1. GENERAL

1.1. This National B / interclub Championship is promoted by Dunfermline Car Club Ltd.

The Championship will be known as the:

THE SCOTTISH TARMACK RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP 2022 Motorsport UK permit number: 2022/012

1.2. The Championship is open to all fully elected members of Car Clubs who are members of the following associations:

Scottish Association of Motor Sports Clubs Association of Northern Ireland Car Clubs Association of North East & Cumbria Car Clubs Association of North Western Car Clubs

- 1.3. A panel of Stewards has been appointed to comply with Motorsport UK rule W.2.2. These are noted in the Championship Officials (section 11) of these regulations.
- 1.4. Registration in Scottish Tarmack Rally Championship does not guarantee entry into the events which count towards the Championship.
- 1.5. All protests, in respect of these regulations must be lodged in accordance with the General Regulations of Motorsport UK.
- 1.6. Championship updates will be published on the official web site www.dunfermlinecarclub.co.uk and emailed to all registered competitors and officials.
- 1.7 Force Majeure; In the event of an extraordinary event or circumstance beyond the control of the organisers, such as a <u>war</u>, <u>strike</u>, <u>riot</u>, crime, <u>epidemic</u>, pandemic or an event described by the legal term <u>act of God</u>, the organisers of the championship reserve the right to make decisions, out with those stated within these regulation, in order safeguard the competitor, event and/or championship.

2. REGISTRATION

- 2.1. Competitors may register as either a "Driver" or a "Co-driver" at any time until the 31st August 2022. To register, each competitor must complete an official Registration Form and return it to the Championship Coordinator accompanied by the registration fee of £15, prior to scoring points.
- 2.2. No points will be awarded retrospectively.
- 2.3. All Drivers and Co-drivers shall register for a vehicle class as defined in Regulation 3.
- 2.4. Registered competitors can switch between Driver and Co-driver or between Classes, if they comply with the following:
 - 2.4.1. Notification must be given to the championship coordinator no less than 24hrs prior to an event.
 - 2.4.2. Points will not be transferred but will be added to their overall points.
 - 2.4.3. Any change will be deemed to be permanent unless further changes are notified.
 - 2.4.4. Failure to comply may result in NO points being awarded for that event.
- 2.5. Competitors should note that information supplied will be held on a computerised data retrieval system ostensibly used for the purpose of sending emails and for forwarding to organisers of events within the championship. However information supplied may be used for other purposes pertaining to the championship.

3. CLASSES

- 3.1. All cars must comply with the 2022 Motorsport UK Regulations.
- 3.2. Drivers and Co-drivers will be allowed to score points in ONE class only on any individual event.
- 3.3. There will be 5 Classes in the Championship as follows defined by engine capacity:

Class 1: Up to 1400cc
Class 2: 1401cc to 1600cc
Class 3: 1601cc to 2000cc
Class 4: 2001cc and above 2WD

Class 5: 2001cc and above and all 4WD

- 3.4. The registered vehicle exact cubic capacity must be declared on the event entry form. Should a competitor wish, it is acceptable to move up 1 class. ie, compete in the class higher than the declared engine size. This decision cannot be reversed for the same vehicle & engine combination. It is not acceptable to compete in a lower sized engine class.
- 3.5. Class points (driver or navigator) are not transferable between classes.
- 3.6. Engines may be over capacity by no more than 50cc over the manufacturer's standard bore capacity without going outwith the cubic capacity class maximum cc.
- 3.7. All vehicles with forced induction and those with rotary engines will have their basic engine capacity increased by the equivalency factor of 1.7 to determine their Class Eligibility.
- 3.8. All vehicles must at all times conform to the relevant Motorsport UK Technical Regulations. See R46-R49.
- 3.9. Metro 6R4's of up to 2800cc (with an Motorsport UK sealed engine) & Stage Rally Cars subject to category 2

- approval may compete in all rounds of the Championship provided that the appropriate documentation has been issued by Motorsport UK.
- 3.10 Drivers and Co-drivers who make false declaration regarding class eligibility will forfeit all relevant class points retrospectively.

4. JUNIOR ELIGIBILITY

4.1. A "Junior" Driver / Co-Driver, is defined as follows:

Will be over 17 and under 25 years of age by the final event of the 2022 championship.

5. PERMITTED FUELS

5.1. Competitors are only permitted to use fuel that conforms to the definitions of Pump Fuels in the 2022 Motorsport UK Yearbook or fuel that complies with FIA Appendix J, Article 252, Art 9.1. No other fuels are permitted. The use of FIA Fuel is not permitted by cars complying with R49.

6. DISPLAY OF CHAMPIONSHIP DECALS

- 6.1. All competitors wishing to receive Championship points must meet the following:
 - 6.1.1. Championship decals <u>must</u> be displayed on each front door panel of the car.
 - 6.1.2. The Championship official sun strip <u>must</u> be displayed on upper part of the front windscreen, unless prior consent received from the Championship Coordinator to reposition to an agreed area on the car.
 - 6.1.3. Championship decals **must** be in position at the start of and for the duration of each Championship round.
- 6.2. Vehicles may be checked to ensure compliance with regulation 6.1. All Championship officials will be deemed judges of fact and may use independent photographic evidence to make their decision.
- 6.3. The Championship Coordinator and / or the Championship Stewards may waive regulations 6.1 should adverse weather or an accident cause these to be removed for the duration of an event.
- 6.4. In the event that points are not awarded or deducted, this will apply to both driver and co-driver.

7. VEHICLE ELIGIBILITY

- 7.1. Championship Eligibility Scrutineer will be as stated in section 11 of these regulations.
- 7.2. Should a car be found ineligible or should a car or part thereof not be presented for an Eligibility Examination as required, Driver and/or Co-driver concerned will incur the following penalty: Be excluded from the Championship results for that event. The Championship Stewards may waive the penalty imposed under this section if they rule that ineligibility is the result of an accident.
- 7.3. Competing vehicles may be subject to an eligibility check at any time.
- 7.4. Post-event Eligibility Scrutineering may also be carried out.

8. POINTS SCORING

8.1. Points will be awarded to registered competitors in each class as follows:

7th in class: 1st in class: 15 points 6 points 2nd in class: 12 points 8th in class: 5 points 9th in class: 3rd in class: 10 points 4 points 4th in class: 9 points 10th in class: 3 points 5th in class: 8 points 11th in class: 2 points 6th in class: 7 points 12th in class: 1 point

- 8.2. All competitors will each be awarded an additional 2 points for starting an event.
- 8.3. Mach1 Stages Rally 2022 is a Double Round Event with points awarded for each day of the 2 day event. Day one points will be awarded in line with these regulations for the final day 1 results. Similarly, points will be awarded for results based upon day 2. Each day of this event will be treated as a separate qualifying round of the championship. To qualify for points for day one the competitor should pass the first & last MTC of the day. To qualify for points on day two the competitor should pass the first & last MTC of the day.
- 8.4. Once registered for the Championship, points will be allocated for every round competed. Should, for any reason, points be deducted, eg, failure to display championship decals, they will be deducted with no effect on other competitors within the class. Any deducted points are shown in brackets, these do not count to towards the competitors overall total.
- 8.5. The lowest scores, including zeros, will be used as dropped scores in the case of a competitor doing more than six rounds.
- 8.6. The Championship will consist of 12 rounds / 11 event (Mach1 2 round event) and the competitors best 7 rounds will count towards the total. If through cancellation, date change or force majeure and event is cancelled, the organisers reserve the right to accept or decline any date change or adjust the number of counting rounds in line with the table below:

- 8.7. Competitors must have started a minimum of 3 rounds to be eligible for overall awards and must have started a least 3 rounds in a single class to be eligible for a class award.
- 8.8. The 2wd & 4wd champion will be determined by totalling the respective points received in the overall championship standings. The counting rounds will be as detailed in item 8.6 of these regulations. The overall Championship winning driver & co-driver do not qualify for this award.
- 8.9. The Single Venue & Route Note champion will be determined by totalling the respective points received in the overall championship standings. As the STRC consists of 8 single venue & 4 route note events, all events will be counted to determine the champion. The overall Championship winning driver & co-driver do not qualify for this award.
- 8.10. In order of fairness and to balance the classes at events additional points will be awarded as follows: 1 point per crew member (to a maximum of 5), per class, per event

Example

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- 8.11. If a competitor feels that there has been an omission or error, the onus is on them **personally** to check and report in writing any anomalies within 7 days of the publication date to the Championship Coordinator. Any disputes will be resolved before the publication of the next update and not at the end of the year.
- 8.12. Any disputes relating to the Championship must first be referred to the Championship Coordinator, who will pass them to the Championship Committee for a decision. If the matter is not resolved to your satisfaction, you have the right of appeal to the Championship Stewards.
- 8.13. Championship results are based on published Final event results of the qualifying events. The Championship has no control over the running of the qualifying events, therefore any queries and event protests must be done as per the Motorsport UK Judicial rules (Section C of the Motorsport UK Blue Book).

9. END OF YEAR TIES

9.1. The winner of any award will be the competitor who scores the highest number of points in the Championship after the deduction of the relevant dropped scores. Should there be a tie, this will be resolved as follows, ALL events will be used during this process:

In favour of the competitor who scored the highest number of class wins.

In favour of the competitor who scored the highest number of 2^{nd} in class......And so on until the highest number of places in class are considered.

If this does not resolve the winner of an award, it will be awarded to the competitor placed highest in the overall standings of the first event in the championship that both competitors compete in.

9.2. If all the above fails to decide a winner, the Championship title will be shared.

10. AWARDS

- 10.1. Championship awards will be presented at the Scottish Tarmack Rally Championship / Dunfermline Car Club Annual Award Ceremony.
- 10.2. End of year awards will be awarded as follows;
