Le Carré, three streets filled only with bars and pubs, is the heart of the nightlife in Liège.

Don't let the Carré's quaint shops and restaurants during daylight hours fool you. At night, the Carré swarms with droves of giddy bar-hoppers! You can find classy bars ("L'Orange Givrée", "Le Cuba'r") and more student-oriented pubs ("L'Escalier", "L'Aller Simple", "L'A-fond Liégeois") plus dozens of others.


## 2 *Enjoy a frenetic evening of Belgian soccer*

On the first day of school in September 1898, the pupils of Collège Saint-Servais in Liège started a football club, the Royal Standard Club of Liège. They initially joined the Belgian First League in 1909 before returning to the lower leagues a few years later. The club then gained promotion back to the top division in 1921 and has never been relegated since.

Over the years, the Royal Standard de Liège became one of the most successful football clubs in Belgium, having won the Belgian league on ten occasions. Standard players are nicknamed 'les Rouches' because of their red jerseys. The French word for red (rouge) when pronounced with a Liège accent, sounds like rouche.

### 3 *Go hiking in the Valley of Ninglinspo*






## Savor a Liège waffle

Belgian beer, Speculoos cookies, and French fries (in reality, a Belgian invention) are, as in all Belgian cities, on sale throughout Liège. However what sets Liège apart from other Belgian destinations are its authentic Liège waffles, which contain delicious exploding sugar crystals. While most of the well-known waffle shops use industrially produced batter, the bakery "Une gaufrette saperlipopette" has made headlines since its opening for offering 100% home-made waffles.




