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






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Importance of National Logistics Working Groups (NLWGs)

- National Logistics Working Groups (NLWGs) have been demonstrably instrumental as a leadership and governance platform for improving immunization supply chain (ISC) management, decisionmaking, and accountability at the national level in countries.
- NLWGs are defined as leadership groups and aim to improve coordination among partners in the implementation of national immunization supply chain priorities.
- These working groups are typically part of the Ministry of Health's process to strengthen immunization supply chains with the objective of achieving continuous improvement in vaccine efficacy, availability, and supply chain efficiency/resilience.
- During the challenging moments of COVID-19 pandemic, the role of the NLWG as a leadership and coordination platform has been made more apparent as countries were trying to coordinate their ISC efforts and maintain ISC operations and services.

NLWGs typically serve 3 main roles for ISC leadership and governance in countries

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The effect of COVID-19 on Immunization Supply Chain coordination in Countries

- The COVID pandemic caused a significant strain on the immunization supply chain due to logistics disruption and limitations resulting from physical distancing, overstretched workforces, flight cancellations and trade restrictions.
- Immunization programmes in countries recorded modified scheduled immunization sessions as well variable vaccine demand and supply, a serious concern in countries battling outbreaks of measles, cholera and polio while responding to COVID-19 cases.
- The WHO/UNICEF joint statement on maintaining routine immunization during COVID-19 highlighted the need to sustain immunization services during this pandemic.

- Sustain ISC program management and coordination through development and implementation of a
 continuity plan which includes mechanisms to enhance coordination of actions, without duplication, across all
 partners to support maintenance of essential ISC operations, and gradual resumption of full operations as
 soon as the public health situation with COVID-19 permits.
 - Maintain oversight and provide guidance on immunization supply for routine immunization and supplemental immunization activities in line with the current public health situation with COVID-19.
 - Ensure protection of health, supply and logistics workforce as part of infection prevention and control
 measures.
- Provide guidance ensuring adequate capacity (part- or full-time, depending on context) to manage, implement and regularly review the continuity plan for ISC activities.
- Review and revise immunization supply chain (ISC) workplan to accommodate disruptions and changes caused by the pandemic response.
- Advocate with the national authorities to include basic iSC tasks (regular reporting, cold chain maintenance, vaccines stock management activities) as essential services to be maintained during the response to COVID19 outbreak.
- Utilize remote and collaborative working tools to monitor the various workstreams and facilitate real-time communication.

NLWGs can support ISC leadership and governance during the pandemic in various ways...(2)

Role **Activities** 2 Plan for the resumption of and sustenance of immunization activities as soon as the COVID-19 situation allows by outlining activities that will be followed and the different scenarios that may play out. **ISC** planning Develop plans and budgets for resumption of outreach sessions, vaccination campaigns and new vaccine introductions (where applicable), during the pandemic. Plan for the procurement and mass distribution of the COVID vaccine when it becomes available. Leverage on ISC partnerships to address challenges in supply and logistics towards possible 3 integration of immunization supply chain with that of other health commodities post-COVID-19 accordingly to relevant policies. ISC Track and amplify ongoing support provided by member organizations represented in the NLWG, partnerships ICC and NITAG for COVID-19 response. Leverage cooperation with other non-immunization development partners and the private sector during the COVID-19 response, to pitch for their inclusion into the NLWG.



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NLWGs in COVID response: Lesson Learned in Countries

Selected countries: DRC, Cameroun, Madagascar, Kenya, Ethiopia, Nigeria and Afghanistan

- Coordination: Country leadership and coordination for routine and emergency supplies using in-country data and digital collaboration platform among government and development partners
- Capacity building: Training, supportive supervision and Infection prevention and control (IPC) for staff

 Behavioural Change Communication (BCC): Social mobilization among in-country partners to drive demand for immunization services
- Planning: Forecasting, supply planning and stock management for routine immunization, campaigns, catch-up vaccination in line with revised annual immunization plan.
