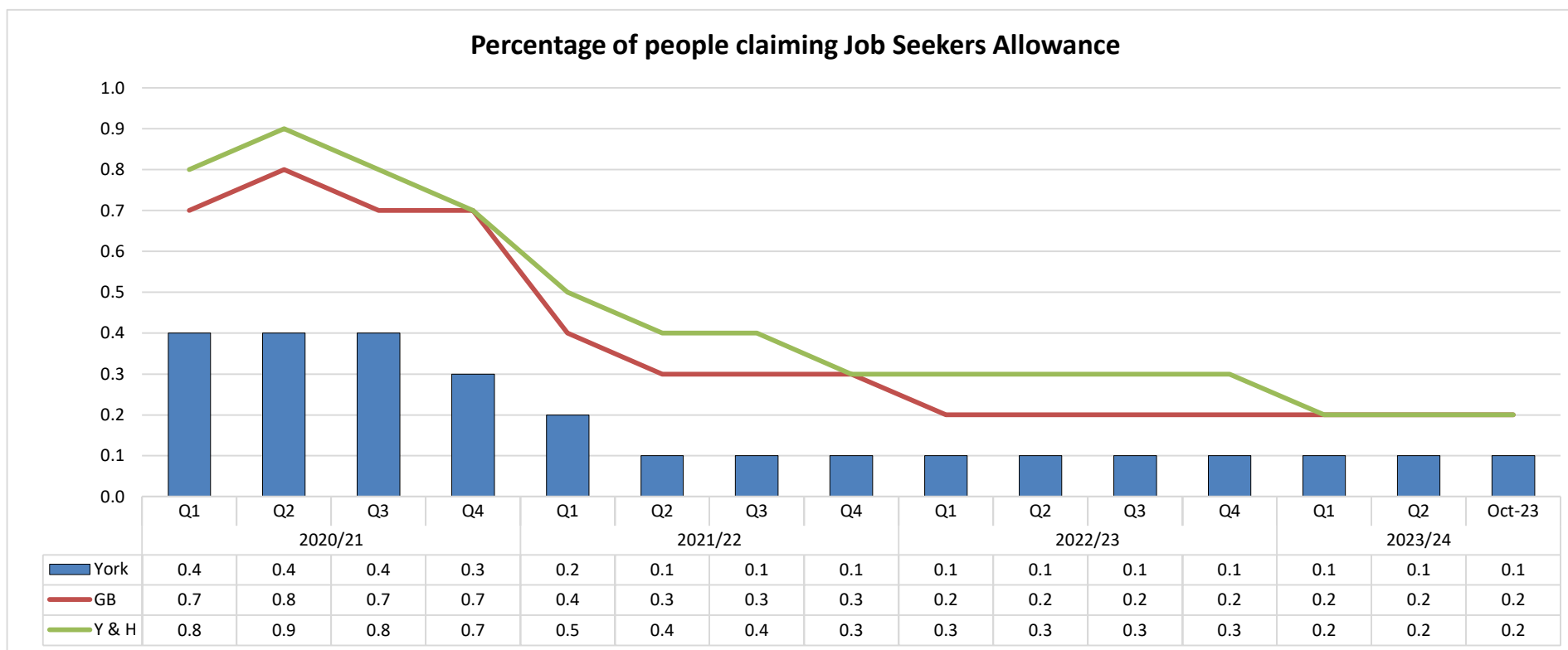

Job Seekers Allowance

October 2023

York overall picture:

- The JSA claimant count for York in October 2023 is 145.
- In March 2020 the figure was 185, which is a decrease of 21.6%.
- This represents 0.1% of the working age population.
- The region stands at 0.2% and GB at 0.2%.
- The highest JSA claimant count in York in the past 10 years (from October 2013) is from February 2014 with a figure of 2,225 or 1.7% of the working age population.

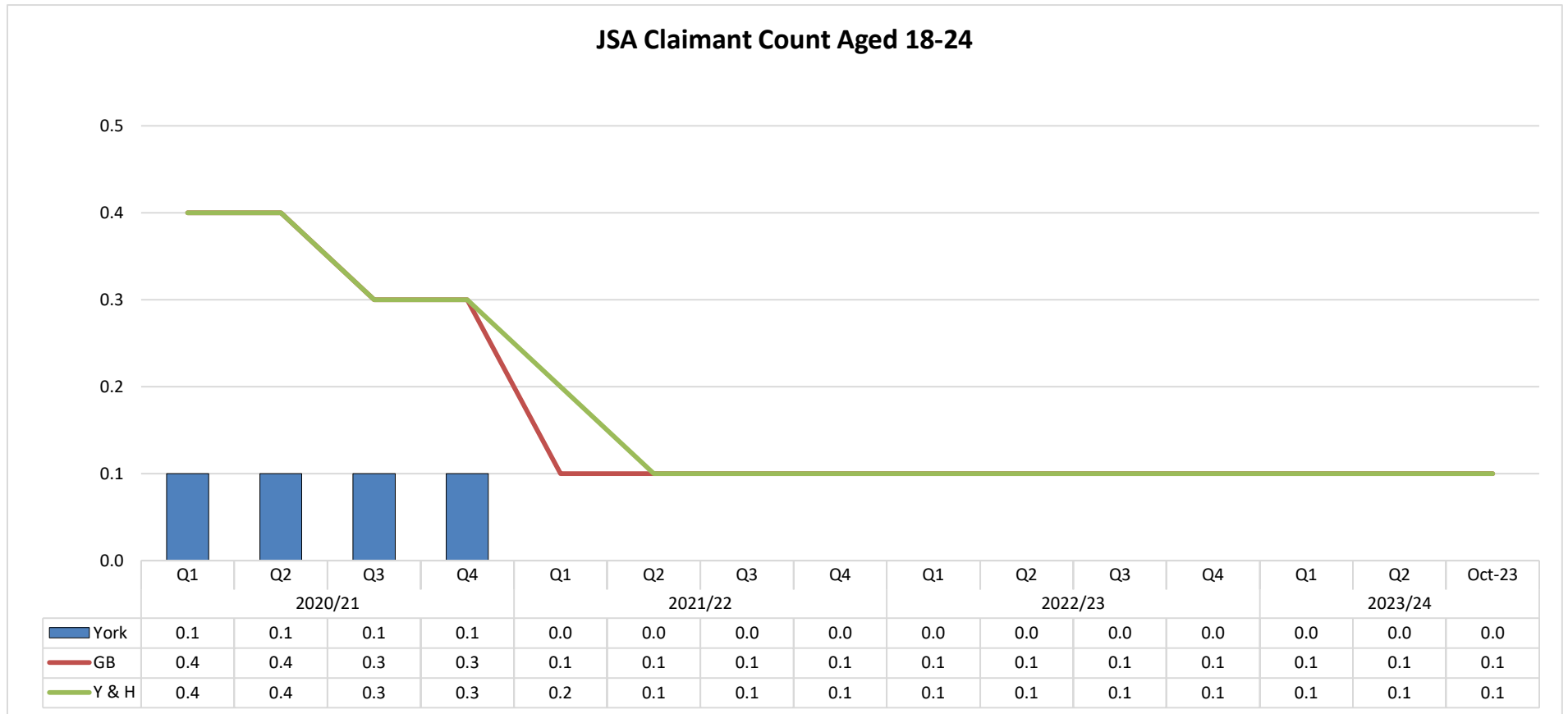

JSA Claimants 18 - 24 years old

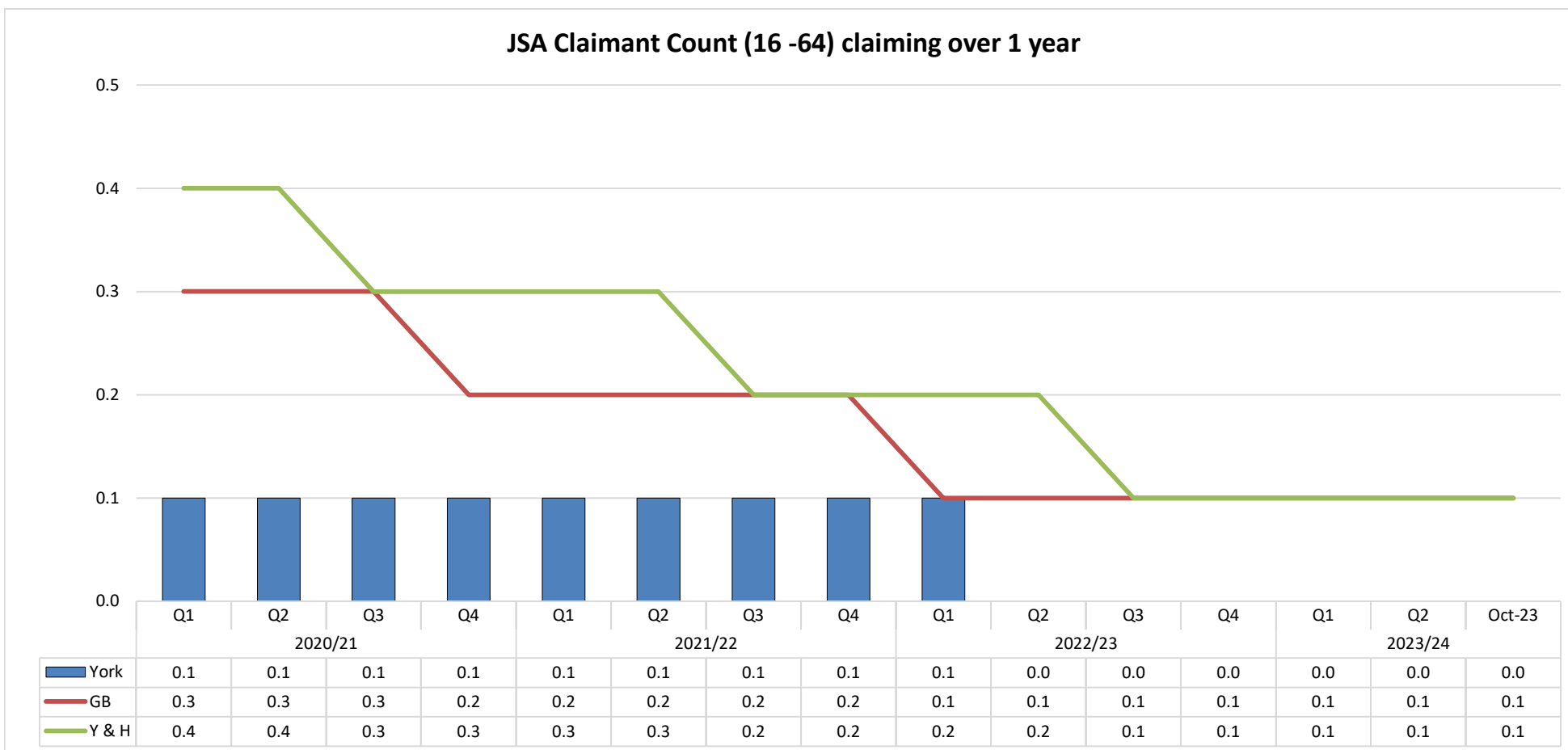
- In October 2023 the total number of claimants (18-24) stood at 10, an increase of 5 from March 2020.
- This represents 0.0% of the working age population.
- The region stands at 0.1% and GB at 0.1%.

JSA Claimants out of work for over one year

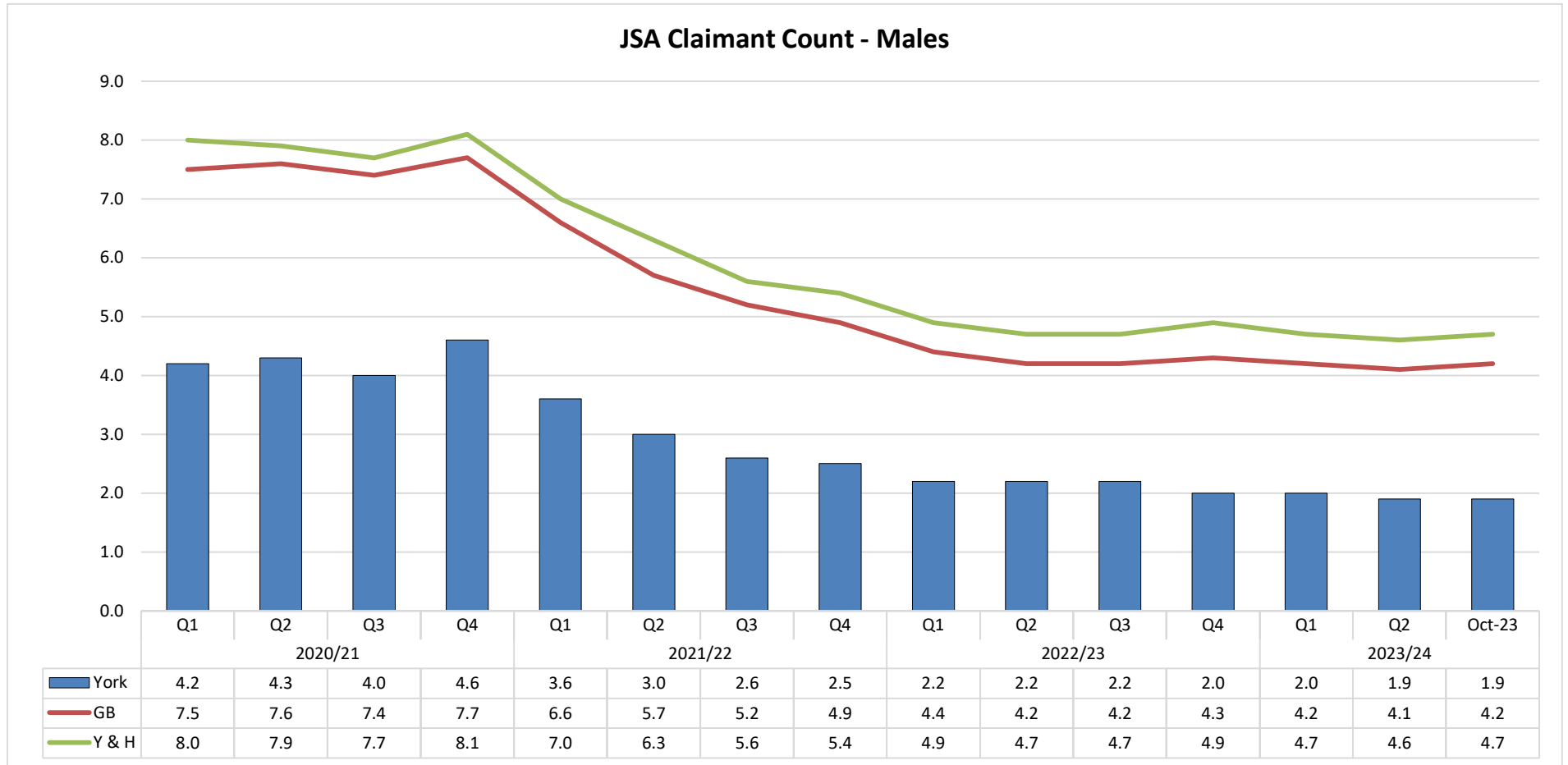
- Claimants out of work for over one year, showed no change from last month, 40 less than one year ago - a 66.7% decrease.
- This represents 0.0% of the working age population who were out of work for over 1 year.
- The region stands at 0.1% and GB at 0.1%.

JSA Male Claimant Count

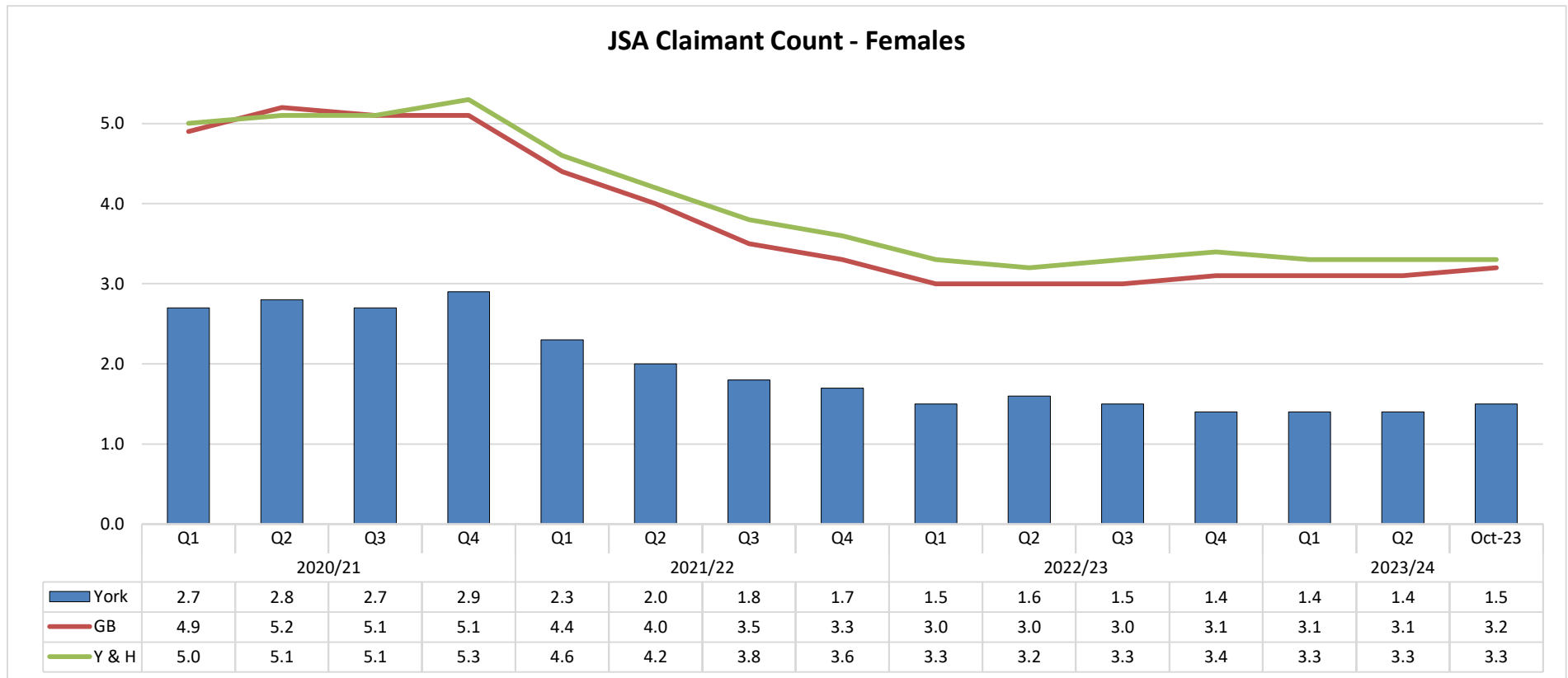
- Male Claimants have decreased by 5 from last month, totalling 80, 10 less than one year ago - a 11.1% decrease.
- This represents 1.9 % of the male working age population.
- The region stands at 4.7% and GB at 4.2%.

JSA Female Claimants

- Female Claimants showed no change from last month, 15 more than one year ago - a 27.3% increase.
- This represents 1.5 % of the female working age population.
- The region stands at 3.3% and GB at 3.2%.



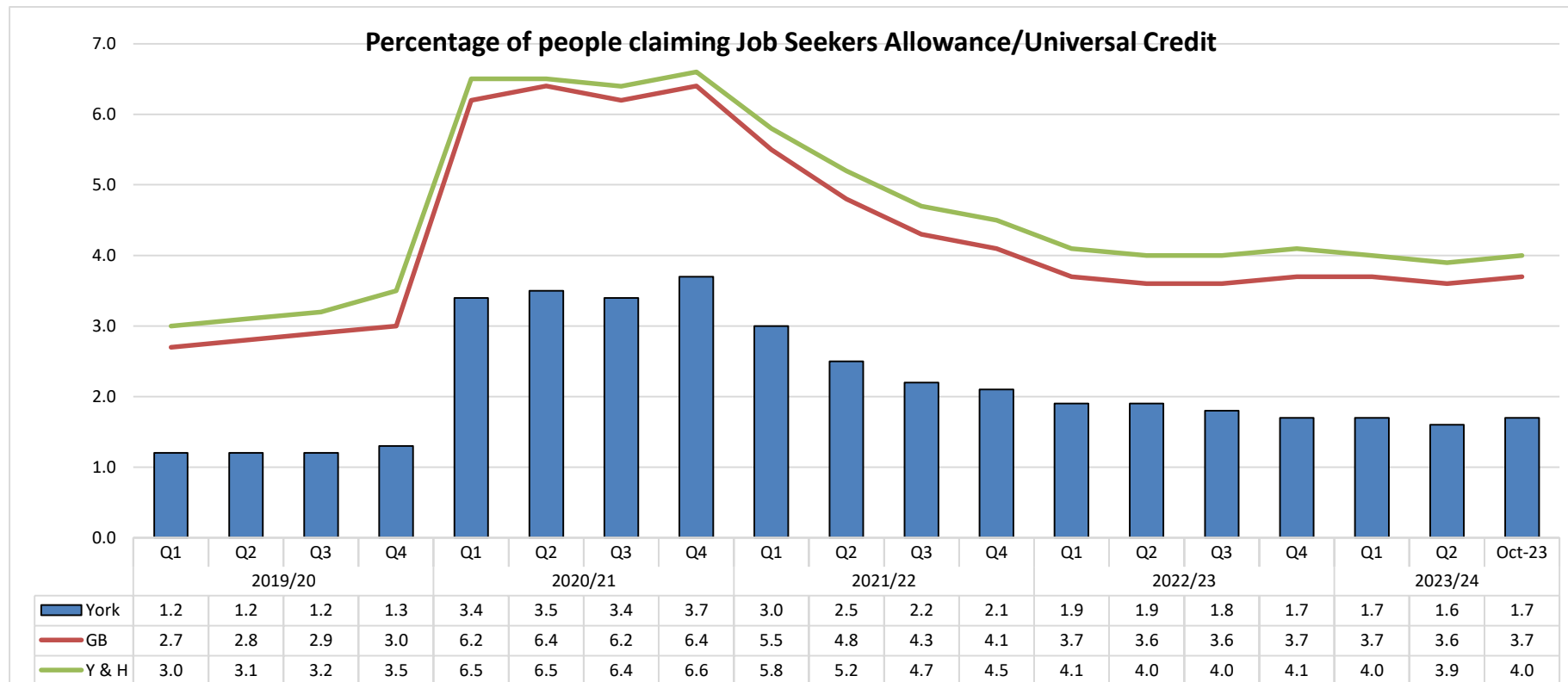

Job Seekers Allowance and Universal Credit Claimants

October 2023

York Jobseekers Allowance/Universal Credit overall picture:

- The JSA/UC claimant count for York in October 2023 is 2,245.
- In October 2022 the figure was 2,400, this is a decrease of 155 (6.5%) since October 2022 .
- This represents 1.7% of the working age population.
- The region stands at 4.0% and GB at 3.7%.
- The highest JSA/UC claimant count in York in the past 4 years (from October 2019) is from August 2020 with a figure of 5,080 or 3.6% of the working age population.

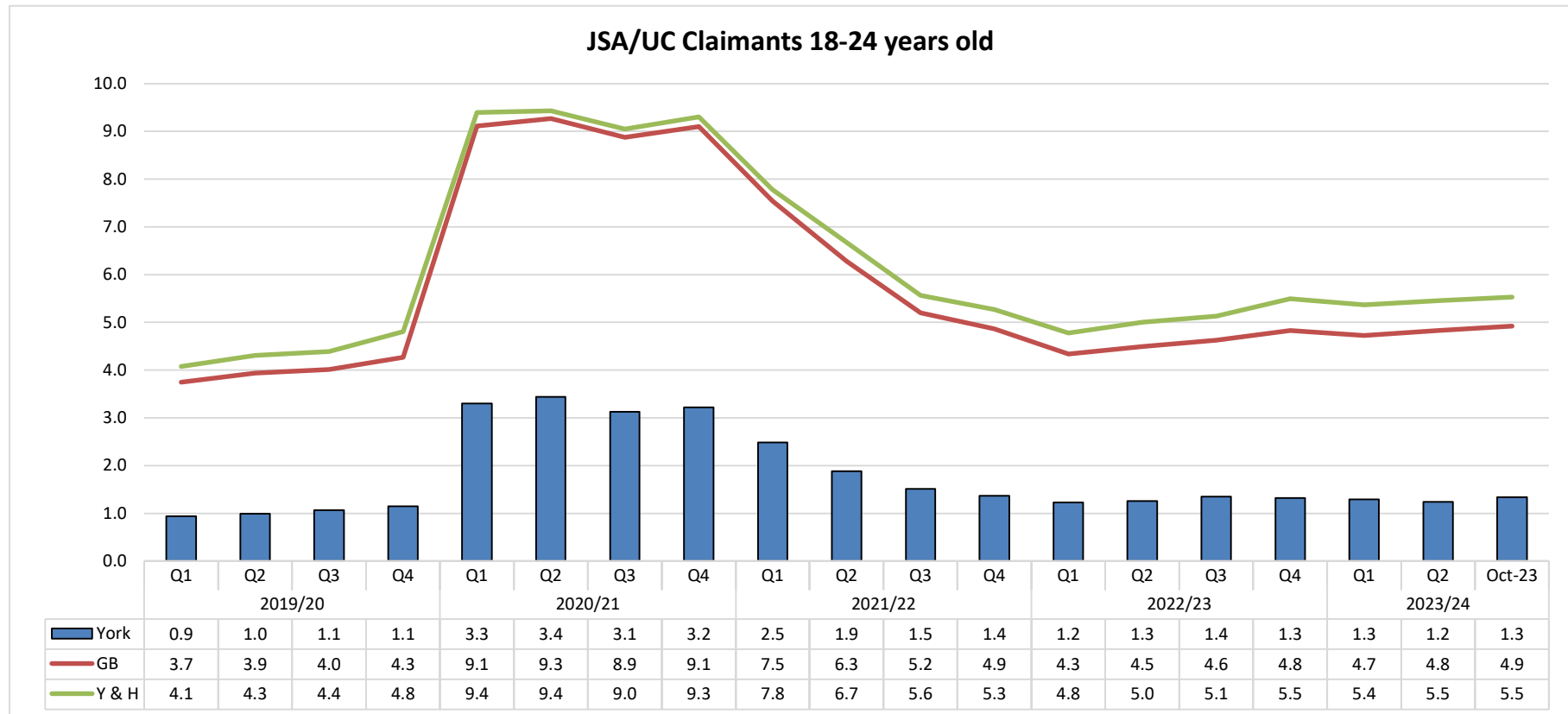

Job Seekers Allowance and Universal Credit Claimants

JSA/UC Claimants 18 - 24 years old

- In October 2023 the total number of claimants (18-24) stood at 425, an increase of 30 from September 2023.
- This represents 1.3% of the working age population.
- The region stands at 5.5% and GB at 4.9%.

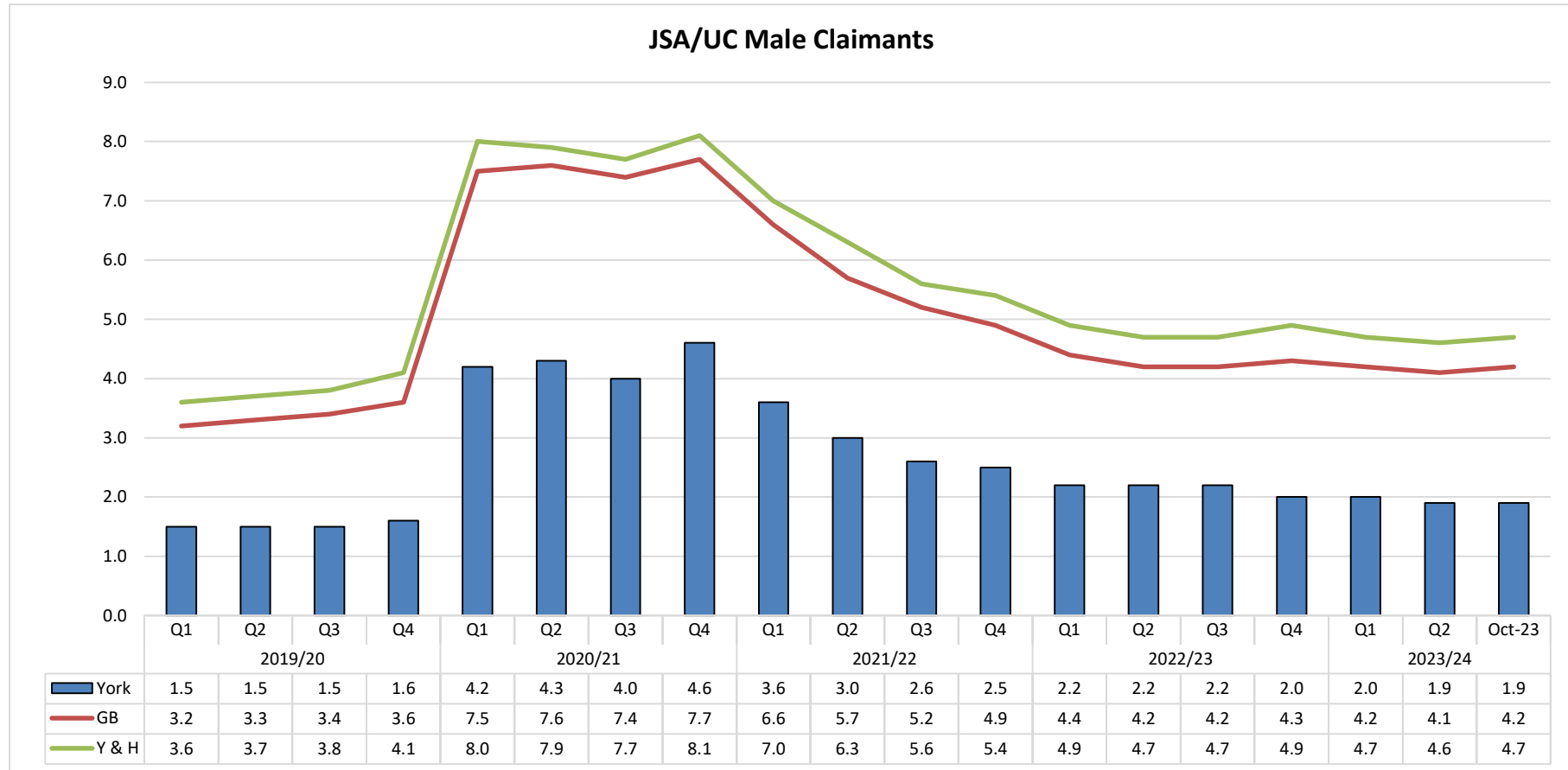

Job Seekers Allowance and Universal Credit Claimants

JSA/UC Male Claimant Count

- Male Claimants have increased by 15 from last month, totalling 1,225, 150 less than one year ago - a 10.9% decrease.
- This represents 1.9 % of the male working age population.
- The region stands at 4.7% and GB at 4.2%.

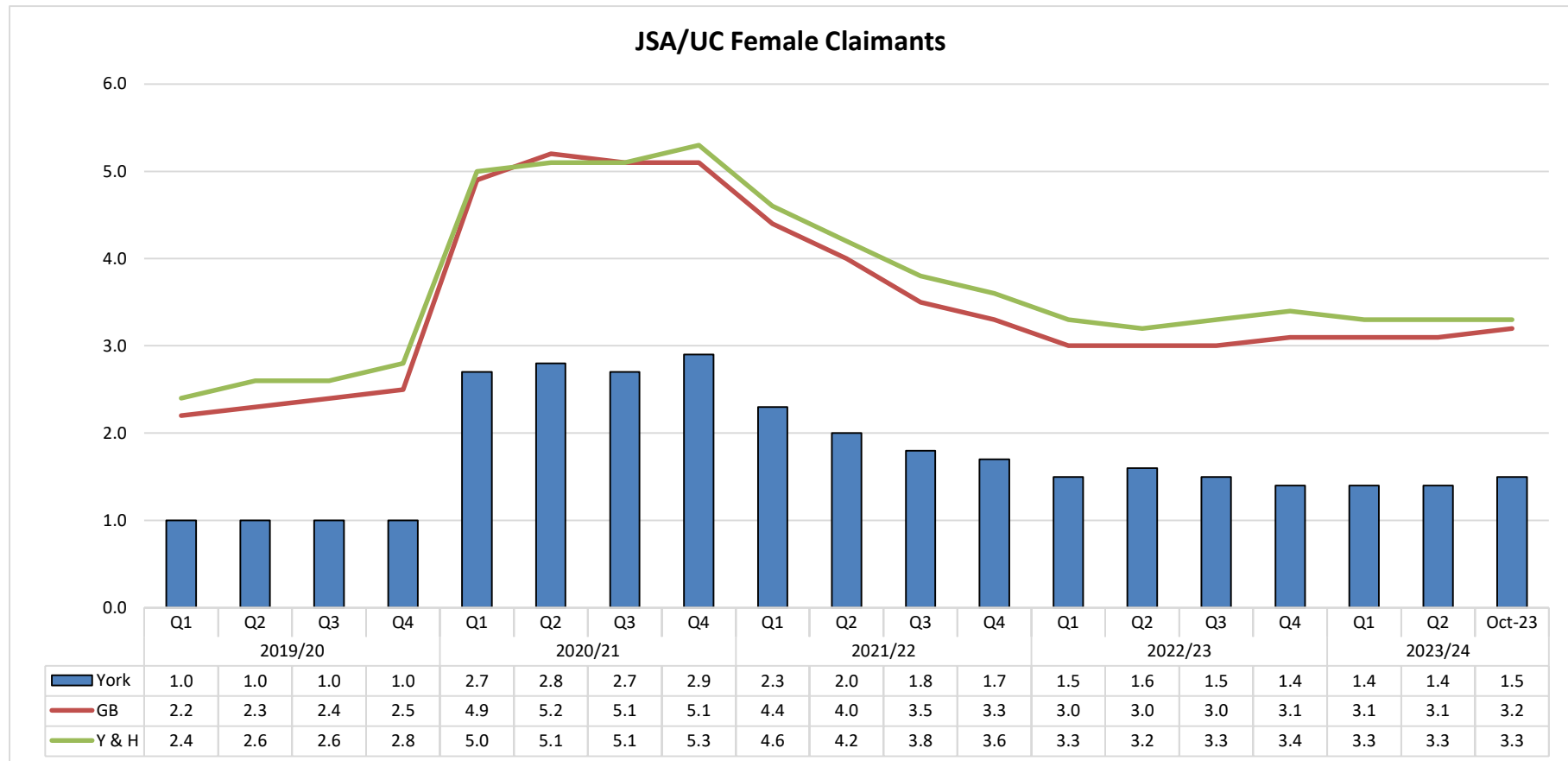

- Female Claimants have increased by 70 from last month, totalling 1,020, no change from one year ago.
- This represents 1.5 % of the female working age population.
- The region stands at 3.3% and GB at 3.2%.

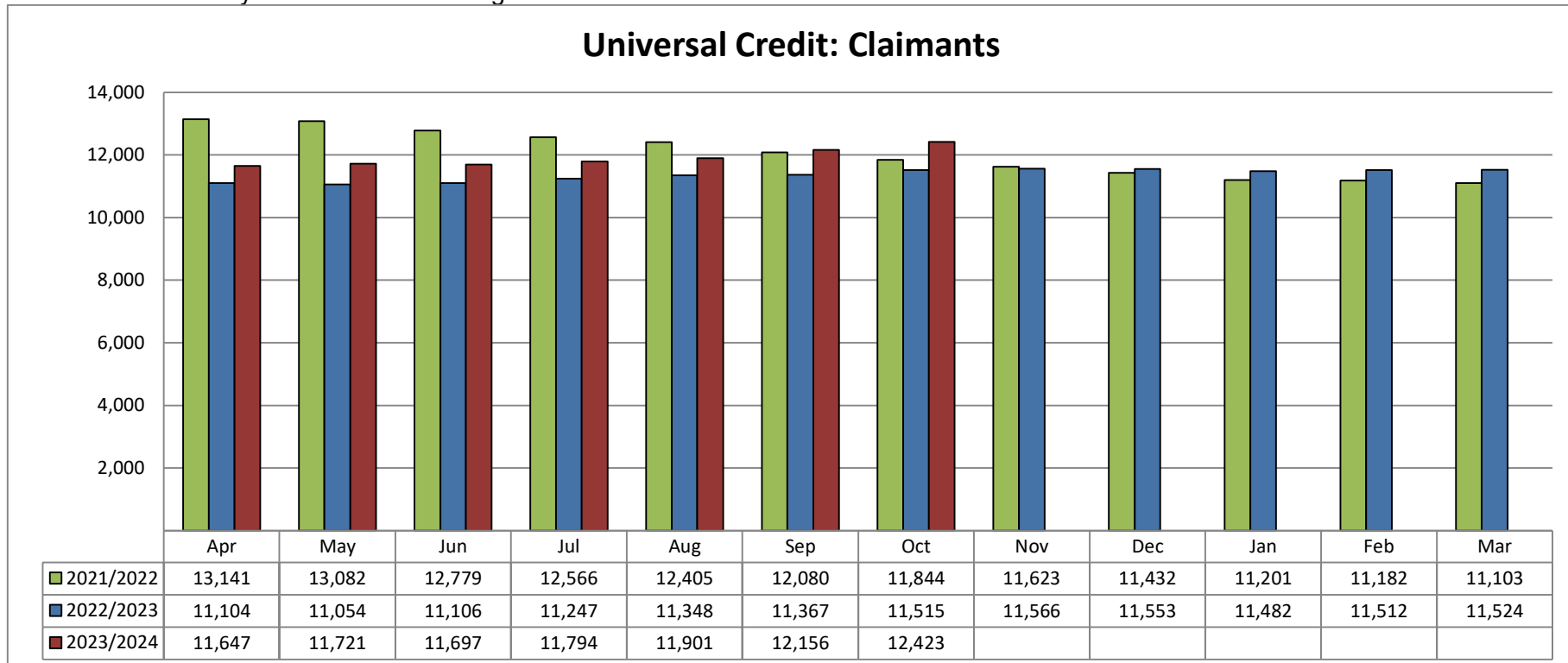
Under Universal Credit a broader span of claimants are required to look for work than under Jobseeker's Allowance. As Universal Credit Full Service is rolled out in particular areas, the number of people recorded as being on the Claimant Count is therefore likely to rise.

Universal Credit Claimants

Universal Credit Claimants

The JSA figures should be viewed in the context of the number of people receiving Universal Credit in York increasing from 12,156 in September 2023 to 12,423 in October 2023. Under Universal Credit a broader span of claimants are required to look for work than under Jobseekers Allowance. As Universal Credit Full Service is rolled out in particular areas, the number of people recorded as being on the Claimant Count is therefore likely to rise.

On 12 July 2017 Universal Credit became available to parents and couples in the York area, until this date Universal Credit was only available to single job seekers in the area. From November 2019 the provisional figures will show the total of those claiming Universal Credit. A breakdown will only be shown when the figures are revised.

Following the introduction of Universal Credit, the claimant count takes into account:

- people claiming contribution JSA (this is not affected by the introduction of Universal Credit)
- the figures for Universal Credit are provisional for the current month and may be revised in the next update.

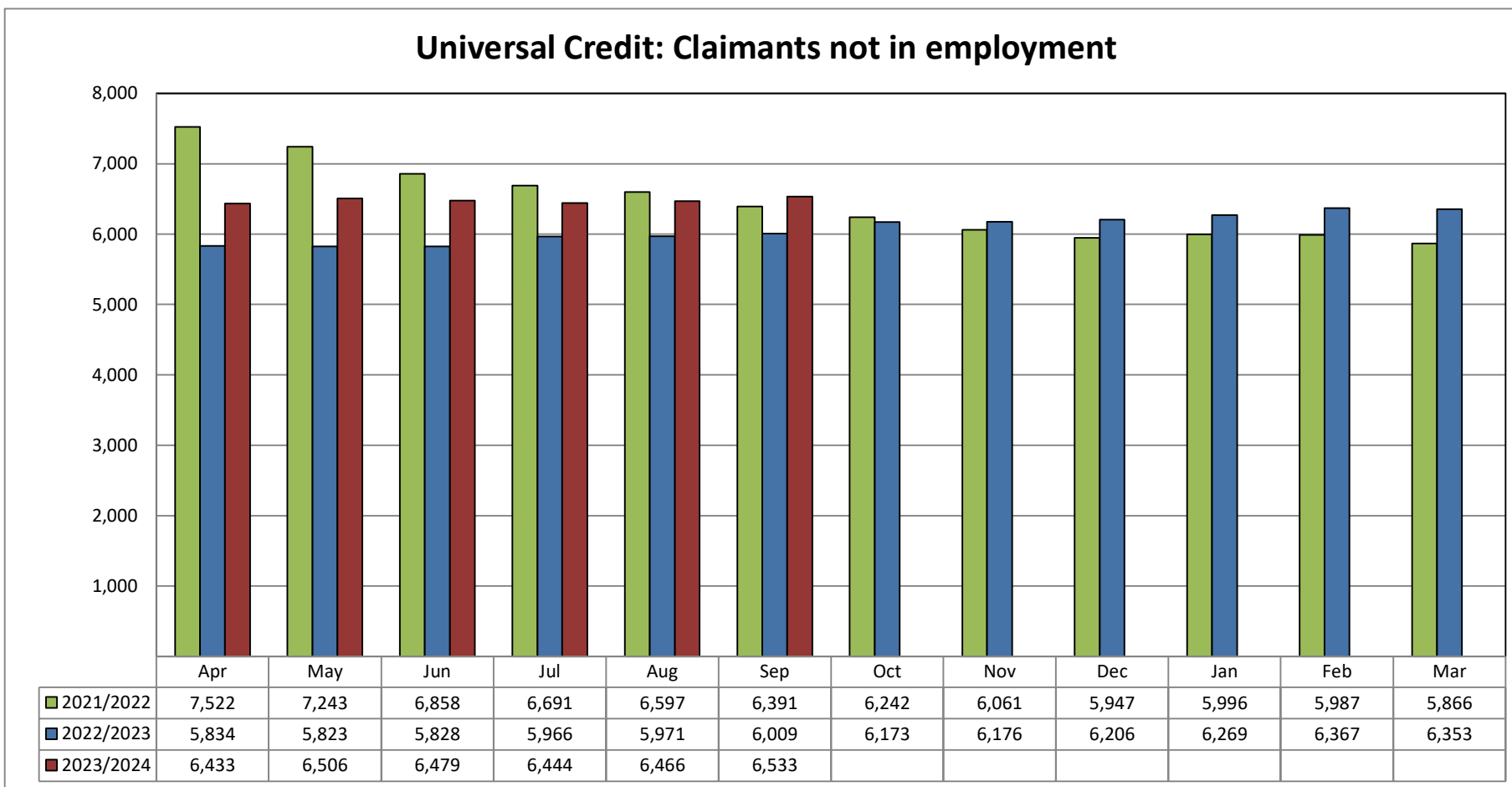
Universal Credit Claimants

Universal Credit Claimants: Not in Employment

The number of Universal Claimants claiming out of work benefits in September 2023 was 6,533, which has increased by 8.7% from last year, when the total was 6,009. The not in employment figure for October 2023 will be available in November 2023, as the figure is published a month in arrears.

Nationally, the number of people claiming the not in employment element of Universal Credit has increased by 12.2% from the same period last year.

Regionally, the figure has increased by 13.6% from the same period last year.

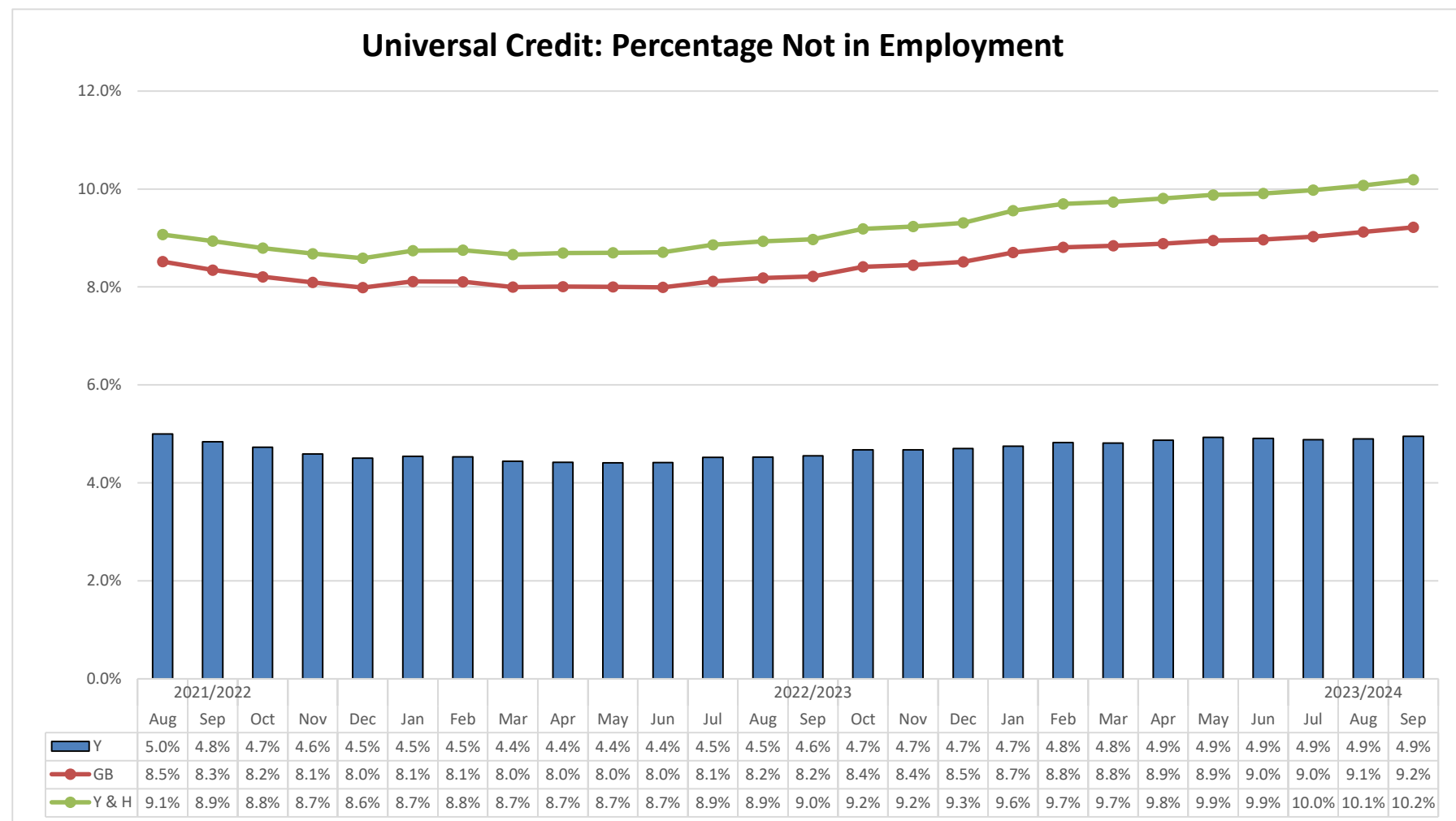
Universal Credit Claimants

Universal Credit Claimants: Percentage of Working Age Claimants Not in Employment

The percentage of Universal Claimants claiming out of work benefits in September 2023 was 4.9%, which has increased by 0.3% from last year, when the total was 4.6%,

Nationally, the number of people claiming the not in employment element of Universal Credit has increased by 1% from last year, when the total was 8.2%, .

Regionally, the figure has increased by 1.2% from last year, when the total was 9% .
