To His Honor, John E. McPherson, Law Judge of the County of Lebanon, State of Pennsylvania:-

In compliance with the requirements of an Act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled, "An act to provide for the incorporation and regulation of certain corporations," approved the 29th day of April, A. D., 1874, and the several supplements thereto, the undersigned, all of whom are citizens of Pennsylvania, having associated themselves together for the purpose herein-after specified, and desiring that they may be incorporated, and that the subscribers hereto and their associates may be decreed to be a corporation for the purposes and upon the terms herein stated, do hereby certify:-

Section 1. The name of the proposed corporation is the "MT. GRETA CAMPMEETING ASSOCIATION OF THE UNITED BRETHERN IN CHRIST."

Section 2. The object of this association shall be to provide and maintain for the members and friends of the Church of the United Brethren in Christ of the East Pennsylvania Conference a proper, convenient, desirable and permanent Campmeeting Ground for the purpose of supporting and conducting the worship of God in gatherings or assemblies at convenient and stated times and in accordance with the discipline and belief of the said Church of the United Brethren in Christ.

Section 3. The business of said corporation is to be transacted at Mt. Gretna, in the Township of *Bernard* County of Leb-
anon, Pennsylvania.

Section 4. Said corporation is to exist perpetually.

Section 5. It shall and may be lawful for said corporation to purchase land, hold real or personal estate in fee simple or otherwise as it may deem necessary, proper and desirable for the objects and purposes of this corporation, and the same or any part to dispose of in parcels or otherwise, or in fee simple or otherwise, on such terms, conditions and restrictions as may be deemed proper, not repugnant, however, to the laws of this Commonwealth; provided, that the yearly income thereof, other than from real estate, shall not exceed the sum of three thousand dollars.

Section 6. The affairs of said corporation shall be managed by a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and a Board of Managers. The said Board of Managers shall consist of nine members, and from their number the President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer shall be by them chosen. The said officers and managers shall be elected annually in the month of August, and shall hold their offices until their successors shall be duly elected; provided, that at least one of said Board of Managers shall be members of the Church of the United Brethren in Christ.

Section 7. The said Board of Managers may adopt, pass and enforce such By-laws as they may deem necessary; subordinate, however, to this Charter, the Constitution and Laws of this Commonwealth, and the Constitution of the United States.

Section 8. The meetings and religious services held on said camp grounds or premises shall, at all times, be under the direction of a committee for that purpose to be appointed by the Board of Managers.

Section 9. The names and residences of the subscribers who are chosen directors or managers for the first year and until their successors are elected are
