4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The event follows the regulations imposed by Finnish National Sporting Authority (AKK-Motorsport ry, AKK) including the Finnish Sporting Code (FSC), Finnish Rally Regulations (FRR), The Finnish Rally Championship Regulations (FRC) of 2022 and the Supplementary Regulations of 57th Arctic Lapland Rally. The Supplementary Regulations in Finnish have been approved by AKK with competition license number 1/R/22.

This translations of the Supplementary Regulations for 57th Arctic Lapland Rally are informational only and in case of disputes the official Supplementary Regulations in Finnish is authoritative version.

The event follows the regulations by Finnish Center for Integrity in Sports (FINCIS), which can be found at suek.fi, as well all doping related Finnish legislation.

The complete rally route total length is 799,67 km, including 10 special stages with combined length of 222,80 km.

Section 1 takes place on Friday 14/01/2022. Section 1 total length is 318,45 km, including 5 special stages with total combined length of 87,64 km.

Section 2 takes place on Saturday 15/01/2022. Section 2 total length is 481,22 km, including 5 special stages with total combined length of 135,16 km.

The official time of the event the is the Official Finnish Time, which can be found at <https://time.is>. The Virtual Official Noticeboard contains the link to the official time.

If any competitors or persons working for them are met on the non-arterial roads in the regions of Rovaniemi, Tervola, Ranua or Kemijärvi, before their official start time, their participation to the event is prohibited. (Exception: Chapter 10. Reconnaissance).

General COVID-19 instructions for competitors:

- Participate only in good health:
 - If you notice sudden symptoms of a respiratory infection, such as fever, cough, or shortness of breath, always call the local health service first. Do not go to the health center or emergency room to spread the infection and avoid all social contacts. You will receive instructions on how to apply for treatment on the phone.
 - Lapland Central Hospital emergency service, tel. +358 16 322 4800 (24 h)
- Keep a safety distance of 2m or wear a mask always when outside your own car or your own service area.
- Ensure good hand hygiene and use gloves
- We recommend you to always wear the mask at the competition center, Mäntyvaara service building and elsewhere if you are unable to maintain the 2m safety distance to other persons in the area.
- Always wear a mask in any interviews.
- Effort has been made to eliminate encounters between competition officials and competitors. Only one person should visit the Rally Office when retrieving competition and other material.
- Competitors must maintain the 2m safety distance or wear a mask in their encounters during the competition if the safety distance cannot be maintained.

6. ENTRY PROCEDURE

All license holders wanting to take part in the event must fill in an entry form at the event website arcticrally.fi before 03/01/2021 at 22.00.

If there are any issues to make your entry via the digital form, you can ask assistance from the Secretary of the Rally.

Note that you may need the approval of your own National Sporting Authority (ASN) to take part in a national event outside your origin country.

The maximum number of entrants is fixed at 220 cars. In case of more than the maximum entries, competitors in classes 1-6 are prioritized.

Use of competitor information by the organizer

By entering the competition, the competitor accepts the processing of personal data provided by the organizer and the publication and inclusion of specified personal information (name, club, etc.) in the entry list, results list, etc. in all organizer's communications and registers. The organizer also reserves the right to disclose relevant published information to use by third parties.

Checks are not accepted. Please NOTE that the we recommend payment through a bank and all expenses shall be covered by the competitor.

Organisers have liability insurance included in the ASN visa and insurance for their officials. Organiser will also issue a third party insurance for the duration of special stages for cars register abroad.

All registration documents must be kept with the car at all times.

8. SERVICE

COVID-19 instructions:

- Keep a safety distance of 2m or wear a mask always when outside your own car or service area.
- Ensure good hand hygiene and use gloves
- We recommend you to always wear the mask at the competition center, Mäntyvaara service building and elsewhere if you are unable to maintain the 2m safety distance to other persons in the area.
- Always wear a mask in any interviews.

All service operations and functions must be carried out in accordance with "Chapter 14. Service" in Finnish Rally Championship Series' Regulations of 2022 with the following additions.

The event Service Park is located at the Mäntyvaara horse racing track, which open for competitors on Thursday 13/01/2022 at 08:00.

The rally includes four service breaks at the Mäntyvaara Service Park and three Tyre and Light Fitting zones (once at Vanttauskoski, twice at Heinuvaara).

In addition to requirements in the Finnish Rally Championship Regulations, competitors are responsible to protect the ground with a liquid impermeable Environmental Mat under all service vehicles during their full stay at the Service Park. The impermeable Environmental Mat must cover the whole surface area underneath the vehicle's engine. **Impermeable Environmental Mat must also be placed under any external electricity generators, heaters and other fuel containing receptacles.**

SPA and SPD Service A and D are Flexi Services

When arriving at these services' Regrouping In TC, competitors will be given a Service Out time. The time includes 3 minutes for technical inspection (scrutineering), regrouping time and a service time of 30 minutes. The competitors may start the service at a time of their choosing by marking the start time on their timecard and placing the timecard visibly on the windscreen and outside the service tent on an A4 board / cardboard / paper so that the time is clearly visible from the service road. No changes or markings can be made to the timecard until the end of the service time, which must be marked on the timecard. The service time is monitored by the organizer with a round trip inspection, the inspectors must have an unobstructed access to the service area and there must be an unobstructed line of sight to the serviced rally car from outside the maintenance tent.

SPB Service B is a Flexi Service

After the STOP TC following SS 5 Mäntyvaara 2, competitors drive to the Service B via the TC 5a. The competitors may start the service at a time of their choosing by marking the start time on their timecard and placing the timecard visibly on the windscreen and outside the service tent on an A4 board / cardboard / paper so that the time is clearly visible from the service road. No changes or markings can be made to the timecard until the end of the service time, which must be marked on the timecard. The service time is monitored by the organizer with a round trip inspection, the inspectors must have an unobstructed access to the service area and there must be an unobstructed line of sight to the serviced rally car from outside the maintenance tent.

The service time is 30 minutes and the car must be serviced before the TC 5b (Service OUT) closes at 24:00. Arriving at the TC 5b after 24:00 will be considered a late arrival regardless of the service time used and the Finnish Rally Regulations art 20.4 will be active.

TC 5b and TC 5c are a Permitted Early Check-In Time Controls so it is not mandatory to use all of service time.

After SPB Service B and before the to morning's SPB Service C it is allowed for a competitor's representative (person other than marked on the Start List) to drive the car to and from the Sampo-Center Parc Fermé (TC 5b – TC 5c - SPC).

SPB Service C

Cars are allowed to be removed from the Parc Fermé 90 minutes before the competitor's start time for Section 2. The 90 minutes is reserved for the liaison back to Mäntyvaara Service Park and the service there. Competitors must inform the Rally Office, using a form provided as part of the Competition Materials, of their authorized representative who will collect the car.

Classes 1-7: Tyre and Light Fitting Zones

Friday 14/01/2022 at Vanntauskoski between SS 3 and SS 4.

Saturday 15/01/2022 at Heinuvaara between SS 8 and SS 9 as well as between SS 9 and SS 10.

Service crew and arrive at the tyre and light fitting zones about 10 minutes before the arrival of the competitor.

In addition to the requirements of the Finnish Rally Championship Regulations, all service vehicles shall be fitted with a liquid impermeable protective cover of the size of its engine compartment while in the service area. There shall also be a liquid impermeable cover under the external aggregate, heaters and other fuel containing receptacles.

In addition to requirements in the Finnish Rally Championship Regulations, competitors are responsible to protect the ground with a liquid impermeable Environmental Mat under all service vehicles during their full stay at the Service Park. The impermeable Environmental Mat must cover the whole surface area underneath the vehicle's engine. **Impermeable Environmental Mat must also be placed under any external electricity generators, heaters and other fuel containing receptacles.**

Classes 8–22: Tyre and Light Fitting Zones also function as remote service areas

Tyre and Light Fitting Zones described in competition materials also function as remote service areas for classes 8-22.

Competitor's service crew is allowed to bring one service vehicle to the area. Maximum length for the service vehicle is 8 meters.

Sanctions for infringements in service areas, remote services, refuelling areas and tyre and light fitting zones:

1st infringement: 250 €

2nd infringement: 500 €

3rd infringement: Disqualification applied by the Clerk of the Course

For classes 1-7 any servicing at Tyre and Light Fitting Zones outside the allowed actions in Finnish Rally Championship Regulations art. 14.8 and 14.9 results in disqualification in accordance with Finnish Rally Regulations art. 17. External assistance results in disqualification.

9. TYRES

Classes 1-7

It is permitted to use 14 tyres that comply with Finnish Rally Championship Regulations of 2022, Chapter 16 Tire Regulations. In Classes 1-7 competitors must submit a list of barcode numbers for the tyres according to the following schedule:

- Tyres for Section 1: Submitted by Thursday 13/1/2021 at 21.00
- Tyres for Section 2: Submitted by Friday 14/1/2021 at 24.00

The information is submitted using a digital form to which a link is provided at the Virtual Official Noticeboard.

Barcode numbers must be available for reading on the outside facing side of tyres. Scrutineer officers must be allowed to do markings to tires and rims. In case competitor do not have FIA barcodes on tires, organizer will give alternative instructions. If you don't have barcodes you shall report it to the Rally Office or to the Chief Scrutineer at the latest the day before the pre-event scrutineering.

Classes 8-22

It is allowed to use Tyres according to Finnish Sporting Code 2022 Appendix J Art. 6.1.2 Studded tires or previous year's Finnish Rally Regulations Appendix J Art. 6.1.2 Studded tires ("old rule" with 16 inch tires).

In Historic cars, the rim size according to the car classification and / or Appendix K. Tires do not have to be homologated and can comply with the so-called "old rule".

All Classes

Between SPB – SPC road homologated winter tyres are allowed. These tyres are not counted in the number of tyres allowed.

10. REFUEL ZONES

COVID-19 instructions

- Competitors and service crew must maintain a safety distance of 2m or if the safety distance cannot be maintained, wear a mask in encounters with other competitors and their service crew

Refuelling is only allowed at petrol stations as determined by the Organiser, according to Art. 15. in the Finnish Rally Championship Regulations of 2022 and at supplementary refuel zones as described in the competition materials.

Competitors must use their own fuel permitted to their class at refuelling zones in Mäntyvaara, Heinuvaara and Narkaus as well as at Suukosken keidas. Visiting refuelling zones is optional. On the liaison sections it is allowed to refuel using pumps or your own allowed petrol at Teboil Erottaja, Shell Erottaja, Shell Alakorkalo and Neste K Rovaniemi Reissumies petrol stations in Rovaniemi and at SEO petrol station in Vanttauskoski.

The competitor shall indicate which refuelling method he wishes to use in the event entry form. Refuelling takes place either from the petrol station pump, or from competitor's own containers in the marked refuelling zones. Refuel Zones are listed in the itinerary, including distances and calculated consumption. Itinerary as appendix.

11. ADMINISTRATIVE CHECKS

Competitors must provide all Administrative Documents to the Organizer using the provided digital tools by Wednesday 05/01/2022 at 23.59. Documents not available at the time must be provided as soon as possible. Administrative Checks will be made based on the digitally provided documents and information before opening of the Rally Office.

The organizer will confirm acceptance of provided Administrative Document to the competitor. The competitors must however keep all required documents available in the vehicle during the competition.

12. RECONNAISSANCE, CLASSES 1 – 19

COVID-19 instructions:

- Arrive only in good health
- Wear a mask, maintain a good hand hygiene, and use hand sanitizer
- Maintain the 2m safety distance

Reconnaissance material can be collected at the Rally Office starting on Sunday 09/01/2022 at 16:00.

Competitors must provide the organizer with the following information regarding the reconnaissance by 05/01/2022 using the digital forms provided at the event website: Reconnaissance car details, phone number and accommodation details. The competitor must also provide the organizer with a phone number that can be used to reach him at any time.

Due to COVID-19 the competitors must provide the organizer contact details to all persons in their Team at the event region using the digital forms provided at the event website.

Reconnaissance identification numbers (3) must be attached to the used car (windscreen top centre, right rear side window and rear window) and kept visible for the whole duration of the reconnaissance.

A maximum speed limit of 80 km/h is in place during the whole reconnaissance on all special stages, unless a lower limit is indicated by traffic signs or signs placed by the organiser. The competitor must drive in a manner that does not endanger or inconvenience other traffic or people living near the stages. Driving against the direction of the rally is prohibited, unless directed so by the organiser, their representative or the police. The organizer will control speeds used as well as the manner of driving during reconnaissance. Also the police will make checks along the route and will penalise for traffic infringements according to Finnish Traffic Law.

Any stopping request by the organizers representatives with the organizers' identifiers must be followed, under penalty of disqualification from the event.

Any infringements during reconnaissance will be punished in accordance with Section 9.1 of the Finnish Rally Championship Regulations of 2022.

Reconnaissance cars

Only road homologated tyres are allowed during reconnaissance. In the reconnaissance car, there must be warm overalls for drivers, a snow shovel, a first aid kit, a tow rope and a reflecting triangle to be used for warning following cars in case of road blockage.

Reconnaissance starts on Monday 10/01/2022 at 08.00 and will end on Thursday 13/01/ at 18.00.

Special Stages with reconnaissance exceptions

- **Special Stages 1, 2, 5 and 7: Reconnaissance only on Thursday 13/01/2022 during 8:00-18:00.**

Organizer will inform about conditions on the route on the Virtual Official Noticeboard.

13. COMPETITION NUMBERS AND ADVERTISING

Advertisement on the competition number: Scandic Pohjanhovi

Competitors must reserve advertising spaces on the rally cars and overalls according to the Finnish Rally Championship Regulations of 2022.

Competition number sticker with organiser ads: 67x20 cm on doors (Pic 1) and 22x42 cm on bonnet (Pic 2).

Competition number stickers on doors must be placed so that the competition number is towards the front of the car.

To facilitate traffic control, one additional competitor number should be placed on the windscreen right up under the area reserved for advertising.

14. PRE-EVENT SCRUTINEERING

Scrutineering follows the Finnish Rally Championship Regulations of 2022 Art. 10.1 Pre-event scrutineering and Art 10.2 Sealing and marking.

ONLY ROAD HOMOLOGATED TYRES ARE ALLOWED IN SCRUTINEERING.

- Cars with a pop-off valve must arrive with two competitor's representatives, for other cars two representatives are allowed.
- Scrutineering is organized into two separate inspection lines. Competitors on the different lines do not meet.
- New seals are provided for cars with turbochargers as part of the competition materials.
 - Instructions for preparing the sealing are published among the digital competition materials
 - Sealing must be prepared by the competitor
- Sealing of turbochargers and FIA pop-off valves takes place at the same time
- The drivers do not need to personally attend the pre-event scrutineering
- Competitors' and car's documents will be checked from the digitally provided materials
- The competitor submits scanned documents digitally according to instructions at the event website
- The organizer confirms accepted documents
- The competitor must have the required documents available at the scrutineering
- The competitors and their representatives must act at the scrutineering according to organizer's instructions
- Competitors are not given a scrutineering card. Instead, the documentation is sent digitally to the competitor.

Scrutineering time reservations

Each competitor must go to the "Slotti" reservation system at rallism.fi (link can be found below the main picture SCRUTINEERING TIMES), and reserve any time shown which he thinks to best suit himself. Reservation must be done either for a basic scrutineering or turbo scrutineering, and all required information must be filled in the website form. Basic scrutineering is for cars with no turbocharger. The reservations are open from the 07/01/2022 at 08.00 and will be closed on 10/01/2022 at 20:00. If requested by competitor or his representative, the reservation can be done by the Rally Office officials, during the time the reservations are open. The request must be made by telephone or electronically.

If the competitor has not made the reservation on time, this will result in a penalty fee of 50€, payable in the rally office at the latest 1 h 30 min before the competitor's given start time.

Any lateness from reporting to the scrutineering will result in a penalty fee of 50€, payable in the rally office at the latest 1 h 30 min before the competitor's given start time. Negligence to pay the fee will result in disqualification from the event by Clerk of the Course's decision.

Only the installed turbocharger and FIA pop-off valve of the car will be inspected at the pre-event scrutineering.

The sealing of any spare turbochargers or FIA pop-off valves will be done on Friday 14/01/2022 from 08:00 to 12:00 in the restaurant building at Mäntyvaara Service Park.

Replacing a sealed part during the event

Competitor must contact the Chief Scrutineer before commencing replacement work on sealed parts.

Protest against car's technology

Should a driver wish to submit a protest against another competitor's car, this must be done by phone to the number given in the road book by the organizer, before arrival of the car in question at the final Time Control at the end of the rally.

After this, the car will be under scrutineer's control. The organizer must verify the identity of the submitter of the protest. All protests made against any car during the rally, must be verified in writing at the latest when the submitted arrives at the final time control.

15. SHAKEDOWN STAGE

The Shakedown Stage Vennivaara will be available near the Mäntyvaara Service Park on Thursday 13/01/2022 from 13:00 to 20:00. Use of the Shakedown is included in the Entry Free. Stage map and Road Book pages are included in the event Road Book and are also available on the Virtual Official Noticeboard. Timing will not be provided for the Shakedown.

16. COMPETITION MATERIALS

Classes 1–19

Competition material can be collected at the Rally Office starting on Sunday 09/01/2022 at 16:00.

Each crew will receive one road book describing the rally route in detail and two route maps. The GPS Safety Tracking devices will be distributed at the pre-event scrutineering and the timing transponders at the waiting area preceding the start of the rally, before TC 0.

Classes 20–22

Competition material can be collected at the Rally Office on Friday 14/01/2022 one hour before the competitor's official start time.

Each crew will receive one road book describing the rally route in detail and two route maps. The GPS Safety Tracking devices will be distributed at the pre-event scrutineering and the timing transponders at the waiting area preceding the start of the rally, before TC 0.

All classes

Competitors must have both the timing transponder and the GPS Safety Tracker in the car and operational during the competition. The competitor must attach the equipment to the car according to the instructions before the start of the rally. The timing transponders will be collected back from the competitors for charging at Parc Fermé on Friday and will be given back on Saturday when leaving Parc Fermé for reinstallation. Both the timing transponder and the GPS Safety Tracker will be collected from the competitors at final Time Control.

17. COURSE OF THE RALLY

The driver or co-driver must have a GSM phone powered on in the rally car in case of an accident. Phone number must be provided to the Rally Office before start using the digital form at the event website.

Competitors' start times will be published on the Virtual Official Noticeboard according to the Rally Programme.

The first competitor starts the rally from the Lordi Square in Rovaniemi City Centre on Friday 14/01/2022 at 11:00. There is no Parc Fermé at the start, but the organizer recommends the competitors to arrive at the waiting area preceding TC0 at earliest 30 minutes and at the latest 10 minutes before their official start time.

The Clerk of the Course will set a starting interval between classes 1-8 due to safety reasons. The interval may change during the event.

The competitor must arrive to the Start TC (TC 0) during the minute before their official start time. They will then move to the starting platform.

COVID-19 related exceptions to using the timecard (Exception to Finnish Rally Regulations Art. 14.5 Timecard)

- In order maintain a safety distance between competitors and officials and to avoid paper transfers, timecards have been placed in the road book. Timecards are intended for the competitors' own use and may and should be marked by the competitors.
- At Time Controls, competitors do need to not open windows or hatches for officials, but show a willingness to record handing out a timecard to an official by placing the card against the window or by making a handout gesture. The clerks nod as a sign of their observation and record the time on a large timecard corresponding to the competitor's timecard and present the time to the competitors who mark the corresponding time / times on their timecard.
- If a competitor encounters a need for a change request against a timecard entry, a request must be made as follows:

Section 2

Start list for Section 2 will be published on Virtual Official Notice Board according to the Rally Programme. Starting order for Section 2 will be according to the Finnish Rally Championship Regulations of 2022 Art. 12.

Competitors will start Section 2 at the Mäntyvaara Service Park exit Time Control (TC5d).

Re-start after retirement

Competitors who have retired before the end of Section 1, may re-start for Section 2. The competitor must inform the Rally Office about his intention to do so no later than 14/01/2022 at 22:30. For every special stage missed, the competitor will be given time according to Finnish Rally Championship Regulation of 2022 Art. 13.3.

Retired competitor, who will start for Section 2, must scrutineer the car in Parc Fermé on Saturday 15/01/2021 at 06.00. The competitor or the competitor's representative does not have to be present at the scrutineering, but the doors to the rally car must be unlocked. Only cars which have passed scrutineering will be given permission to start Section 2.

Rally Route

The event uses international regulations on route signs, itinerary and timecard. The due time given in the timecard is added to the actual start time of the special stage, which gives the arrival time to the following time control. The due time includes the special stage time and the following liaison section. If the competitor arrives at any other time control than the start of a special stage, the arrival time will also be the time of departure from the time control, unless a different time is given by the time control officials. Instructions on the use of the timecard can be found at the Rally Guide and the Road Book.

Route given in the Road Book must be followed on the liaison sections, under penalty of exclusion by the Clerk of the Course.

Each car must carry one snow shovel, first aid kit, warm clothes and two reflective triangles. The co-driver can use non-FIA approved shoes.

Permitted Early Check-In at Time Controls

The crews may report before their due time at the following Time Controls without incurring a penalty: TC 5b and TC 5c

Speeding during the event

Speeding on a liaison section measured by the police or the organizer during the event will be penalized in according Art. 9.2 Speed violation of the Finnish Rally Championship Regulations of 2022.

18. REGROUPS

The event includes two Regroups, both at Mäntyvaara, as described in the Itinerary as appendix.

19. RESULTS

The official classification is calculated for classes 1-22 by calculating together the times from the special stages in both Section 1 and 2 and the other given time penalties. Prizes will be awarded based on these results.

Provisional final classification will be published according to the event programme on the Virtual Official Noticeboard, followed by the official classification both on the VONB and the event website at arcticrally.fi.

20. PRIZES AND PRIZE-GIVING

Prizes will be trophies and utility items.

Number of awarded drives will be published on the Virtual Official Noticeboard.

Both drivers will be awarded at the Ceremonial Finnish on Saturday 15th January 2022.
