The board will be working on standard operating procedures going forward. This is something that will help us know and understand what everyone is responsible for. It will also provide us with a checks and balance system to ensure that the needs of the Village are being taken care of. Committee chairs will be asked for their input during this process.

We have come a long way since hurricane Ian devastated this community. We are close to the finish line. One of the biggest eye sores in the Village will soon be gone. Lisa received an email from the County that they will be moving forward on removing and cleaning up the house on Heston. Many other properties have been cleaned up since the letters were sent out. I want to personally thank all of you who worked on getting this done. This is the kind of community support that we need to make this Village as great as it can be. On a darker note, I am appalled by what happened at the Potluck dinner. If you have a problem with the way something is being done, addressing it at the function is not the time or place to do it. Having someone treat another member of the Village that way is not acceptable. If you have suggestions or think you have a better way, then you should bring it up with the organizer of the event later or better yet be involved with the organization of the event. **If you don't have anything nice to say keep it to yourself.**

We live in a great community, lets all try to continue to make it even better. Be part of the solution not part of the problem.

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MANAGER'S REPORT

A reminder that if you plan to attend any VHL meetings or events, make sure you have your VHL ID. Meetings, events, Bingo, etc. will require the VHL ID. We now have one for renters and permanent residents. Remember, renters must be registered in advance. An ID is not required for a short-term guest; however, they must be accompanied by the owner of the property they are visiting. Wristbands are available for owners, renters and guests for the swimming pool in lieu of an identification card.

In mid-December the Board voted to issue a deadline for all properties, both with homes and vacant lots, to be cleaned up by January 30th, 2026, or the Association will hire a contractor, at each owner's expense, to do what is necessary. The request to clean up properties include weeding, removing debris, removing unnecessary personal items, removing construction materials, eliminating junk-like conditions, installing and/or replacing skirting where needed. We issued a general notice to all residents announcing the deadline and the Board's plan of action. This week I will be working with Board members, and we will inspect every property in the Village between today and this weekend. On Monday, January 16th, we will be notifying the owners of all properties that remain in violation by calling the owner directly, mailing a letter, and hand-delivering a letter if possible. Each owner will have one final opportunity – up until January 30th - to take care of the issues themselves or be charged by the Association.

On vacant lots, we have been and will continue to work with Brightview, the landscaping company, until all lots are satisfactory. Many lots have pieces of concrete mixed in with dirt, rocks and other debris and the mowers have damaged their equipment on more than one occasion. Some lots have survey stakes that are buried or covered, and the mowers have damaged equipment. The owners are responsible for the mounds of dirt, for example, that were left over from the removal of the homes, and these mounds now have grass. Just because there is grass, doesn't mean the mowers are expected to maintain it now. This is where we need the owners' help. We also sent letters to the Realtors selling the lots for their support as well and that has helped.

If you or your guests use the Upper Parking Lot for overflow parking, you must notify the office and will be required to complete a form going forward. We have residents using the lot but do not have VHL Vehicle ID stickers on their cars making it impossible for us to identify if they belong here. If you are not a resident or legitimate guest of the Village, you are not allowed to park there.

We have ordered new cushions for the pool. We've had reports that the pool heat is not accurate, but we have checked it with a separate thermometer, and it is working at the correct temp. The office is quite busy at this time of year, so we thank you for your patience.

We have a POA meeting on Monday, January 26th at 2:00 PM. Please submit your proxies in advance to ensure we have a quorum to hold a legal meeting. Thank you everyone!




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



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THE MEN'S CLUB
