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MANAGER'S REPORT

Happy 4th of July and I hope everyone is enjoying their summer so far. The office will be closed on Friday, July 3rd for employees and the office will be closed. The Village is looking great, especially after Delamere Road was paved and 8 other roads were seal coated. We were very pleased with S&H Paving – they did a great job. Many thanks to Barry Webster as well for helping to coordinate this important project.



I am doing inspections on all properties, in the front as well as in the back of the homes, for violations. We are specifically addressing properties with items that may become dangerous in the event of a storm AND properties that will be difficult to mow due to rocks and debris. I'll also be citing properties for weeds and other violations as I perform inspections. Preliminary inspections were completed on Ratan Circle last week; letters were issued and additional letters are being sent. Over the next 2 weeks I will inspect every property. The Board of Directors will be scheduling a board meeting to review the progress and will impose fines as needed. If you would please check your property for these issues, it would save an awful lot of time and money. The office spends hours doing inspections, writing letters and calling homeowners.

These are some of the common violations we find:

- Loose debris - (i.e. pieces of rocks and cement) this is mostly related to vacant lots where there are little white pebbles that the mowers can't mow over;
- Construction materials – violations will be issued for every home with a ladder or other construction items outside the homes; the ladders and table saws must be stored in a shed or in the house;
- Skirting/Siding – there are many homes with no skirting, some with holes in the skirting where you can literally watch animals walk in and out of. Remember all stairs and raised air conditioners must be enclosed in addition to the skirting around the home itself;
- Unattached sheds – I am working with the Environmental Committee to determine sheds that are still not attached, etc. Again, this is a safety issue in a storm and/or hurricane;
- Weeds – the weeds are coming up in the driveway cracks and garden beds. Please maintain the weeds.

Another project underway is controlling wild pigs and boars. They are damaging private and common property, and we expect the problem to worsen as the rainy season continues. The animals are moving closer to the inner area and, as noted in my letter posted on the EasyHOA website, they often carry disease(s) and pose a risk to people and other animals, especially mothers with young, which can be highly protective. Please do not approach any traps if you see them.

To update our governing documents and address concerns about the growing number of investors seeking to purchase in VHL, the Board of Directors is working with the Governing Documents Committee to revise the Declaration of Covenants and Bylaws as needed. Over the next several months, you will begin to see more communications from the Board of Directors regarding these updates. The Board plans to present the proposed amendments to the membership at the November POA meeting; please keep an eye out for these communications.

Important Traffic Reminder for S McCall Rd

What's Happening?

Deputies are seeing many drivers staying in the left lane without passing on S McCall Rd (from the El Jobean Bridge to Beach Rd). This causes traffic backups, frustration, and unsafe lane changes. It also slows down emergency vehicles trying to reach calls for service.

Why It Matters

- Staying in the left lane when you're not passing creates congestion
- It increases aggressive driving and crash risks
- Backup in traffic makes it harder for drivers to move over for police, fire, and EMS
- Florida law requires drivers to keep right except when passing or preparing for a left turn

How You Can Help

- Use the right lane for regular driving
- Use the left lane only when passing or turning left
- When you see emergency lights or hear a siren, move over safely and quickly
- Stay alert, be patient, and share the road responsibly

What Deputies Are Doing

- Increasing patrols on S McCall Rd
- Conducting traffic stops for left lane impeding
- Providing education and warnings when appropriate
- Issuing citations when needed to keep the roadway safe

Our Goal

- Smoother traffic flow
- Fewer crashes and reckless driving calls
- Faster emergency response times
- A safer community for everyone

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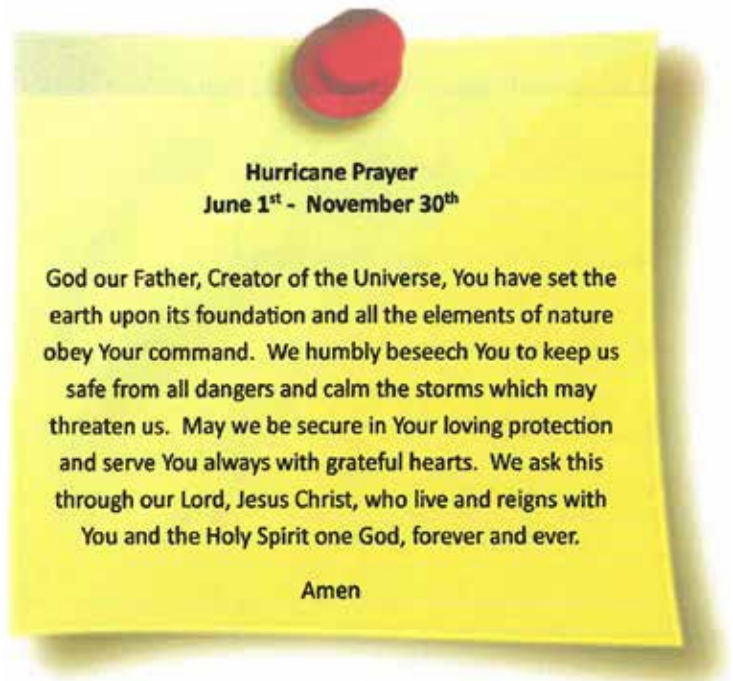

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Red, White & Blue Sorbet Loaf Recipe



1. **Make the cherry sorbet base:** Puree cherries, sugar, lemon juice, and salt in a food processor until smooth, about 1 minute. Strain through a wire mesh strainer, pressing on solids to remove as much liquid as possible; discard solids. Whisk in vodka, if using, and food coloring. Chill until cold, at least 2 hours.
2. **Make the lime sorbet base:** Heat sugar and 3/4 cup water in a small saucepan over medium-high, whisking often until sugar dissolves. Transfer to a bowl or liquid measuring cup, and cool to room temperature. Whisk in lime juice, coconut milk, vodka, if using, and salt. Chill until cold, at least 2 hours.
3. **Make the coconut sorbet base:** Heat coconut water and sugar in a small saucepan over medium-high, whisking often, until sugar dissolves. Remove from heat; whisk in coconut milk, vodka, if using, salt, and food coloring. Transfer to a bowl or glass measuring cup, and chill until cold, at least 2 hours.
4. Line a 9 1/4- by 5 1/4-inch loaf pan with a strip of parchment paper, leaving a 1-inch overhang on the long sides. Pour cherry sorbet base into an ice-cream machine. Process according to manufacturer's instructions. Spread in an even layer in prepared loaf pan. Place a piece of parchment paper directly on surface. Freeze until firm, at least 1 hour.
5. Pour chilled lime sorbet base into an ice-cream machine. Process according to manufacturer's instructions. Remove parchment, and spread in an even layer over frozen cherry sorbet. Place a piece of parchment directly on surface of lime sorbet. Freeze until firm, at least 1 hour.
6. Pour chilled coconut sorbet base into an ice-cream machine. Process according to manufacturer's instructions. Remove parchment, and spread in an even layer over frozen lime sorbet in pan. Place a piece of parchment directly on surface of coconut sorbet. Cover tightly with plastic wrap and freeze until firm, at least 8 hours.
7. When ready to serve, turn loaf out onto a cutting board. Slice and serve immediately, garnished with cherries.

The Ultimate Layered Patriotic Cocktail

This recipe creates a stunning red, white, and blue visual while delivering a sweet and citrusy flavor profile.

Ingredients:

- 2 oz Grenadine
- 6 oz Lemonade (e.g., Simply Lemonade)
- 3 oz Unflavored Vodka
- 2 oz Blue Curaçao
- Ice cubes

Instructions:

1. **The Red Layer:** Pour the grenadine directly into the bottom of a tall glass, then fill the glass to the top with ice.
2. **The White Layer:** Mix the lemonade and vodka together in a measuring cup. Slowly and steadily pour this mixture over the ice.
3. **The Blue Layer:** Hold an upside-down spoon just above the white layer. Very slowly pour the blue curaçao over the back of the spoon so it cascades onto the top of the drink.
4. Serve immediately and enjoy!

Non-Alcoholic / Family-Friendly Layered Drink

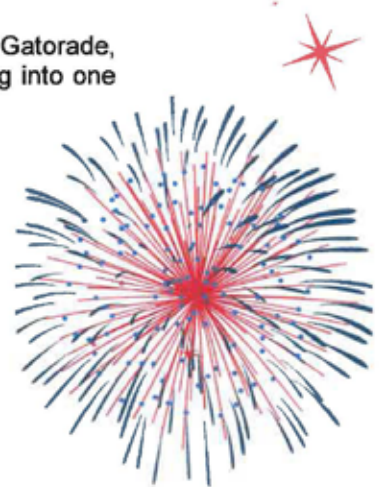
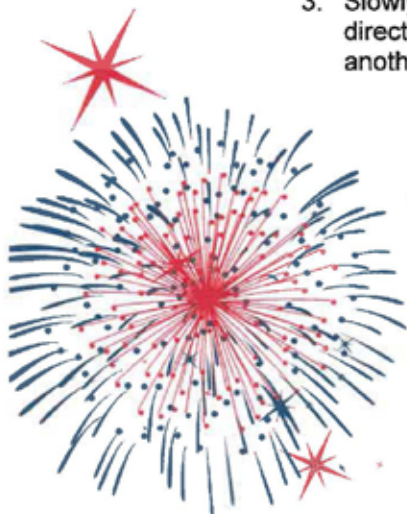
If you are hosting guests of all ages, you can easily adapt the layered effect using non-alcoholic, sugary drinks. The key is pouring liquids with the highest sugar content at the bottom

Ingredients:

- 1 cup Cran-Apple Juice (Red layer)
- 1 cup Piña Colada flavored drink (e.g., SoBe Piña Colada) (White layer)
- 1 cup Blue Gatorade (Blue layer)
- Ice cubes

Instructions:

1. Fill a glass about 1/3 full with the Cran-Apple juice.
2. Fill the rest of the glass to the top with ice.
3. Slowly pour the white piña colada drink, followed by the blue Gatorade, directly onto the ice layer to prevent the colors from bleeding into one another.
