

COVID-19 Delegates Notes **EKO ACROPOLIS RALLY 2021** 9 – 12 September 2021

From *COVID-19 Delegate* **Version** 1
To *All Stakeholders and Attendees* **Date** 26.8.2021

PREAMBLE

These COVID-19 Delegate's Notes are published pursuant to points 1.5 and 1.6 of the COVID-19 Code of Conduct as set out in Appendix S of the FIA International Sporting Code (ISC). They apply to the event incorporating the EKO Acropolis Rally 2021 (the Greece Event) which for the avoidance of doubt includes all support championship/series competitions.

Terms in italics in this document that are not defined in this document have the meaning given to them in the COVID-19 Code or the ISC.

For the avoidance of doubt, for the purpose of these COVID-19 Delegate's Notes only, the term Stakeholder includes all parties as per COVID-19 Code Art. 3.1 and specifically each Competitor (Team).

If any amendments of these operational guidance are deemed to be necessary before or during the Greece Event, they will be communicated by means of an update to this document.

Section 2 sets out practical information and operational guidance to assist Stakeholders and Attendees to comply with the COVID-19 Code at the EKO Acropolis Rally 2021.

A privacy notice, explaining how FIA will process personal data in connection with the COVID-19 Code, is included at the end of these COVID-19 Delegate's Notes.

The Organisers Point of Contact for Covid-19 issues – including to report anybody showing signs of symptoms is the COVID-19 Medical Officer **Dr. George Harmanis**, phone **+30 6944 758 400**; e-mail: covid19doctor@acropolisrally.gr

Attendees who begin to suffer from any COVID-19 symptoms while outside the Venue must report to their Stakeholder and the COVID-19 Medical Officer **Dr. George Harmanis**, phone **+30 6944 758 400**; e-mail: covid19doctor@acropolisrally.gr and follow the instructions given. A PCR-test will be performed.

Accredited persons are guaranteed full assistance by the organizers in case of a positive COVID-19 test result at any time.

The organiser will contact the person and coordinate and support all further activities. The organiser shall immediately inform the Health Board about the person who has given a positive test result, forwarding all information. The person is immediately subject to 10 days of quarantine and may not leave Greece.

In the case of any discrepancies in this document between the requirements imposed by the governmental / regional / local authorities of the hosting country and those imposed by the FIA, the higher-grade requirements shall always take priority.

SECTION 1 – Reminders from the APPENDIX S to the International Sporting Code

ARTICLE 2. DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION

2.1 The following terms have the following meanings:

Close contact means the *Attendee* in question (a) has been within two metres of an *infected* person either (i) for more than fifteen minutes, or (ii) while they were both in a confined space (e.g. a car); or (b) provided direct care to an *infected* person without wearing appropriate *PPE*.

Fit to Attend means that the *Profile 1 Attendee* (as defined in Article 3.5 of Appendix S) in question has no COVID-19 risk factors that mean they should not attend *Covered Events*. More specifically, confirmation by a *Stakeholder* that a *Profile 1 Attendee* is *Fit to Attend* a *Covered Event* means that:

- 1) the *Profile 1 Attendee* has undergone one *PCR Test* organised by the *Stakeholder* and administered by an *Approved Test Provider* in the 96 hours prior to arrival at the *Venue* hosting the *Covered Event* in question (**Pre-Event Test**), and the *Stakeholder* has received a communication from the *Profile 1 Attendee* or from the *Approved Test Provider* based on the test results; and
- 2) the *Stakeholder* has concluded (either by reviewing a declaration made by the *Profile 1 Attendee* or a health screening and risk profiling questionnaire filled out by the *Profile 1 Attendee* and/or by other means) that the *Profile 1 Attendee* has no underlying health issues or other relevant risk factors specific to COVID-19 including close contact with an infected person (whether creating risks for him/herself or others) that mean he/she should not attend the *Covered Event* in question, taking into account all applicable risk factors from national and World Health Organisation guidelines.

Medical Face Mask means a face mask that complies with European Standard EN 14683:2019+AC:2019.

ARTICLE 6C. PROTOCOLS APPLICABLE DURING A PART TWO EVENT

6.18 An *Attendee* who begins to suffer from any COVID-19 Symptoms while at the *Venue* or is identified as having had any close contact with a person who is or may be an *infected* person, must report immediately to the COVID-19 Medical Officer **Dr. George Harmanis**, phone **+30 6944 758 400**; e-mail: covid19doctor@acropolisrally.gr and follow the instructions received.

ARTICLE 6D. PROTOCOLS APPLICABLE AFTER A PART TWO EVENT

6.22 If an *Attendee* develops any COVID-19 Symptoms or tests positive for the COVID-19 virus within 14 days of the end of a Part Two Event, he/she must report this immediately to his/her *Stakeholder* or to a healthcare professional designated by his/her *Stakeholder* and provide details of all *Attendees* with whom he/she was in Close Contact during that time. The *Stakeholder* or healthcare professional will then advise the FIA COVID-19 Delegate that the *Attendee* should no longer attend Part Two Events, and the FIA COVID-19 Delegate will follow up as necessary in respect of *Attendees* with whom that *Attendee* had been in Close Contact.

2.1 CLARIFICATIONS AND PRACTICAL IMPLEMENTATION OF COVID-19 CODE REQUIREMENTS

2.1.1 DELIMITATION OF HIGH DENSITY AREAS AND LOW DENSITY AREAS.

High Density Areas as defined in the *COVID-19 Code*: The Rally HQ, Media Centre and selected parts of the Service Park will be defined as *High Density Area* from **07h00 on Sunday 5th September 2021**. From this time only *Profile 1 Attendees* will be permitted access to the *High Density Area*. For tyre marking zones, please refer to point 2.2.2 in this document.

Overview Map for Service Park HDA



All TFZ and Regroupings of the event are treated as High Density Areas. All other parts of the rally route including stages will be considered *Low Density Areas*. Accordingly, the people who are not requiring access to the *High Density Areas* will be considered *Profile 2 Attendees*.

Regarding the move back from *High Density Areas* to *Low Density Areas* after the *EKO Acropolis Rally 2021*, this will be determined as **19h30 on Sunday 12th September 2021** unless otherwise instructed.

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2.1.2 ATTENDING THE EVENT

2.1.2.1 REQUIREMENTS TO ENTRY TO GREECE

Summary

Due to Covid-19 pandemic there are prohibitions of third-country nationals entering Greece: The civil aviation authority under the Ministry of Infrastructure and Transport prohibits third-country nationals other than the EU and the Schengen Agreement, including their spouses or persons with whom they have entered into a cohabitation agreement, from entering the country and their minor children.

Excludes passengers traveling for essential reasons and permanent residents of the following 35 countries: *Australia, North Macedonia, United Arab Emirates, United States of America, United Kingdom, Israel, Canada, Belarus, Bahrain, New Zealand, South Korea, Qatar, China, Kuwait, Ukraine, Russia Federation, Saudi Arabia, Serbia, Singapore, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, Albania, Japan, Lebanon, Azerbaijan, Armenia, Jordan, Moldova, Brunei, San Marino, Andorra, Vatican, Monaco, Turkey and Kosovo** (This designation is without prejudice to positions on status, and is in line with UNSCR 1244/1999 and the ICJ Opinion on the Kosovo declaration of independence).

If you are not passport holders of the above countries, please do not hesitate to contact the Rally Office at contact@acropolisrally.gr.

Before entering to Greece

Fill in the PLF (Passenger Locator Form) at least 24 hours before entering Greece (air, sea, land). One PLF should be submitted per family. The PLF can be found at <https://travel.gov.gr/#/>

Prior to departure, all travelers must ensure that they carry an acceptable form of certification of their health condition. Acceptable documents include **one** of the below:

1. A negative PCR molecular test result from a laboratory; the test must be taken up to 72 hours before entry. Including children over the age of 12, regardless of the epidemiological situation in the country of departure.
2. A negative antigen (rapid) test result from a laboratory; the test must be taken up to 48 hours before entry.
3. A vaccination certificate issued by a certified authority (i.e., 14 days have elapsed since the last vaccination, depending on the doses required). Acceptable vaccines are *Pfizer BioNtech, Moderna, Astra Zeneca/Oxford, Novavax, Johnson + Johnson/Janssen, Sinovac Biotech, Gamaleya (Sputnik), Cansino Biologics, Sinopharm* among others.
4. A certificate of recovery from the SARS-CoV-2 virus infection issued by a public authority or a certified laboratory. The certificate is issued 30 days after the day of the first positive COVID-19 test and is valid for 180 days after it.
5. Proof that the traveler was tested positive with COVID-19 in the past 30 to 180 days. This can be proved either by presenting a positive PCR molecular or an antigen test result performed by an authorized laboratory or a medical certificate confirming that the holder was tested positive with SARS-CoV-2 virus infection.

All certificates must include the critical information (i.e. number of doses and their respective dates) in one of the following languages: English, German, French, Italian, Spanish or Russian and the person's full name must match the name on the passport or any other recognized travel document.

Upon arrival to Greece

Every traveler who arrives in Greece, regardless of the certificate in their possession, may undergo a random health screening. If you are selected, please keep in mind that the screening is mandatory. In case of refusal, authorities reserve the right to refuse entry into the country. The selection is made through a targeted sampling system "EVA".

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There will be a mandatory isolation if they test positive for SARS-Cov-2, following a sampling test. In this case, the travelers and their travel companions are accommodated in quarantine hotels, where they will undergo further PCR testing to confirm the initial diagnosis. Guests will stay in seclusion hotels for a maximum of 10 days. The expenses of the accommodation in quarantine hotels are covered by the Greek state.

Important clarification: Entry in Greece is not subject to vaccination. Presenting a vaccination certificate greatly facilitates the procedures upon arrival. However, in no case is a vaccination or antibodies certificate considered a "passport".

Self-isolation

The countries from which entry is allowed, under the aforementioned conditions, without the requirement for subsequent self-isolation are: EU++ (Andorra, Iceland, Lichtenstein, Norway, Switzerland, San Marino, Vatican, the Principality of Monaco), USA, UK, Albania, Armenia, Australia, Azerbaijan, Bahrein, Belarus, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brunei, Canada, China, Israel, Japan, Jordan, Kosovo* (This designation is without prejudice to positions on status, and is in line with UNSCR 1244/1999 and the ICJ Opinion on the Kosovo declaration of independence), Kuwait, Lebanon, Moldova, Montenegro, New Zealand, North Macedonia, Qatar, the Russian Federation*, Saudi Arabia, Serbia, Singapore, South Korea, Turkey, UAE, Ukraine.

*For the Russian Federation, from June 30, passengers must carry a negative PCR molecular test result from a testing laboratory taken up to 72 hours before arrival, or a negative antigen (rapid) test result taken up to 48 hours before arrival regardless if they are vaccinated or not.

Non-EU citizens

Non-EU citizens are strongly advised to choose direct flights to Greece. In any other case, travelers should abide by the stop-over country requirements. Passengers are allowed to enter the country through all international airports and all ports.

Sea and Road Borders

Travellers are allowed to enter from the land borders through the entry gates of Promachonas, Ormenio, Evzonoï, Nymfaia, Niki, Doirani, Kristallopigi, Kipi, Kakavia, Kastanies and Exohi in a 24h basis.

MEDICAL MASKS ARE MANDATORY AT ALL TIMES BOTH AT THE EVENT SITES AND ALSO INSIDE PUBLIC AREAS

2.1.2.2 ENTRY TO HIGH DENSITY AREA

Accreditation

Only individuals who have tested negative for COVID-19 latest 96 hours before entering the High Density Area (Rally HQ, Service Park or Media Centre) for the first time will be accredited for the event. The Accreditation Centre is open starting from **Saturday, 4 September 2021 at 14:00 hrs local time**. Location and opening hours of the Accreditation Centre are given below.

NO ACCESS to the HD Area will be granted without the individual accreditation wristband issued by the Organiser. The accreditation is personal and there is no option to grant access to additional guests or sub-contractors. If the person is not on the Stakeholder list, the person would not have any access to the HD Area.

In compliance with FIA Appendix S, **individual Attendees** must:

- Appear on the FIA Covered Attendee List of one *Stakeholder* which must be forwarded in Excel format to covid19_WRC@fia.com and covid19@acropolisrally.gr
- Complete the COVID-19 Attendee Commitment and Self Declaration forms online. See LINKS below.

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- Submit their negative PCR test -which should be within 96 hours prior their entry to the HD area- to their own *Stakeholder* representative who will transfer it to covid19@acropolisrally.com AND show a physical copy at the Accreditation Centre in Lamia.
- Ensure the bracelet is visible at ALL times. The bracelet is personal and colour to signify your status as a COVID-19 HDA accredited person at *the Greek Event*. The bracelet will be checked when entering HDA event areas and only personnel who belong in the HDA group will be allowed in.
- Have a temperature check every time before entry to HDA.
- Be responsible for following the Authorities' and the Organisers' COVID-19 protocols and recommendations also in their spare time, for example, staying within their group bubble when in accommodation, eating in their agreed dining areas, using medical masks, keeping social distance and regular handwashing.

2.1.3 RESTRICTION ON THE NUMBER OF ATTENDEES

Each *Stakeholder* has been asked to fill in a *Stakeholder Attendee List* and name all *Attendees* who need to be accredited for the access to the Rally HQ or Service Park (*High Density Areas*). This list includes everyone that requires the access to these areas. The accreditation is personal and there is no option to grant access to additional guests or sub-contractors. If the person is not on the *Stakeholder Attendee List*, the person would not have any access to *High Density Areas*. 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2.1.4 PROCESS FOR DOCUMENTATION SUBMISSION FOR THE EKO ACROPOLIS RALLY 2021 (cf. COVID-19 CODE ART. 6.5)

All *Stakeholders* are required to submit an *Attendee* list (even if they already did so for former events) to the rally organiser and FIA. Signed *Attendee* commitment forms are required from all new *Attendees*. All submitted *Attendee* list(s) must:

- Show *Attendees* displayed in black text (**John Smith**), including the designation as *Profile 1 Attendee* or *Profile 2 Attendee*;
- Clearly indicate any new or additional *Attendees* (compared to the previous events) by displaying them in bold and green text (**John Smith**), also including the date of the *pre-event test*.
- Retain the names of any *Attendees* nominated for the previous events that are not to have access to the *Venue* for the *EKO Acropolis Rally*, but have them displayed in strikethrough and red text (~~John Smith~~); and
- Be provided in an Excel format. Templates will be sent to all *Stakeholders* by email.

Each *Stakeholder* must moreover provide all the information and documents as listed in Art. 6.5 of the COVID-19 Code of Conduct.

The required *Attendee* list(s) and *Attendee* commitment forms described above must be submitted no later than 22:59 CET on Wednesday 1st September 2021 by email to: covid19@acropolisrally.gr and copied to covid19_WRC@fia.com

2.1.5 MANUAL CONTACT TRACING

For the *EKO Acropolis Rally*, all *Profile 1 Attendees* are requested to maintain a complete and accurate list of each other *Attendee* with whom they have *close contact*. This information may be requested to assist with outbreak control.

Close contact means the *Attendee* in question (a) has been within two meters of an *infected* person either (i) for more than fifteen minutes, or (ii) while they were both in a confined space (e.g. a car); or (b) provided care to an *infected* person without wearing appropriate *PPE*.

2.1.6 SHARED EVENT SERVICE SUPPLIERS

Pursuant to Article 6.15.1 of the *COVID-19 Code*, suppliers of shared products or services to all *Competitors* in a *Championship* may specify further mitigation measures (such as creating specific time-slots for interaction with different *Groups*) that must be respected by all *Attendees* using their products or services. A supplier wishing to take advantage of this option at the *Greece event* must communicate these measures to all such users prior to the *Greece event*, copying the *FIA COVID-19 Delegate*, Dr Cem Boneval, cboneval-consultant@fia.com.

In addition, and at the same time as the supplier provides this information to the *COVID-19 Delegate*, the supplier must copy it to *EKO Acropolis Rally COVID-19 Manager* Ms Vasso Spandoni: covid19@acropolisrally.gr, mobile +30 6945 89 79 09.

2.1.7 SERVICE PARK ACCESS

The service park is a *High Density Area* that will be used by multiple teams. In support of *Group* separation, there will be a 2m clear area around each team location. The areas that link teams (supply roads etc) will be used for minimum traffic and will be strictly monitored for *PPE* use.

At the Service Park the entrance of the spectators is allowed, only at their designated area (Low Density), if they are holding a vaccination certificate, or an infection recovery certificate by SARS-CoV-2 virus the past 30 to 180 days. The maximum number of visitors permitted will be 1.000. The spectators will be counted and checked at the entrance. The wearing of a *medical face mask* is mandatory and social distance must always be respected.

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2.1.8 HYGIENE – PPE AND MEDICAL FACE MASKS

Consistent with the provisions of the *COVID-19 Code*.

- The wearing of a *medical face mask* is mandatory
 - at all times in all areas, both indoors and outdoors.
 - when a crew member exits the car unless superseded by a balaclava which covers nose and mouth
- *Medical face masks* may be removed whilst team members are in within their own offices / hospitality units.

2.1.9 TRAVEL BACK TO YOUR COUNTRY

All those departing Greece for a country requiring a negative COVID-19 test must obtain an PCR COVID-19 test, which airlines will verify at the airport. Please check your destination country's entry requirements.

The organiser has arranged for these tests to be carried out at the Service Park Medical Unit of Athens Medical Group (Opening hours: see above). Travellers will receive the result in an email from the laboratory itself.

2.1.10 LOCAL COMPETITORS

Local competitors and crew will also be required to have a **test certificate** of proof of a negative COVID-19 PCR test result within 96 hours of entering the HDA **even if** they are vaccinated or have recovered from SARS CoV-2 virus.

Upon presenting the PCR and/or a certification, the COVID-19 Accreditation Centre shall issue you with a bracelet that grants HDA access. The wristband can only be replaced upon return of the damaged one.

2.2 WRC SPORTING REGULATIONS – CHANGES IN PROCEDURES

2.2.1 STEWARDS

In exceptional circumstances, should any stewards not be present at the start of the event, they must be available and contactable at all times to fulfil their duties.

2.2.2 TYRE MARKING ZONES

Tyre marking will be in High Density area but with no access to teams.

2.2.3 REFUELLING

Crews must wear PPE while in the Refuel zone. A member of the crew will open the vehicle to allow the operative to attach the pipework. The crew will be responsible to indicate to the refueller the amount of fuel required. The crew only shall close the vehicle and secure the opening once they are happy that they have the right amount of fuel added.

2.2.5 SCRUTINEERING

The scrutineering area and the equipment contained therein will be used by multiple *Groups* during the events. The *FIA* will put in place necessary resources to clean all touch surfaces (including equipment) within the scrutineering area between uses by different *Groups*.

- Scrutineering – 1 or max 2 people for Car, (2 if required to remove underbody protection / 1 person for Checking the Equipment / 1 person for sealing Spare Parts). *PPE* is required for all team members entering scrutineering.
- Minimise the number of people entering the Team Area to seal/mark components and where possible work 2m apart – e.g. on opposite sides of the car.
- Joker parts nomination (for eligible WRC/Rally2 cars) to be submitted in advance to wrc-technical@fia.com
- Tyre Marking – Will be in *High Density Area* – but no access to team members, crews to handle spare wheel themselves.
- During an event, Scrutineers will need to enter the team service areas to undertake their duties, they will be required to wear *PPE* whilst in the Team area.

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- At the End of Stage, to show that crews are wearing the correct clothing – please help scrutineers by showing sleeves.
- Post Event Scrutineering – please have a sensible limit on mechanics – aim for maximum 4.

2.2.6 Restart After Retirement / Final Retirement

- a. **WRC Art. 54.1.1:** Confirmation of a final retirement must be communicated by e-mail to mrafael@acropolisrally.gr, but only by the duly authorised competitor’s representative (cf. Art. 2.10 of the Supplementary Regulations).
- b. **WRC Art. 54.1.2:** Competitors who have retired are not required to hand in their time card.
- c. **WRC Art. 55.1.1 (Repairs prior to a re-start):**
 - Priority drivers will not be provided with a time card for the 3-hour repair time after retirement.
 - **P1 drivers:** The rally official in attendance at the allocated bay will keep a check sheet and record the start of the 3-hour service time. The rally official at the entrance to the overnight parc fermé will also keep a check sheet to record the time of the car finishing service and entering the overnight parc fermé.
 - **Other priority drivers:** The rally official in attendance at the control Parc fermé OUT/Service IN will keep a check sheet and record the start of the 3-hour service time. The rally official at the entrance to the overnight parc fermé will also keep a check sheet to record the time of the car finishing service and entering the overnight parc fermé.

2.2.7 Control procedures and time card handling

2.2.8 Recce And Tracking Systems

- SAS will update competitors with a time to collect the units from their base.
- Please respect social distancing and use *PPE* in queueing for collection.
- All units will be cleaned before hand-over but please take all care to clean again on fitment.
- No deposit will be collected for the Rally Safety Tracking equipment, but all damage caused will be invoiced afterwards.
- Please clean units in accordance with SAS instructions before returning units.

2.2.9 Tyre Company

- Tyre company will work within its defined *High Density Area*.
- When delivering or collecting wheels/tyres, please respect social distance and use *PPE*. Please deposit/collect at the agreed time from the agreed point in the Tyre Supplier Area, do not enter the area unless invited.
- Please clean all wheels with soap in the approved cleaning area before depositing with the tyre company and wash wheel/tyre combinations before they re-enter your team service area.

2.2.10 TEAM PERSONNEL AND SERVICE RESTRICTIONS

- Articles 56.2.2 and 63.5.2 of the 2021 FIA WRC Sporting Regulations will not apply in the Tyre Fitting Zones and regroupings on Sunday.

2.3 MEDIA REQUIREMENTS

2.3.1 MEDIA ACCESS

EKO Acropolis Rally's venues are divided into High-Density Areas (HD) or Low-Density Areas (LD), effective from 5 September at 07:00 hrs. All Media are accredited to either of these areas and can only visit to their designated sites and only interact with persons with the same designation.

No access to the HD Area will be granted without the individual accreditation wristband issued by the Organiser. The accreditation is personal and there is no option to grant access to additional guests. Once a media representative leaves the HD area and goes to the Special Stages, or any LD area, they will lose their access to the HD Area, including the Media Centre.

More specifically,

- The Media Centre is High-Density Area. Additionally, a subsidiary Photographers' room (Low-Density) will be allocated opposite the Service Park, at the Chalkiopoulos Sports Hall.
- Media Zones are split into Low and High-Density Areas.
- Special Stages are Low-Density Areas.
- Photo Towers are Low-Density Areas.
- Service Park: the spectators' area is Low-Density Area. Teams Areas are High-Density Areas.
- Syntagma Square, during the running of COSMOTE 5G ATHENS.

In order all Media representatives to get their accreditation, will be required to have;

HD: a negative PCR test no older than 96 hours before their arrival at the Accreditations Office.

LD: based on Greek Government's Covid-19 protocols related to sports events, a certificate of vaccination, OR a proof of recovery, OR an Anti-Gen Test (TRAg) test (24 hours before).

Media Centre and Press Conferences

In the Media Centre, all visitors will be requested to use PPE face masks, until they are sat at their desk. All Press Conferences will be hosted by FIA Zoom with invitations sent to accredited media.

All P1, P2 and P3 drivers, if requested by the FIA Media Delegate or National Press Officer, must be available for media interviews in the Press Conferences room (Media Centre), or/and at the Media Zone, located at the Service Parc entrance.

Medical face masks must be worn at all times and there will be a minimum 1.5m distance between each Driver and other people in the *Low Density Area*.

2.4 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- Each *Stakeholder* to have hand sanitizer available at the entrance to their base.
- Where the Organiser distributes water at the end of a Special Stage, the marshal should wear gloves and offer the bottle, having touched the bottom of the bottle only, allowing the crew to receive holding the cap end.
- All marshals at time controls, at stage starts and at stop controls to wear face masks.

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PRIVACY NOTICE FOR THE PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA IN CONNECTION WITH THE COVID-19 CODE OF CONDUCT

June 2020

What does this Notice cover?

This Notice describes how the Federation International de l'Automobile (the "FIA" "we" or "us") processes personal data about *Attendees* ("you") in connection with the *COVID-19 Code* which is an Appendix to the International Sporting Code available at:

<https://www.fia.com/regulation/category/123>.

In particular, this Notice applies to personal data we process in connection with (i) your attendance at a *Covered Event*; and (ii) testing for Covid-19. The section dealing with testing is only relevant to Profile 1 *Attendees*.

It also describes your data protection rights, including a right to object to some of the processing which we carry out. More information about your rights, and how to exercise them, is set out in the "Your other data protection rights" section.

We act as the data controller for the data processing operations described in this Notice.

We may provide additional information about our privacy practices at other points and where this will help us provide more relevant and timely information.

We reserve the right to make changes to our practices and this Notice at any time. If we change the way we handle your personal data, we will update this Notice and notify you as appropriate.

Unless otherwise specified, defined terms used in this Notice shall have the meaning given to them in the *COVID-19 Code*.

ATTENDANCE AND TESTING

What personal data is processed?

Before each *Covered Event*, we will receive from each applicable *Stakeholder*:

- details of all *Attendees* that it wishes to attend the *Covered Event* on its behalf (including name and designation as a Profile 1 or Profile 2 *Attendee*);
- for Profile 1 *Attendees*, designation of their *Group* and confirmation that they are *Fit to Attend* the *Covered Event*; and
- all other required information as set out in the *COVID-19 Code* (including consents to testing and to the subsequent provision of information about the outcome of the tests (either in the form of test results or in the form of a declaration of *Fit to Attend/Not Fit to Attend*) to the *Stakeholder*) and the Section 3.8 confirmation form.

The Organisers will appoint an *Approved Test Provider* to administer Primary and Secondary Testing for *Attendees* during the Event. The *Approved Test Provider* uses health care professionals to carry out these tests and acts as our data processor in this regard.

As part of the Primary and Secondary Testing, we will process:

- your name, contact details, date of birth and gender;
- your throat & nasal swab or such other bodily sample that the responsible health care professional may specify; and
- the results of your *PCR Test* and the subsequent creation of a declaration of *Fit to Attend/Not Fit to Attend*.

The provision of this information is mandatory if you wish to remain in the *High Density Areas* of the *Venue*.

Our *COVID-19 Delegate* will also receive updates from the *Stakeholder* if during the *Covered Event* or within 14 days at the end of a *Covered Event* any circumstances arise (such as a disclosure by the *Approved Test Provider* relating to you or reports made by you to the applicable *Stakeholder*) that indicate that you may no longer be *Fit to Attend* the *Covered Event(s)*.

Some of this personal data will be health data which is categorized as special category data under the GDPR.

What is our lawful basis for the processing?

We process this personal data for the following purposes:

Where this is necessary for the performance of a contract to which you are a party: this is relevant to your compliance with the *COVID-19 Code*. This includes:

- to protect the health and safety of participants attending Events; and
- to communicate with you;
- As required by us to conduct our business and pursue our legitimate interests, in particular:
- to mitigate the risk of transmission of COVID-19 and to protect public health;
- to plan our services or actions in response to COVID-19;
- to respond to any comments or complaints you may send us;

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- to use data in connection with legal claims, compliance, regulatory and investigative purposes as necessary (including disclosure of such information in connection with legal process or litigation); and
- use of aggregated statistics to improve the efficiency of the testing process.

For purposes which are necessary for preventative medicine on the basis of Union or Member State law or pursuant to a contract with a health professional.

Who will we share this data with, where and when?

In addition to sharing your personal data with our *Approved Test Provider* who will process it on our behalf as data processor for the purposes above, we also arrange for information about your attendance at the Event to be shared with the Event Organiser, and we ask the *Approved Test Provider* to share *Fit to Attend/Not Fit to Attend* results with your applicable *Stakeholder*. In the event that a diagnosis of COVID-19 is confirmed, where required to do so, we will also report this to public health officials.

We process your personal data within the EEA and Switzerland.

How do we protect your personal data?

We have taken appropriate technical and organizational measures to protect your personal data.

Access to any test data is restricted to authorized personnel only who have been trained to protect the confidentiality of people with COVID-19.

When will your personal data be deleted?

Our *Approved Test Provider* will securely destroy your *PCR Test* results and associated personal data 14 days after the test result have been confirmed and the declaration of *Fit to Attend/Not Fit to Attend* communicated to *Stakeholders*.

Where we process other personal data (which is not health data) in connection with compliance with the *COVID-19 Code*, we keep the data for so long as necessary for us to enforce the *COVID-19 Code*.

Your other rights under data protection law

You have the right to **ask us for a copy** of your personal data; to **correct, delete or restrict** (stop any active) processing of your personal data; and to **obtain the personal data you provide to us for a contract or with your consent in a structured, machine readable format**, and to ask us to **share (port) this data to another controller**.

In addition, you can **object to the processing** of your personal data in some circumstances (in particular, where we don't have to process the data to meet a contractual or other legal requirement).

These **rights may be limited**, for example if fulfilling your request would reveal personal data about another person, where they would infringe the rights of a third party (including our rights) or if you ask us to delete information which we are required by law to keep or have compelling legitimate interests in keeping. Relevant exemptions are included in both the GDPR and under applicable Member State law. We will inform you of relevant exemptions we rely upon when responding to any request you make.

To exercise any of these rights, you can get in touch with us – or our data protection officer – using the details set out below.
