of these SR "Decals and positioning of supplementary advertising".

Art. 6.1 Obligatory organiser's advertising

See Appendix 4 of these regulations

The organiser will provide each crew with the number identification (65 x 15 cm), which must be affixed to their car in the stated positions prior to scrutineering. Each panel shall be placed horizontally at the leading edge of each front door, with the number at the front. The top of the plate shall be between 7 cm and 10 cm below the lower limit of the window. It is not allowed to cut the panel.

Art. 6.2 Optional organiser's advertising

Art. 7. Tyres

Art. 7.1 Regulations regarding tyres which may be used during the rally

See Art. 13 and Appendix V of the FIA RRSR (tyres and wheels). The Tyre hand cutting is allowed in accordance with the patterns submitted by the tyre manufacturer to the FIA. According Appendix V of the FIA RRSR (tyres and wheels).

Art. 7.2 National laws or special requirements

For the National Championship and all National Classes, the regulations apply in accordance with the Standard Regulations for the FIA ERT Championship.

Art. 7.2.1 Noise Level

All vehicles must be fitted with a suitable stable silencer. A noise level measured by a static method must not exceed the value of 98 dB with an error tolerance of +2 dB (A). The measurement is based on EHK 51.02 Guideline at 3500 rpm for petrol engines and 2500 rpm for diesel engines. Phone measurements can be carried out during scrutineering and/or during the event. Exceeding the permissible noise level during the technical inspection is not permitted. If excessive noise development is detected during the event, the team in question will be reported to the stewards.

Art. 8. Fuel

All type of fuel must follow Appendix J Art. 252.9.

Art. 9. Reconnaissance of Special Stages

Reconnaissance will be according to FIA RRSR Art. 35. The schedule for the reconnaissance is published in Appendix 2 of these supplementary regulations.

Reconnaissance material will be issued upon collection of the Road Book.

Art. 9.1 Registration procedure

Recce cars must be registered at the Road Book collection. Each car must be identified with a reconnaissance car number supplied by the organiser. Rally cars used in the event may not be used for reconnaissance.

Art. 9.2 Specific regulations

During reconnaissance, all national traffic regulation must be followed, including but not limited to the speed limits. Please note that the Special Stages will not be closed to public traffic during reconnaissance. The organizer may reduce the allowed speed individually by marking the areas in the road book and along the route. Speeding during reconnaissance and / or shakedown will penalised according to FIA RRSR Article 34.2.

The reconnaissance card has to be completed by each participant himself and has to be handed in to the Rally HQ by no later than Friday, 15.07.2022 at 12:00 o'clock together with the Recce GPS unit. Entries in the reconnaissance card are controlled by the rally organizer. **Reconnaissance is limited to three (3) times per special stage.**

Art. 9.3 Collection of speed control checking devices

All reconnaissance cars must be equipped with a speed control checking devise. This devise can be collected according to the programme (SR Art. 3)

Art. 10. Administrative checks

Art. 10.1 Documents to be presented:

To keep the time required for the administrative checks to the necessary minimum, make sure to bring and present the following documents:

- Competitors' licence
- Driver's and co-driver's competition licences
- Driver's and co-driver's ID cards/passports
- Driver's and co-driver's valid driving licences

- ASN authorisation for foreign competitors (if required)
- Completion of all details on the entry form
- Car insurance cover certificate
- Car registration papers

Art. 10.2 Timetable

Art. 11. Scrutineering, Sealing and Marking

Art. 11.1 Scrutineering, venue, and time

Cars may be presented at scrutineering by a representative of the team. See programme (SR Art. 3)

Art. 11.1.1 Scrutineering, mandatory documents

- Cars' complete certified homologation
- SOS / OK board (DIN A3 format)

For each car of the **FIA Priority Drivers**, one spare gearbox and one set of spare differentials (front and/or centre and/or rear) may be used in each rally. These spare components and those fitted to the car will be marked/sealed at initial scrutineering. These cars must have their sump guards removed for sealing of gearboxes and differentials and be kept with the car for the purpose of weighting.

Art. 11.1.2 Timetable for scrutineering

See programme (SR Art. 3)

A detailed schedule for scrutineering will be published online together with the entry list

Art. 11.2 Mud flaps

It is optional to fit transverse mud flaps in conformity with the article Appendix J, Art. 252.7.7

Art. 11.3 Windows

Use of tinted windows is not authorized in accordance with Article 253.11 "Windows/nets" of Appendix J of the FIA International Sporting Code.

Art. 11.4 Drivers' safety equipment

All items of clothing including helmets and FHR (Front Head Restraint) intended to be used, e.g. HANS devices, must be presented for scrutineering. They shall be checked for compliance with Appendix L, Chapter III. further info see **Appendix 5**

Art. 11.5 Installation of the safety & recce tracking system

A Safety Tracking System is obligatory for all participating teams! The system (including the installation manual) can be collected at the Rally HQ

Art. 12. Other procedures and regulations

Art. 12.1 Shakedown

During Shakedown service is only permitted in the main service park.

Art. 12.2 Ceremonial start procedures and order

A ceremonial start (participants and cars presentation) is planned. The exact procedure and schedule will be announced with the entry confirmation. Before the Start there will be [a Start Area according to Art. 40.1 of the RRSR Location: Europa-Allee, 8160 Weiz

Art. 12.2 Start of the rally and starting order

12.2.1 Start rally

The official start of the rally will be at **TC 0 "STROBL Company"** 15.7.2022 13:00 (1st car FIA EHRC) Expected time 1st car FIA ERT + 45 min. = **13:45**

12.2.2 Start order

General order of the event: Historic Competitors of FIA EHRC & AMF Expected + 45 Minutes ERT & FIA priority drivers, ASN priority Drivers, all other. For Leg 1: Start in numerical order at a minute interval with a break of at least 10 minutes after the Historic Block. For Leg 2: The starting order is in the order of the result of Leg 1, with a break of at least 10 minutes after the Historic Block.

12.2.3 Restart after retirement (Rally 2)

See FIA RRSR 2022 Art. 54.

12.2.4. Number of laps in "RC": Only the crews are responsible for driving the exact number of laps which are clearly indicated in the roadbook. In case of exceeding the number of laps the actual driving time will be counted. In case of a smaller number of laps following time penalty will be assigned, For every stage or super special not completed correctly:

10 minutes time penalty according FIA RRSR Art. 54.2

Art. 12.3 Permitted early check-in

At TC 5B and 13C an early check-in is permitted.

Art. 12.4 Start procedure on Special Stages

The electronic start procedure is as follows:

12.4.1 Starting system of special stages except SP 5 & 10/12 round course.

The electronic start device shall be clearly visible to the crew from the start line and will be displayed either as a countdown clock or a sequential light system. After filling in the time card the start marshal hands it back to the crew and points to the clock displaying hours, minutes and seconds.

The starting lines are equipped with photo cells (placed 40 cm after of the starting line) of the timekeeping instrument with print out device and coupled with the above mentioned system, registering false starts.

MANUAL START PROCEDURE

In the event of having to use a manual start procedure after handing the time card back to the crew, the start marshal will count down aloud: 30" - 15" - 10" and the last five seconds one by one. When the last 5 seconds have elapsed, the starting signal shall be given.

12.4.2 Starting System for SS "RC" round course

Upon arrival at the start crews will have recorded estimated starting time into the time card.

The estimated starting time to SS is the starting time for the next section. After the marshal at start gives the crew the time card he will indicate the start lights. The lights will be red. Start to the SS will not be at given minute, but will be operated by a timekeeper bearing in mind the safety of the drivers. Crew will enter the SS when the signal light switches from red to green colour. The time to start is signaled by the light changing from red to green. The competing car must start within 5 seconds. In case of the start light's not working, the start will be given manual with flags.

12.4.3 At the "STOP" the actual start time for the following section and the special stage driving time will be entered in the time card.

Art. 12.5 Super Special Stage, regulations, and order

There will be no Super Special Stage.

Art. 12.6 Tyre Warming Zone (TWZ)

There will be no Tyre Warming Zones according to Art. 44.4 of the RRSR.

Art. 12.7 Refuelling

Art. 12.7.1 Refuelling is only allowed in Refuelling Zone (RZ) and commercial fuel station. To refuel in the service park is forbidden at any time.

Art. 12.7.2 To access a Refuelling Zone, all personnel involved in refueling operations must wear clothing that provides adequate protection against fire and includes at least: long trousers, long-sleeved top, closed shoes, gloves and a balaclava.

Art. 12.7.3 Environmental Mat in a Refueling Zone (RZ)

The requirement of protecting the ground with an Environmental Mat, which shall be composed of an absorbent upper part and an impermeable lower part, is assigned to the competitors.

Art. 12.8 Finish procedures and other activities after the finish of the rally

Art. 12.8.1 There will be no specific finish procedure after the rally finish podium.

Art. 12.8.2 Availability of participants

Participants who park their vehicles in the Parc Fermé upon passing the finish line, must remain available by phone (mobile) until the final classification has been posted.

Art. 12.8.3 Classification

The final classification will not be distributed after the event. The final classification will be published on the website and on the Digital Notice Board >> ONLINE NOTICEBOARDS AND INFOS

Art. 12.9 Official time used during the rally

Throughout the Rally, the official time will be the time signal provided by the Austrian Post. The official time can be obtained at the phone number +43 810 00 15 03.





Appendix 5 – Extracts from FIA ISC Appendix L

relating to overalls, helmets and any other safety requirements

1. Flame-resistant clothing

In rally special stages must all drivers and co-drivers wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2000 standard (Technical List N° 27). See art. 6.1. chapter E of National Regulations.

2. Helmets

In rally special stages must all drivers and co-drivers wear helmets with the FIA standards and listed in FIA technical sheet no. 25 (www.fia.com).

3. Frontal Head Restraint (FHR e.g. HANS®)

According to article 3, chapter III Appendix of FIA RRR is the Frontal Head Restraint obligatory for all drivers and co-drivers. Homologated FHR systems are listed in the FIA Technical List N°29 according to FIA 8858 standard. FHR must be used only with element approved by the FIA (article 3.2, chapter III Appendix L of FIA RRR).

4. Safety belts Drivers and co-drivers

must be fasten throughout the driving (SS and rally track) in the seats with safety belts which are approved by specification of Appendix J (art. 4, chapter III Appendix L of FIA RRR). According to art.253/6.1 Appendix J must be all cars equipped with safety belts with homologation FIA 8853/98. It is strongly recommended to use safety belts equipped with lock type "P" /push-button/ with pushing mechanism. In the car must be permanently two knives on belts. They must be easily accessible for driver and co-driver in their seats with seat belts fastened.

5. Drivers safety equipment card

Appendix 5A - GPS INFORMATION

General provisions

All competition cars must be obligatorily equipped with the ONI® tracking system. ONI® tracking system will be rented to the competitors. Eventual destruction, non-return or damage of the unit must be paid by the competitor to the organizer in accordance with the applicable price list see Art. 9.2.1.

In case of non-returning GPS tracking system immediately after the event, the fine 200 euro will be imposed to the competitor.

Distribution of the ONI® tracking system

ONI® tracking system contains following parts:

- tracking unit with display
- tracking unit holder
- power supply cable
- combined antenna roof
- control panel containing:
- OK button to cancel the alarm / confirm red flag
- SOS switch for calling emergency



ONI® tracking system will be installed to every rally car before each event. Detailed information will be published no later than during roadbooks issuing. After arrival to the scrutineering, device administrator will check the install of the tracking unit, antenna and control panel. Antenna and power supply cables can be purchased by the crew for personal ownership. At the end of the rally or after retirement, the tracking unit or complete tracking system must be returned to the device administrator. Usually, the devices are collected in the last service area or before finish of the rally.

Installation of the unit in the car

To fit the tracking unit with display, antenna and control panel, it is necessary for the competitor to follow exactly the Installation guide, to keep the unit in good condition and to protect it against damage and fouling (especially the connectors) during the time. All rally participants will receive a rental version of the set equipped with magnetic roof antenna. Control panel with OK button and SOS switch is in one box for which the competitor has to choose a suitable place for fitting within the reach of both crew members. It is obliged to prepare everything for its installation prior to the scrutineering.

The unit operation during rally

To operate the unit, the crews have to meet all instructions as mentioned in the User's guide.

Operation during events on SS:

• Accident (crash detection)

The unit evaluates the situation and sends info about accident to rally control. Crew cannot affect this message. The display shows message: **Are you OK?** Confirm.

10 s after this question, the siren wails for next 15 s

If the crew pushes **OK** button, this information is sent to rally control and information about accident is not sent to the unit of following cars in the stage.

Stop in SS

When the car stops in SS, it is counted as an obstacle. Unit signals to the crew by sound siren and text, that they have stopped. This signal takes 15 s.

If the crew doesn't push OK, warning message is sent to the rally control and also to other cars, which are currently in the stage arriving to the obstacle.

With pushing the OK button, the crew confirms that they are okay, on the display is shown message OK and information about obstacle is not send to the unit of next cars in the stage.

• Request for help

Changing the switch is confirmed by SOS message on display, also the siren sounds.

The siren sound can be cancelled by pushing OK button.

Red flag

When the rally control hangs out the red flag, the display shows big message RED FLAG (with red background) and the siren sounds. Crew has obligation to confirm receiving the red flag by pushing the OK button and to reduce the speed according to the sporting regulations.

The siren sound can be cancelled by pushing OK button. The red flag on display can be cancelled only by rally control.

Speed checking during the reconnaissance

During reconnaissance the crew is obliged to follow traffic rules of Austria. Not respecting this rule, especially exceeding the speed limits, will be monitored via ONI® tracking system. This checking doesn't exclude other checks, i.e. police controls according to their standard procedures.




ONI® tracking system for reconnaissance

Tracking system is checking the speed in every moment

during the reconnaissance. Every crew will pick up the ONI® recce tracking unit together with roadbook. Installation of the unit and using during reconnaissance is obligatory for all crews during the whole schedule of reconnaissance according to the art. 3 Reconnaissance schedule. For speed checking during the reconnaissance, NCL 21 units are used. NCL21 unit is started during roadbook issuing before starting of reconnaissance. For whole reconnaissance the unit is working on its own battery. It is not necessary to plug the unit to any power supply. It is possible to place the unit on metal surfaces - magnets are implemented in the unit. Not using the unit in a rally car during reconnaissance will be fined. Every attempt to falsify, manipulate or infringe the unit for reconnaissance or any device, which will make impossible to collect data because of external interference will be reported to the stewards who can penalize the crew up to refusing the start. Decision regarding seriousness of the offence and its repeating is in Clerk of the Course authority. For exceeding the speed limit, sanctions can be given according to supplementary regulations or championship regulations.

6.2.2 Allocation and equipment of the service place

Basically, each team is provided a service area. A service deposit of € 50.00 will be charged per team. If the service area is left clean again, this deposit will be refunded. The refund is to pick up on Saturday, 16.07.2022, 22:00 clock, at the service place team suburb (then the deposit expires!). The organizer does not provide electricity in the service park.

6.2.3 Behavior in the service park

Only competitor vehicles and service vehicles with the official sign ("Service") may enter the marked service areas in the service parc. The surface of the service park must not be damaged. No nails, screws or similar parts may be hammered in. The team is liable for any damages incurred on its assigned service area. The Austrian environmental guidelines apply.

In particular and in addition, the following applies:

- 1. At the service area, a liquid-tight tarpaulin (e.g., environmental mat) of at least 5 x 2 meters shall be laid under the floor to protect the underlay of any competition vehicle on which work is carried out.
- 2. Service work must not cause any lasting, avoidable, ecological damage.
- 3. The vehicles may only be refuelled in the intended tank zone (s).
- 4. Unreasonable or wanton behaviour of a team against the goals of environmental protection basically damages the reputation of motorsport and is therefore even if detailed regulations are missing to sanction. The service area must be left in good and clean condition after the event. Accumulated waste and liquids are to be disposed of professionally by the team or the team itself.

6.2.4 Catering at the service park

Catering in the service parc is only allowed with the written consent of the organizer (to be fetched by the closing date). In this case, the organizer reserves the right to charge a fee for power supply and waste disposal. Excluded is the self-supply of the teams, especially drivers and mechanics.

The sale of food and drinks in the service parc is generally prohibited.

The use of LPG for cooking and heating purposes is prohibited in the entire service park!

6.3 Participants security

The general emergency number of the event is: +43 676 5325158.

This number is mandatory for all teams to store in a mobile phone to be carried on the speed dial 2 (for smartphones under Favourites) to ensure emergency access quickly. Compliance with this regulation can be checked at any time during the event! If the number is not stored, this will result in a report to the stewards and will be fined with € 250.

The use of an FHR system (e.g., HANS®) is mandatory for all participants in all classes

NON-LIABILITY CLAUSE

The participants are aware of, understand and fully accept the risks and dangers involved in motor racing. Should a participant be injured during an event, he explicitly declares through his entry for the event that he approves all medical treatment, rescue and transportation to hospital or other emergency facilities. Such measures will be adopted by personnel appointed specifically for this purpose by the promoter, to the best of the personnel's knowledge and following their assessment of the participant's condition. The participants undertake to assume all related costs, provided such costs are not covered by the licence accident insurance or other insurance policies. The participants hereby waive all direct and indirect claims for compensation from AMF, its officials, the promoter and/or organiser or the racing circuit owners, from any other person or association linked with the event (including all officials and authorities or bodies who have granted licences for the event), and from other entrants and drivers/riders, hereinafter referred to as "the parties". The participants do so for themselves and their legal successors, and consequently for any insurance company with whom they may have concluded additional policies. In submitting their entries for this event, the participants hereby declare that they irrevocably and unconditionally waive all rights, appeals, claims, demands, acts and/or proceedings which they themselves might institute or which might be instituted by third parties acting on their behalf against "the parties". The participants do so in connection with injury, loss, damage, costs and/or expenses (including lawyers' fees) which they may incur due to an incident or accident as part of the event. In submitting their entries for this event, the participants declare irrevocably that they discharge, release, and relieve "the parties" for all time from any liability for such losses, and that they shall guard them against such losses and hold them harmless. In submitting their entries for this event, the participants declare that they understand the full significance and repercussion of the present declarations and agreements, that they are entering into such obligations of their own free will, and in doing so irrevocably waive all right of action for damages against "the parties", insofar as permissible as Austrian law currently stands. The participants in any case renounce for themselves and their legal successors all claims against "the parties", therefore in particular against the AMF, its officials, the promoter and/or organiser or the racing circuit owners, and against the authorities or bodies who have granted licences for the event, regarding damage, loss, harm, or injury of any kind connected with a typical sports risk, in particular any typical and foreseeable damage, loss, harm or injury. This applies also in the event of minor negligence on the part of "the parties".

ARBITRATION AGREEMENT

- Any dispute arising between the participants and the AMF or its officials, and the promoter and/or organiser, and between the AMF or
 its officials and the promoter and/or organiser, as a result of claims (personal injury, damage to property or financial damage) in
 connection with the motor-racing event, training sessions or races shall be settled definitely by an arbitration tribunal to the exclusion of
 the courts of general jurisdiction.
- 2. The arbitration tribunal shall consist of three arbitrators, namely the umpire and two assessors. The umpire shall be a lawyer or former judge and have experience of liability matters in connection with motor racing.
- 3. Each party shall appoint an assessor within two weeks of notification of the intent to initiate arbitral proceedings. Should the dispute be referred by several claimants or be levelled at several defendants, the arbitrator shall be appointed by agreement between the joined parties. The assessors shall elect the umpire. Should the assessors be unable to agree on the person of the umpire within two weeks, the umpire shall be appointed by the President of the Vienna Chamber of Lawyers upon application by an assessor, with due regard to clause b). The assessors shall however be free at any time to replace the umpire appointed in this way by another umpire by mutual agreement.
- 4. Should a party fail to appoint its assessor within two weeks of receiving the written request from the opposite side or should several joined parties be unable to agree on an assessor within that period, the assessor shall be appointed by the President of the Vienna Chamber of Lawyers on the motion of the other party. The same shall apply should an assessor withdraw from office and the party concerned not appoint a successor within two weeks.
- 5. Should an arbitrator not assume office, refuse to discharge his duties, cause improper delay, or become unfit to act, the aforementioned provisions shall apply accordingly for the appointment of a replacement. The arbitrator concerned shall be dismissed at the same time.
- 6. The arbitration tribunal shall in principle be free to conduct its proceedings as it sees fit, with due regard for the subsidiary legal provisions. The tribunal shall sit in Vienna. The arbitration tribunal may also investigate without petition any circumstances which it deems necessary to clarify the facts of the case and take evidence.
- 7. The arbitration tribunal shall decide by simple majority. The tribunal shall state the full reasons for its award. It shall also decide on cost apportionment for the costs of both the arbitration proceedings and the legal representation. The arbitrators shall be remunerated in accordance with the provisions of the Austrian lawyers' scale of charges.
- 8. The arbitration tribunal shall also be entitled to the exclusion of the courts of general jurisdiction to issue injunctions, provided the opposing party is first given an opportunity to express its views. An injunction may also be lifted upon petition in the event of a significant change in circumstances.
- 9. Sports jurisdiction shall remain unaffected by the present Arbitration Agreement.
