IMPORTANT POINTS

1. An eligible applicant for the session 2026-27 must familiarize with the contents of this Bulletin of Information.
2. Changes made in any Program after the release of this Bulletin shall become effective from the date it is posted on www.admission.uod.ac.in and <https://fmsc.du.ac.in/> ⇒ Courses ⇒ Undergraduate Courses ⇒ BAMS/BUMS/BHMS.
3. University reserves the right to revise, amend, update, or delete any part of this Bulletin, Ordinances, Rules and Regulations at its discretion as and when considered necessary.
4. The candidates are requested to visit the website www.admission.uod.ac.in and <https://fmsc.du.ac.in/> ⇒ Courses ⇒ Undergraduate Courses ⇒ BAMS/BUMS/BHMS regularly for updated information.
5. All admissions are provisional and shall be confirmed subject to verification of documents & fulfillment of the requirements for the eligibility of the candidate concerned.
6. The Counselling for allotment of seats under All India Quota (15%) will be conducted by AACCC, Ministry of AYUSH, Govt. of India and under Delhi Quota (85%) will be conducted by the University of Delhi.
7. It is assumed that every participating candidate of NEET-UG Counseling has read, agreed, and accepted the Scheme and terms & conditions of the NEET -UG counseling-2026.
8. The candidate shall fill out the application form online (www.admission.uod.ac.in), preferably on their own, for UG Counseling-2026. Application submitted through any other mode shall be summarily rejected.
9. While registering on the Admission portal of the University, all candidates are advised to use the same mobile number/e-mail ID they submitted during registration for the NEET (UG)-2026 examination.
10. The candidate should ensure that all the information filled in during the online registration/application form is correct and factual. The University of Delhi shall not entertain, under any circumstances, any request to change/modify/edit/alter the information provided by the candidates.
11. Candidates can submit the UG counseling registration/application form only once. Candidates who submit more than one registration/application form shall be debarred, and further action as deemed appropriate by the University of Delhi shall be taken.
12. The Admission Authority will cancel the admission of the candidate who provided wrong information during registration and fails to produce the required original documents at the time of admission. If it is discovered at any stage that a candidate has used a false/fake/incorrect document at the time of admission, then such candidate shall be excluded from all admission processes and in case, such candidate has already been given admission, the admission shall stand cancelled.
13. The conversion of the vacant seats under Delhi Quota will be done during the Stray Vacancy Round (SVR) of counseling as per the algorithm of the University of Delhi Rules.
14. Candidate may kindly note that merely registering on the Admission Portal of the University for UG Counseling-2026 does not confer automatic rights to secure admission in the Undergraduate [BAMS/BUMS/BHMS] programs.



15. The medium of instruction and examination for BAMS program shall be Sanskrit, Hindi or English. Provided that, in case, if any institute is admitting candidate from different states or International candidates, the medium of instruction shall be English.
16. The medium of instruction and examination for BUMS program shall be Urdu or Hindi or any recognized regional language or English. Provided that, in case, if any institute is admitting candidate from different states or International candidates, the medium of instruction shall be English.
17. The medium of instruction and examination for BHMS Program shall be English.
18. Registration fee from the Foreign Nationals seeking admission to an undergraduate (BAMS/ BUMS/BHMS) program of studies will be charged as per norms of the University of Delhi.
19. In case any candidate admitted in BAMS/BUMS/BHMS Programs remains absent from his/her class for 30 days continuously without information, the concerned Institute may issue show cause notice to the concerned candidate for his/her unauthorized absence and name of such candidate shall be struck off from the rolls of the college following laid down procedure and the concerned candidate should be intimated in this regard. The fees of such candidate shall be forfeited.
20. **Inter University Migration in BAMS/BUMS/BHMS programs under the Faculty of Ayurvedic & Unani Medicines and Faculty of Homoeopathy Medicines is not allowed under any circumstances.**
21. The selected candidates for admission to BAMS/BUMS/BHMS program may be admitted provisionally subject to submission of Medical fitness certificate (**Annexures**) and verification of documents.
22. The candidate should certify whether they belong to OBC/SC/ST/PwBD/EWS Category. However, the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes available at their website of the admission (<http://ncbc.nic.in/backward-classes/index.html>).
 - Non-creamy layer certificate in the name of the candidate issued on or after 01/04/2026 and OBC caste certificate as per the Central list for OBC's shall be required at the time of registration. Refer to **Annexures** for the format of the certificate.
 - EWS Certificate (in the name of the candidate) from the competent issuing authority certifying the candidate can claim reservation under this category. The name of the candidate claiming reservation under this category must match with the name that appears on his/her corresponding School Board qualifying certificate; similarly, his/her parents' names must match in both sets of certificates. Income certificate must be issued after on or after 01/04/2026. Refer to **Annexures** for the format of the certificate.
23. All the candidates are required to produce their original certificates at the time of depositing fee which will be kept in the office of the concerned college and will not be returned back in any case.
24. As per Academic Council's Resolution No. 14 (ii) dated 17th May 1987:
"Out of the total number of seats, the first 15% of the seats shall be kept for the candidates from all over India who have passed the prescribed qualifying examination from an Indian University/Board and the remaining 85% seats be filled with the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination from Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE)/Council for the Indian School Certificate Examination/Jamia Milia Islamia (12 years program) from the recognized school conducting regular classes situated within the National Capital Territory of Delhi." **The Percentages of two categories will be interchangeable.**



25. The seats under these categories will be filled in order of merit based on the performance in the NEET examination.
26. Closure of admissions as per directions received from Ministry of AYUSH.
27. Candidates must have passed in all the required subjects separately (in Theory and Practical) in class 12th examination for admission to BAMS/BUMS/BHMS Programs.
28. Candidates who have appeared in the class 12th Examination this year i.e. 2026 and have been placed under Compartment or are to re-appear for improvement will not be eligible (in case result have been declared, such candidates may apply).
29. In case the information furnished or certificates etc. submitted are found to be false, or the candidate is found to have withheld or concealed information in their Application form their name shall be removed from the college rolls and fees deposited by him/her shall be forfeited.
30. Once application form is submitted no alteration will be allowed thereafter.
31. The candidates before filling in the form shall satisfy their eligibility. The candidate is required to go through the Bulletin of Information carefully and acquaint themselves with all requirements with regard to the filling of the Application Form.
32. Application Form should be filled in by the candidate in English.
33. Incomplete Application form for Admission to BAMS/BUMS/BHMS Programs will summarily be rejected.
34. Candidates appearing in rounds of counseling and offered admission in that round must carry their original certificates in person and they will have No Right to surrender their seats once accepted and NO extension of time for joining will be granted.
35. If any seat(s) remains vacant in 85% Delhi Quota due to non-availability of the eligible candidates, these seats may be filled up by the eligible candidates belonging to 15% All India Quota and vice-versa.
36. The entire admission process for UG Programs is online, only through admission portal (<https://ugadmission.uod.ac.in>), this includes uploading of documents, payment of fee, option for upgrade, withdrawal of admission etc. University of Delhi will not entertain any request related to admissions/withdrawals/corrections sent by the candidate through Post/Fax/WhatsApp/E-mail/by Hand/ Phone calls.

2. PROGRAM STRUCTURE

Duration of BAMS/BUMS/BHMS Programs:

- The duration of BAMS, BUMS and BHMS Programs is five and half year (including Internship Training of 12 months).
- The students are required to complete 12 months Compulsory Rotatory Internship Training for BAMS, BUMS and BHMS Programs before the award of the degree.
- The student should join the Internship within 30 days of the declaration of the final year's result and the Internship must be completed within 24 months from the date of passing the qualifying examination of BAMS, BUMS and BHMS.

Span Period:

- Maximum of 10 (ten) years from the date of admission in the 1st Professional BAMS, BUMS program (excluding internship training period).
- Maximum of 10 (ten) years from the date of admission in the 1st Professional BHMS program (including internship training period).

The programs of Ayurvedacharya (BAMS) & Kamil-e-Tib-O-Jarahat (BUMS) are conducted at Ayurvedic & Unani Tibbia College, Karol Bagh, New Delhi. The applicant nominated by the Government of India must fulfill the minimum eligibility requirement prescribed for admission to the respective programs and their application forms duly completed in all respect will be received by the College/ University within prescribed date for admission through the Government of India.

- (i) 02 (Two) seats are reserved for Foreign Nationals in each BAMS/BUMS Programs in A&U Tibbia College.
- (ii) The Ministry of Ayush, Govt. of India vide letter no.F.No.Y-18011/2024-EP(III) dated 28.05.2024 issued instructions and guidelines for Central Nominations to Bachelor in Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery (BAMS), Bachelor in Unani Medicine and Surgery (BUMS) and Bachelor in Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (BHMS) Programs and as per letter no. Y-18011/2024-EP(III), dated 15.05.2025 the same shall be applicable for the current academic session i.e. 2026-27 and shall be remain valid for subsequent years unless modified and amendment.
- (iii) **The concerned college may take necessary action pertaining to admission in the UG Programs (BAMS/BUMS) under NGOI Quota (Central Pool Scheme) as per the relevant guidelines and verification of the details of the Nodal Officer of the respective state from the Ministry of AYUSH.**
- (iv) The applicant nominated by the Government of India must fulfill the minimum eligibility requirement prescribed for admission to the respective programs and their application forms duly completed in all respect will be received by the concerned college within prescribed date for admission through the Government of India. The candidate should apply directly to the Secretary, Govt. of India, Ministry of Ayush, INA, New Delhi.
- (v) The University/College will not entertain any application form directly under Govt. of India Nominees Quota and Foreign National.
- (vi) The eligibility conditions for admission to BAMS/BUMS program may be revised in the light of NCISM/Ministry of AYUSH, GOI/University Notification/amendment/University.

- (i) The Ministry of Ayush, Govt. of India vide letter no.F.No.Y-18011/2024-EP(III) dated 28.05.2024 issued instructions and guidelines for Central Nominations to Bachelor in Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery (BAMS), Bachelor in Unani Medicine and Surgery (BUMS) and Bachelor in Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (BHMS) Programs and as per letter no. Y-18011/2024-EP(III), dated 15.05.2026 the same shall be applicable for the current academic session i.e. 2026-27 and shall be remain valid for subsequent years unless modified and amendment.
- (ii) **The concerned college may take necessary action pertaining to admission in the UG Programs (BHMS) under NGOI Quota (Central Pool Scheme) as per the relevant guidelines and verification of the details of the Nodal Officer of the respective state from the Ministry of AYUSH.**
- (iii) The applicant nominated by the Government of India must fulfill the minimum eligibility requirement prescribed for admission to the respective programs and their application forms duly completed in all respect will be received by the concerned college within prescribed date for admission through the Government of India. The candidate should apply directly to the Secretary, Ministry of Ayush, Govt. of India.
- (iv) The University/College will not entertain any application form directly under Govt. of India Nominees Quota and Foreign National.
- (v) The concerned college may take necessary action pertaining to admission in BHMS under NGOI Quota (Central Pool Scheme) as per the relevant guidelines and verification of the details of the Nodal Officer of the respective state from the Ministry of AYUSH.
- (vi) The eligibility conditions for admission to BHMS program may be revised in the light of NCH/Ministry of AYUSH, GOI/University Notification/amendment/University.

4. MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY

Eligibility Conditions for admission to BAMS, BUMS and BHMS programs for the academic session 2026-27:

Age: The applicant should have completed the age of 17 (seventeen) years on or before 31st December, 2026. As per the Ministry of Ayush letter No. L-14030/70/2022-EP-I dated 14.07.2022 there is no upper age limit for admission in ASU&H undergraduate programs from session 2022-23 onwards in compliance with the judgment order dated 19.04.2022 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

Qualifying Examination: In order to be eligible for admission to BAMS, BUMS and BHMS programs for a particular academic year, **it shall be necessary for an applicant to qualify the NEET-2026 exam and to obtain minimum of marks 50 percentile in National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test (NEET-2026) conducted by CBSE for admission to BAMS/BUMS/BHMS programs held for the academic year-2026-2027.** However, in respect of applicants belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, the minimum marks shall be at 40 percentiles. In respect of PwBD candidates, the minimum marks shall be at 45 percentiles for UR-PwBD/EWS-PwBD and 40 percentile for SC-PwBD, ST-PwBD & OBC-PwBD candidates.

Further to become eligible for 85% Delhi Quota, the candidate must have passed 11th and 12th examination under 10+2 system conducted by, (CBSE)/Indian School certificate examination/Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi or any other equivalent examination recognized by the University of Delhi for admission to under graduate program from a recognized school situated within NCT of Delhi only. (i) The candidate must have passed in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Biotechnology and English individually and must have obtained a minimum of 50% (fifty percent) marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology/Biotechnology at the qualifying examination mentioned above for UR/EWS candidates and 40% (forty percent) marks in respect of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes; (ii) Candidates with benchmark disabilities as specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum qualifying marks in qualifying examination in Physics, Chemistry and Biology/Biotechnology shall be 45% (forty-five percent) for UR/EWS category and 40% (forty percent) for the Schedule Castes, Schedules Tribes and Other Backward Classes." Note: (i) The applicant in order to become eligible for admission to BAMS program under SC/ST/OBC categories must obtain 40% (forty percent) marks in eligibility criteria prescribed in para (I) i.e. class 12th Board examination. (ii) Provided that the applicant has passed in all the subjects separately required for purpose of admission to BAMS Program. (iii) The applicants belonging to UR-PwBD/EWS-PwBD category must have secured a minimum of 45% (forty-five percent) marks and SC-PwBD/ST-PwBD/OBC-PwBD categories must have obtained a minimum 40% (forty percent) marks in eligibility criteria prescribed in para (I) i.e. class 12th examination. (iv) The applicants who have passed qualifying examination from Patrachar Vidyalaya or National Institute of Open Schooling will be eligible for admission in BAMS programs under 85% Delhi Quota provided their study center and the examination Center were within the National Capital Territory of Delhi (NCTD) and they must submit a certificate from the controlling authority of Patrachar Vidyalaya/NIOS in this regard. However, the candidature of candidates who have passed the qualifying examination i.e. 10+2 from NIOS or state of open school or as private candidates from recognized State Boards; or with Biology/Biotechnology as additional subject shall be allowed subject to the outcome of the Special Leave Petitions/Appeals filed by Medical Council of India. II. 15% All India Quota: The Education Qualification as per National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test (NEET) conducted by (NTA).

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5. ADMISSION PROCESS

- NEET (UG) - 2026 qualified applicants are required to register on the Admission portal of the University of Delhi to participate in the UG counseling 2026 under Delhi Quota (DQ) (85%). Further, the applicants admitted under All India Quota (AIQ) (15%) shall also be required to register themselves on the Admission portal of the University to complete the admission process.
- The applicants are advised to use the same E-mail address and Mobile Number for registration on the Admission portal of the University for Counseling which was submitted during NEET-UG 2026 Registration.
- All the information/communication will be sent by the University on the registered E-mail or registered Mobile Number only.
- Any request regarding change of registered mobile number or email address shall not be entertained by the University.
- The applicants are advised to use a Laptop or Computer with the Chrome/Internet Explorer/Firefox/Windows/IOS during the Registration and Choice-Filling process to avoid any technical complications.
- Be extremely careful while registering in the Admission portal of the University of Delhi. Your allotment will be as per the information provided at the time of registration.
- The University of Delhi reserves its absolute right to alter, amend, modify or apply any or some of the instructions/ guidelines contained in this information bulletin. In case of any ambiguity in the interpretation of any of the instructions/ terms/ rules/criteria regarding the determination of eligibility/conduct of counselling/ registration of candidates/ any information contained herein, the interpretation of the University shall be final and binding in nature.



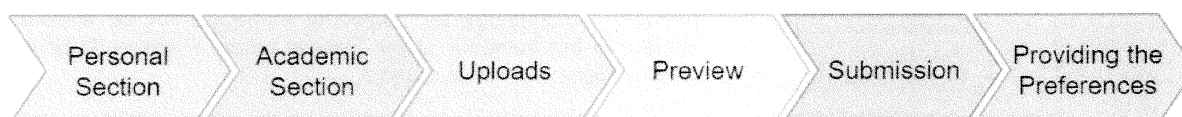
6. REGISTRATION

To apply for BAMS, BUMS and BHMS Programs in University of Delhi, the following are mandatorily required:

- Applicant's Name (as it appears in NEET-2026)
- Date of Birth

Before starting the registration process, the applicant is advised to scan and keep a copy of all the required documents/ certificates on his/her Computer/ Laptop to avoid mistakes while filling in the form.

The application form has the following sections:



Personal Section

In the Personal Section, the details entered by the candidate must match with the particulars mentioned in the certificates/ documents of the candidate. Mismatches/ discrepancies may lead to the rejection of the application at any stage.

The applicant must fill the Personal Section carefully.

The applicant who had opted for PwBD category in NEET-2026 will not be allowed to change his/her category as s(he) would have availed PwBD benefits (such as compensatory time and/or provision of scribe) during NEET-2026.

The applicant opting for CW category must choose the CW Priority carefully.

Academic Section

The applicants must enter the marks of all the subjects in which s(he) has passed Class 10th and 12th examination.

If the mark sheet contains both Class 11th and Class 12th marks, only the Class 12th marks must be entered. The applicants must have passed Theory and Practical separately.

The applicant is required to fill the marks obtained and maximum marks for Theory and Practical separately as per the Class 12th Marksheet. If the Theory/ Practical breakup is not specified for a paper, enter the marks only in the 'Theory' section for that paper and enter "0" in the maximum marks and marks obtained in the Practical section.

Any discrepancy in the entry of marks pertaining to the Theory, Practical or Total, will be the sole responsibility of the applicant.

Uploads

The applicant must upload the required relevant documents.

The name of the applicant claiming reservation under SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/CW/PwBD must match with the name that appears on the corresponding School Board qualifying certificates and in NEET-2026. Similarly, the parents' names must match with the certificates.

The applicant shall be responsible for the legibility and authenticity of the certificate, s(he) uploads. S(he) must take utmost care to ensure that uploaded documents/certificates are authentic and accurate.

If any false attestation/falsified records are detected, the applicant will be debarred from the University and penal action will be taken against the applicant. No fees will be refunded in such cases.

No undertaking in lieu of incomplete/non-availability of certificates/documents will be accepted.

ADVICE

Applicants must ensure that the uploaded certificates are visible and readable.

Preview

The applicant will be able to preview the application form only after the successful uploading of the mandatory documents.

The applicant will have the option of editing/ making changes, if required, at this stage.

The applicant must carefully read every detail entered by him/her before proceeding to the next section of the Final Submission.

No change/edit/modification will be allowed once the application form is successfully submitted.

Submission

Once the application form has been filled and the documents are uploaded, the applicant must submit the form by paying the Registration fee. A candidate will become eligible to participate further only after the successful realization of the registration fees within the stipulated time.

The fee must be paid only through the Payment Gateway link provided on the applicant's dashboard. If the registration fee is not successfully remitted, the application will not be considered for allocation under any circumstances.

ADVICE

Upon successful payment of the Registration fee, the applicants are advised to keep records of the transaction details as proof for future reference.

The applicants are advised to use any one of these payment modes: Net Banking/ Debit Card/ Credit Card/ UPI.

- (viii) Certificate from the Principal of the School on prescribed proforma available at faculty website: <https://fmssc.du.ac.in/> stating that (i) the school is situated within National Capital Territory of Delhi (for Delhi Quota students), (ii) the school is recognized by the CBSE/Council for the Indian School Certificate/ Jamia Milia Islamia, (iii) the school is conducting regular classes, (iv) the applicant has attended regular classes in the school for class **11th & 12th**. (only PDF & size upto 100- 500 KB) (Important Certificate).
- (ix) Copy of the valid Character Certificate in proforma as prescribed by CBSE, issued by the Principal of the school last attended or any Gazetted Officer (Only PDF & size upto 100- 500 KB).
- (x) Copy of Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe certificate as described in Section –B, clause, 1A, if applicable. (Only PDF & size 100-500 KB).
- (xi) Copy of OBC Non-creamy layer certificate (in the name of the candidate) issued after 01/04/2026 by the competent authority and OBC caste certificate as per the Central list for OBC's (only PDF & size upto 100-500 KB).
- (xii) Copy of Person with Disability (PwBD) certificates described in Section -B Clause C, if applicable (only PDF & size upto 100- 500 KB).
- (xiii) Entitlement Certificate for C.W. category as described in Section–B Clause, D, if applicable. (Only PDF & size upto 100-500 KB).
- (xiv) Copy of EWS Certificate (in the name of the candidate) issued after 01/04/2026 by the competent authority as described in Section-B, Clause E (only PDF & size upto 100- 500KB).
- (xv) Copy of Overseas citizens of India (OCI) card, if applicable.
- (xvi) Medical fitness certificate as per **Annexures**.

Note: The candidates are required to bring printout of the Registration Form, Provisional Allotment Letter alongwith original certificates, and 02 Sets of self-attested photocopies and three latest pass-port size photographs at the time of reporting for admission at the respective allotted college.

- (b) Once all the above – mentioned files are uploaded, applicant can proceed with “Make Payment”. Applicant can also update the uploaded files and application form using Back button before making payment. After payment is made, no changes will be allowed.



- (c) The applicant's application submission process shall be completed only after realization of the payment of the online registration fees at the Dashboard.
- (d) In case an applicant wishes to apply in more than one Program then the applicant is required to submit a sum of the total fees prescribed for each Program (i.e. BAMS/BUMS/BHMS) applied.
- (e) Please note that the candidature is subject to the applicant's fulfilling the minimum eligibility requirements prescribed for applying to the concerned program of study. **In case a applicant does not meet the minimum eligibility, criteria prescribed for applying to the concerned program, it is done at the applicant's own risk and cost and if at any stage, it is found that the minimum eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission if granted, shall be cancelled ipso facto and the Registration Fees paid, if any, shall not be refunded in any case.**

After payment for the registration form, corrections, additions, deletions etc. in any manner shall NOT be allowed. The applicants are, therefore, advised to fill their forms carefully.

8. ALLOCATION RULES

1. The University will only consider the score obtained in NEET-2026 for the purpose of allocations.
2. The Highest Possible Preference will be provisionally allocated to a candidate considering the following criteria:
 - (i) AIR (ALL INDIA RANK)
 - (ii) Category Rank (UR/OBC-NCL/SC/ST/EWS)
 - (iii) Availability of seats
 - (iv) Any other allocation rules, policies, or criteria as mentioned in this document or published on the admission website of University of Delhi.
3. The merit list for the UR category seats will comprise of all candidates in order of merit. No one will be excluded from the same. In other words, the merit list for the UR category will also include SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS candidates, irrespective of category, if they meet the criterion of merit for the UR category. No candidate can be excluded from the UR category merit list just because the Candidate belongs to or has applied under SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS category. Discrimination on the basis of category/caste is completely unlawful. The University of Delhi does not tolerate discrimination against any Candidate/s on this basis. Strict action will be taken against any violations.
4. **If candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/PwBD/CW category do not have a valid certificate/ document issued by the respective issuing authority at the time of admission, they will not be considered for allocation in the relevant category as claimed. (Refer to Annexures).**
5. **If the total number of eligible ST category candidates who have applied for a particular Program exhausts, then the remaining seats under this category for that particular Program will be allocated to eligible SC category candidates and vice-versa.**
6. **In case, a candidate who was allocated a seat under any reserved category/ sub-category and was rejected on the basis of deficiency/ies in the category/sub-category/ caste documents, s(he) may be considered for seat allocation in subsequent round/s (if any) in UR category as per his/her eligibility, merit and availability of seats in UR. The deficiency/ies in the requisite document do/es not include submission of forged or fake**

document(s). The candidature of any candidate found committing such forgery/ cheating/ misrepresentation shall be outrightly rejected.

9. SEAT ALLOCATION AND COUNSELLING PROCESS

Round 1 to Round 3 of the Counselling

On declaration of each allocation round, if a seat is provisionally allocated, the candidate must report to the concerned college for the allocated seat before the last date/time specified for the given allocation round.

Inactivity/no-action will be taken as non-acceptance of the allocated seat. It will be treated as a decline to the provisionally allocated seat and the candidate will no longer be able to participate in subsequent round.

- The Joint Admission Committee (JAC) for UG, Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines, in case of admission in UG (BAMS/BUMS) Programs and Homeopathic Medical Course Admission Committee (HMCAC) for UG, Faculty of Homeopathic Medicines, in case of admission in UG (BHMS) Program, will finalize the list of eligible candidates for each Round of counselling on the basis of the data provided by the Delhi University Computer Centre on the basis of the following:
 1. Minimum Eligibility of the Candidate
 2. NEET 2026 All India Rank and score
 3. Category of the candidate
 - The final list of the eligible candidates for a particular Round shall be displayed on the websites www.admission.uod.ac.in and <https://fmsc.du.ac.in/> ➡ Admissions ➡ Undergraduate Courses . ➡ BAMS/BUMS/BHMS.
 - The candidates are advised to visit the websites www.admission.uod.ac.in and <https://fmsc.du.ac.in/> regularly, for any update.
 - The candidates, whose names are displayed in the list of eligible candidates of the particular Round of Counselling, shall have to report at the respective college physically within the stipulated time to get the original certificates verified after downloading the Provisional Allotment Letter from the online admission portal of the University of Delhi.
 - During physical verification, if any document/ certificate is found inadequate/ insufficient/ inappropriate, it will lead to cancellation of the admission, ipso facto. Further, such a candidate will forfeit the opportunity for admission for the Academic Session 2026-27.
 - After careful verification of the documents of the candidate by the Admission Committee of the concerned college, the college concerned will confirm the eligibility of the candidate for the admission in the particular Round to the Delhi University Computer Centre (DUCC) through online link and DUCC will provide the Provisional Admission Letter to that candidate to enable him to download the same and to complete the admission formalities at the respective college. Once the approval is accorded, the candidate will have to pay the requisite admission fee during the stipulated time to finalize the admission process.
- **Step 1:** Publication of provisional merit list on the Delhi University -UG portal; if there are any queries on the allotment, candidates must mail to ug@faum.du.ac.in within the specified time before publishing the final merit list. Requests/queries on allotment after publishing the final merit list shall not be entertained.

- **Step 2: Publication of final Seat allotment list** (final result): Candidates can download the Provisional Allotment Letter from the Delhi University -UG portal.
- **Step 3:** Physical Reporting to the allotted college/institute with all original documents within the stipulated time as per schedule.1
- **Step 4:** Downloading the Provisional Admission Letter: After verification of the documents and approval of the concerned college the candidate can download the Provisional Admission Letter from the Delhi University-UG Portal.
- **Step 5:** Depositing the admission fee: The candidate will be required to deposit the admission fee within the stipulated time.
- **Step 6:** Confirmation of the seat filled by the concerned college: The concerned college will confirm to the DUCC that the allotted seat to the candidate has been filled after completing all the formalities.

10. CANCELLATION OF PROVISIONALLY ALLOCATED SEAT/ ADMISSION

1. Failure to report for admission at the concerned college for the provisionally allocated seat within the stipulated timeline will lead to cancellation of the allocated seat.
 2. The provisionally allocated seat will be cancelled if a candidate fails to pay the admission confirmation fees within the stipulated time.
 3. The provisionally allocated seat/admission will be cancelled if, at any time, any of the document(s)/ certificate(s) is/are found to be invalid/ fraudulent.
 4. The provisionally allocated seat/admission will be cancelled if, at any time, it is found that a candidate does not meet the Minimum Eligibility Criteria as declared by University of Delhi.
- A candidate whose provisionally allocated seat/admission is cancelled due to any of the above-mentioned reason will forfeit the right to seek admission to University of Delhi and no fee shall be refunded.

11. CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION BY THE CANDIDATE

All cancellations/relieving and resignation (if allowed) will be made through online mode only; no offline cancellations/relieving /resignation of the seat is permitted.

12. STRAY VACANCY ROUND

- The Undergraduate (BAMS/BUMS/BHMS) Ayurveda & Unani, Homeopathic - Delhi University seats remain vacant (not joined/withdrawn/non-availability of candidate) after the 3rd Round of University of Delhi -UG Counseling will continue to be filled through the Stray Vacancy Round conducted by the University of Delhi.
- The reserved vacant (Delhi Quota) seats of CW and PwBD sub-category of AU and H will be converted during the Stray Vacancy Round as per the approved conversion algorithm, only if the reserved seat is not opted by any candidate/non-availability of candidate of that particular category in Stray Vacancy Rounds.



Eligibility for participation

- a. The candidates registered and participated in the previous rounds (1st, 2nd and 3rd) but were not allotted a seat will be eligible to participate in the Stray Vacancy Rounds.
- Step 1: Publication of provisional result on the Delhi University -UG portal; if there are any queries on the allotment, candidates must mail to ug@faum.du.ac.in and office@fmsc.du.ac.in within the specified time before publishing the final result. Requests/queries on allotment after publishing the final result shall not be entertained.
 - Step 2: Publication of final Seat allotment list (final result): Candidates can download the Provisional Allotment Letter from the Delhi University -UG portal.
 - Step 3: Physical Reporting to the allotted college/institute with all original documents within the stipulated time as per schedule.1
 - Step 4: Downloading the Provisional Admission Letter: After verification of the documents and approval of the concerned college the candidates can download the Provisional Admission Letter from the Delhi University-UG Portal.
 - Step 5: Depositing the admission fee: The candidate will be required to deposit the admission fee.
 - Step 6: Confirmation of the seat filled by the concerned college: The concerned college will confirm to the DUCC that the allotted seat to the candidate has been filled after completing all the formalities.

After the approval is accorded, the candidate **will have to pay the requisite admission fees for** confirmation of the allocated seat. Admission will be confirmed only after successful payment of admission fee.

If a candidate fails to pay the admission fee within the stipulated time, it will be considered as a cancellation of the provisionally allocated seat. The allocated seat shall be forfeited, and the candidate will not be considered for any subsequent allocation rounds.



13.1 SURETY BOND MONEY

A bond worth Rs.3 lakhs with two sureties should be executed by the applicants at the time of their provisional admission. The admission will not be valid unless and until the Surety Bond is executed by the applicant. The Performa of Surety Bond is available on website: <https://fmsc.du.ac.in/>.

Rules regarding payment of Surety Money: -

- a. If a student surrenders seat in violation of AACCC rules/instructions after joining the allotted institution.
- b. If the student leaves the courses before its completion.
- c. If the admission/registration of the student is cancelled/terminated by the University on account of unsatisfactory performance/misconduct /indiscipline.

The Original Certificates of the students would be kept in the custody of the admitting Institution and would be returned only after completion of the course or on payment of Surety Bond money, as the case may be. The Thirty Percent of the Bond Money thus collected will be deposited with the University (Faculty of Medical Sciences) by the institution and the rest could be utilized by the Institution for development of U.G teaching and training programmes.

Note: In case any student leaves the course by virtue of terms and conditions in the NCISM/NCH Regulations and Ordinances of the University pertaining to Examination rules etc. then he/she will not be liable to pay the prescribed bond money.

The format of Surety Bond Money is given at Annexures.

13.2 REMITTANCE OF FEE

Admission of a candidate will be deemed confirmed only after the successful realization of the admission confirmation fee by the concerned college. If the fee is not successfully remitted within the stipulated time, the admission will not be considered complete under any circumstances.

13.3 REFUND OF FEES

SECTION – B

14. RESERVATION POLICIES

PERSONS WITH BENCHMARK DISABILITY (PwBD)

Five percent (5%) of the total sanctioned strength in each Program is reserved for PwBD candidates.

For the format of PwBD certificate, refer to **Annexures**. Disability Certificates issued after 01.06.2021 must be as per the Gazette Notification no. 1736(E) dated 05.05.2021 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and applied through UDID portal. However, Disability Certificates issued before 01.06.2021, will be considered as per other existing applicable rules and notifications of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and the University of Delhi.

As per the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, a 'person with benchmark disability means a person with not less than forty percent (40%) of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority'. It may be noted that the erstwhile Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995 (No. 1 of 1996), under which reservation for Persons with Disabilities in admissions was provided earlier, has now been repealed.

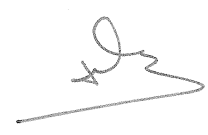
Persons with benchmark disabilities falling within any of the following specified categories of disabilities as mentioned in the Schedule to the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 [See Clause (zc) of Section 2 of the said Act] are eligible to get the benefit of the said reservation.

A. Locomotor Disability

Locomotor disability (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including—

1. **"Leprosy cured Person"** means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—
 - i) loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifestation of deformity;
 - ii) manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
 - iii) extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall construed accordingly;
2. **"Cerebral Palsy"** means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;
3. **"Dwarfism"** means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimeters) or less;
4. **"Muscular Dystrophy"** means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterized by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;
5. **"Acid Attack Victims"** means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

B. Visual Impairment



6. **"Blindness"** means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction
 - (i) Total absence of sight ; or
 - (ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or
 - (iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.
7. **"Low-vision"** means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:
 - (i) Visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or
 - (ii) Limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40-degree upto 10 degree.

C. Hearing Impairment

8. **"Deaf"** means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
9. **"Hard of Hearing"** means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;
10. **"Speech and Language Disability"** means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

D. Intellectual Disability

A condition characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behavior which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

11. **"Specific Learning Disabilities"** means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;
12. **"Autism Spectrum Disorder"** means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with un usual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

E. Mental Illness

"Mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behavior, capacity to recognize reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterized by sub normality of intelligence.

F. Disability caused due to Chronic neurological conditions, such as—

13. **"Multiple Sclerosis"** means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;
14. **"Parkinson's Disease"** means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people



associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.

G. Blood Disorder

15. **"Haemophilia"** means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterized by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding.
16. **"Thalassemia"** means a group of inherited disorders characterized by reduced or absent amounts of haemoglobin.
17. **"Sickle Cell Disease"** means a haemolytic disorder characterized by chronic anaemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "haemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of haemoglobin.

H. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above-specified disabilities)

Multiple disabilities including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.

I. Any other category as may be notified by the Central Government.

CONCESSIONAL/WAIVER OF FEES IN RESPECT OF PERSONS WITH BENCHMARK DISABILITIES (PwBD)

Candidates belonging to PwBD category shall be given a fee concession of 75% of the total fees as compared to the other candidates taking admission in a particular program of the University.

Candidates must ensure that the PwBD certificate is in the candidate's name and issued by a recognized Government Hospital, bearing a duly attested photograph of the candidate.

As per Gazette notification dated 4.02.2019 issued by Government of India regarding Board of Governors in supersession of Medical Council of India related to Amendment Notification for guidelines regarding admission of candidates with "specified Disabilities" under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 with respect to admission in BAMS/BUMS. (Appendix- J), 5% of the annual sanctioned intake capacity in Government or Government aided higher educational institutions shall be filled up by candidates with benchmark disabilities, in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 based on the merit list of 'National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test'. For this purpose the "Specified Disability" contained in the Schedule to Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and the eligibility of candidates to pursue a program in AYUSH with specified disability shall be in accordance with Appendix 'J'. If the seats reserved for the persons with disabilities in a particular category remain unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates, the seats shall be included in the annual sanctioned seats for the respective category.

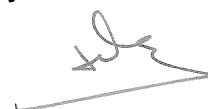

Terms and conditions:

The list of the eligible candidates for their entitlement under CW Category (Delhi Quota) duly verified by the KSB/MHA has already been uploaded on the Faculty website to conduct the counselling and to allot the seat on the basis of All India Rank, Category and Priority of the respective candidates for provisional admission subject to verification of the original documents by the concerned college at the time of reporting for admission by the selected candidate. Therefore, only those candidates, who have applied for CW verification and verified by the KSB/MHA as eligible candidate, shall be considered for admission under CW category.

THE CONVERSION OF SEATS

The conversion of seats will be carried out by the SVR of the counselling. The said conversion will be done only when the eligible Applicants belonging to the said Conversion Category have exhausted even after taking all steps by the Counselling Authority. Further, the unfilled seats of PwBD and CW sub category shall be reverted back to the respective category from which the seats have been allotted to these sub categories.

RESERVATION OF SEATS FOR SCHEDULED CASTE (SC) AND SCHEDULED TRIBE (ST) CANDIDATES

22.5% of the total number of seats are reserved for Candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes (15% for Scheduled Caste and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes, interchangeable if necessary).

The Candidate must be in possession of the Caste/Tribe certificate in his/her own name at the time of Registration and Admission. The Caste certificate should clearly state:

- Name of his/ her caste/tribe
- Whether candidate belongs to SC or ST
- District and the State or Union Territory of Candidate's usual place of residence, and
- The appropriate Govt. of India Schedule under which his /her caste/ tribe is approved as SC or ST.

Candidate will have to produce the valid original SC or ST caste/ tribe certificate at the time of admission. The following are empowered to issue the requisite SC/ ST certificate:

- District Magistrate / Additional District Magistrate / Collector / Deputy Commissioner / Addl. Deputy Commissioner / Deputy Collector / 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate / City Magistrate / Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- Chief Presidency Magistrate /Addl. Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate.
- Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.



- d. Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the Candidate and/ or his family normally resides.
- e. Administrator/Secretary to the Administrator/Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands).

Candidates to note that the SC / ST Certificate from any other person / authority shall not be accepted in any case. If the Candidate happens to belong to SC or ST, Candidate's caste / tribe must be listed in the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule.

It is a statutory obligation on the part of Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines/Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines to fill all seats reserved for Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe Candidates.

Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines/Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines shall not refuse admission to any SC/ST Candidate on the basis of medium of instruction. Any deficiency in the knowledge of any particular language should be addressed; for this purpose, remedial classes may be arranged by the Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines/Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines by utilizing grants available from University Grants Commission.

Provided that, if any seat(s) reserved for the candidates belonging to SC and ST categories remains unfilled due to non-availability of eligible candidate(s) under that category, the same shall be filled in the following manner:

- (i) Such unfilled seat(s) will be offered to the eligible candidates of the other category i.e. seat(s) of SC category to ST category candidates or vice-versa as the case may be.
- (ii) If the seat(s) remain unfilled even after applying clause (i) above, these unfilled seats reserved for SC/ST Category, if any, will be kept vacant.

RESERVATION OF SEATS FOR OTHER BACKWARD CLASSES (OBC, NON-CREAMY LAYER)

27% of seats are reserved for Candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC-Non-Creamy Layer, Central List).

At the time of giving admission to an OBC Candidate, the Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines/Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines will ensure that the caste is included in the Central List of OBC (the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central List of OBCs (Govt. of India) notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes (available at the website http://ncbc.nic.in/backward_classes/index.html.) The certificate must mention non-creamy layer status of the Candidate (Non-creamy layer status issued by an authority mentioned in DOPT Office Memorandum no. 36012/22/93-Estt.(SCT) dated 15.11.1993).

The OBC Candidates who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and **whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only**, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'non-creamy layer' status of the Candidates as per DOPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt.(Res-I) dated 31March 2016). The certificate should be issued after 31stMarch, 2026.

It is a statutory obligation on the part of Faculty of Ayurveda & Unani Medicines/Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines to fill all the seats reserved for OBC Candidates.

RESERVATION POLICY FOR ECONOMICALLY WEAKER SECTIONS (EWS)

As per the University of Delhi notifications (Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019/ 63 Dated 28th March 2019 and Reference No. Aca. I / Reservation of EWSs / 2019 / 101 Dated 15th May 2019), for the reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) Category, the University Departments / Centres / Colleges have reserved 10% seats for admission of candidates belonging to EWS category. The EWS certificate should be issued after 31st March, 2026.

The format of Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) Candidates certificate is given at Annexures.



SECTION – C

15. Certificates prepared by Notary will not be accepted.

- a) Candidates shall be required to submit the Income Tax Return of their parents (father and mother both) for the financial years 2024-25 and 2025-26. In case any of the parents is non-working, a separate certificate is to be submitted along with the application form at the time of seeking admission to the UoD. Such candidates shall also submit an EWS/ Income certificate issued by the prescribed authority. However, for determination of Income, only Income Tax Return (ITR) of the relevant financial years i.e. 2024-25 and 2025-26 shall be used.
- b) PAN card details of both parents (Mother and Father) is mandatory. 16. GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL

In case of any grievance related to admission the applicant may write to ug@faum.du.ac.in or office@fmsc.du.ac.in. The grievances will be addressed in accordance with the applicable rules by the appropriate Authority of the University of Delhi.

17. EQUIVALENCE OF BOARDS

The applications for admission to all the UG programs in the Colleges/Departments in respect of candidates belonging to the Examining bodies of Boards/ Universities recognized/ accredited by the Association of Indian University (AIU) / University Grants Commission (UGC) / Ministry of Education (MoE) shall be considered in terms of the following recommendations as mentioned in the University circular letter of 13.01.2005.

Senior School Certificate of various Boards recognized by AIU /Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) is considered as equivalent to the Senior School Certificate of Central Board for the purposes of eligibility to various Undergraduate programs.

Candidates who pass various Degree / School Examination of Foreign Universities / Boards as having already been approved by the Equivalence Committee, from time to time, will be considered eligible as a matter of routine. Ragging: Ordinance XVC

- (i) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
- (ii) Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
- (iii) Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior candidates is brought to bear on candidates freshly enrolled or candidates who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other candidates and includes individual or collective acts or practices which-
 - (a) involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force;
 - (b) violate the status, dignity and honor of women candidates;
 - (c) violate the status, dignity and honor of candidates belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
 - (d) expose candidates to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem;
 - (e) Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
- (iv) The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, of University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
- (v) Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also *suomoto* enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
- (vi) The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
- (vii) If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
- (viii) When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
- (ix) On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a candidate or candidates for a specific number of years.
- (x) The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any candidate or candidates be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a program of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the candidate or candidates concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
- (xi) In case any candidates who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.
- (xii) For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.

- (xiii) All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance
- (xiv) The Medical Council of India (presentation & prohibition of ragging in Medical Colleges/Institutions) regulations 2009 notified in the part III section 4 of the Gazette of India on 03.08.2009 amended from time to time be also adhered to

Sexual Harassment

Sexual Harassment (Ordinance XV-D) has repelled by the Act passed by Parliament the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013(Ref. No. Etab.II(I)/27/ACC/2006dated09.01.2014. (www.wed.nic.in/wcdact/womenactsex.pdf).

Note: -For all legal matters the Jurisdiction will be National Capital Territory of Delhi only.

For all other matters which have not been provided in this Bulletin of Information, the provisions laid down in the ordinance of the respective streams, and guidelines issued by NCISM/ Ministry of AYUSH, from time to time, will be followed.
