

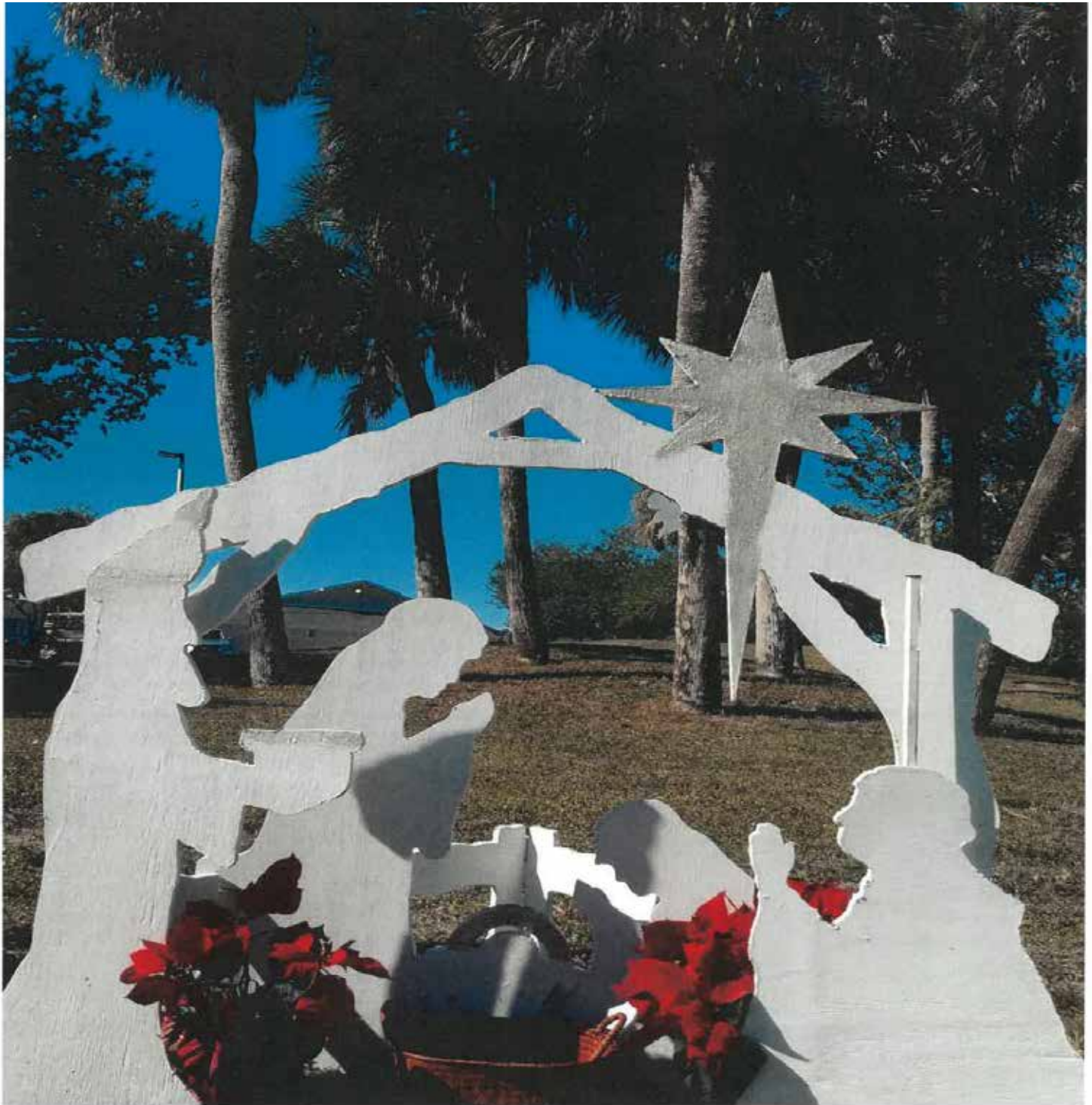

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MANAGER'S REPORT

The office has issued several collection letters and has been successful with collections. I'll continue to issue these letters as long as necessary. The new accounting firm should be finalizing the transfer of our data over to the new QuickBooks financial software to begin using in January of 2026. At our January meeting, I'll provide a full update on delinquencies. There are still errors in some accounts, and I want to thank the owners of those accounts for their patience as we still do have mistakes with some prior postings.

I also want to discuss mailing addresses for VHL related correspondence. I realize this sounds like an easy task, but various software packages have not made this as simple as it sounds. We are trying to improve this once and for all so I have set up new fields within the EasyHOA software that will help the office control where to direct your VHL related mail. If you want your mail to be redirected up North when you leave at the end of the season or anytime really, you will need to inform the office. The Departure Form and Check-In Sheet will also provide a method to re-direct your mail if you'd like.

We also will be creating a new phone directory, and we hope to have the directories ready to distribute at the January POA meeting. Our office administrator, Susie, will have a table set up tomorrow morning in the Rec Building, prior to coffee hour, for owners to verify their mailing addresses and phone numbers for our January POA mailing and the phone directory. An Owner Information Sheet can be downloaded on the website at www.villageofholidaylake.net; please complete the form and return it to the office if you haven't already.

Susie and I will also be offering some Town Hall type learning sessions for EasyHOA in January for those interested. Sign up sheets will be posted at the office building.

Below is a letter we have sent to all owners (via email) providing an additional 30 days to finalize any repairs and or cleanup needed at your property. The Board voted to hire a contractor to clean up lots at the owner's expense for any properties that are not compliant by January 15, 2026.

Since Hurricane Ian devastated our community over 3 years ago, the Board of Directors, Committees, volunteers and most homeowners have repaired and/or replaced their homes and cleaned up the lots. Unfortunately, we still have properties that have not been repaired or still have lots that need to be addressed. This letter is to officially notify all owners and residents that the Board of Directors has set a deadline for all properties to be clean and free of debris within thirty (30) days.

An inspection will be performed on January 15, 2026, and if violations still exist, the Board of Directors will hire a contractor to clean up the lot AT THE OWNERS EXPENSE. The estimated cost to EACH owner and lot will be approximately \$500.00, however, the amount may be higher depending on the amount of work required.

For Owners of Vacant Lots, please ensure the following issues are addressed:

Excessive weeds must be removed,

- Junklike conditions are not allowed,
- Property must be free of construction materials and debris,
- Property/Lot must be free of rocks, concrete blocks,
- Lot must be 'mowable' and level.

For owners of Existing Homes, please ensure the following issues are addressed:

- Exterior of home must be clean,
- Siding must be installed and match,
- All skirting must be installed,

- Skirting must be free of holes, unopen areas, and/or gaps,
- Excessive weeds must be removed,
- Junklike conditions are not allowed,
- Exterior of the property must be free of debris, construction materials, etc.,

Our goal is to have all cleanup completed by January 30th, 2026. We hope everyone participates to help us achieve this goal. Please contact me with any questions or concerns.

The workshop also runs the monthly Cornhole Tournaments to help fund some shop needs or projects within the community that are managed by shop volunteers. If time allows, we may manage another function or two.

House Bill 253, also known as "Offenses Involving Motor Vehicles," introduces tougher penalties for drivers who alter, hide, or use devices to manipulate their plates.

What's no longer allowed:

Any change that affects how a license plate looks or can be read is now a crime, not just a traffic violation.

This includes:

- Changing the plate's color
- Applying sprays, films, coatings or tints
- Using transparent or smoked covers
- Adding lights or reflective devices that shine on the plate
- Installing mechanisms that flip, hide or switch between plates
- Changing the plate's color
- Applying sprays, films, coatings or tints
- Using transparent or smoked covers

- Installing mechanisms that flip, hide or switch between plates

What drivers should do:

- Keep the plate clean, visible and unobstructed
- Check dealer-installed frames; if they cover numbers or stickers, remove them
- Remove any aesthetic or aftermarket accessories that alter the plate
- Make sure the plate light works properly

Penalties under the new law

- Altering, covering or modifying a plate: Second-degree misdemeanor, up to 60 days in jail and a \$500 fine.
- Buying or possessing a device to hide a plate: Second-degree misdemeanor, same penalty as above.
- Manufacturing, selling or distributing such devices: First-degree misdemeanor, up to one year in jail and a \$1,000 fine.
- Using these devices to commit or aid a crime: Third-degree felony, up to five years in prison and a \$5,000 fine.
