

WHAT IS ROAD TO LE MANS?

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The first season of the Michelin Le Mans Cup was held in 2016 and was exclusively for GT3 cars.

That season the Road to Le Mans event, which was a single 55-minute race, also saw LMP3 cars invited to take part but on a non-championship basis.

In 2017 multi class racing became part of the Michelin Le Mans Cup with the LMP3 category part of the series. Also in 2017, the Road to Le Mans saw two 55-minute races for the first time.

The driver crews must include at least one bronze rated driver, with the other driver being either bronze, silver or gold, platinum rated drivers are not eligible to compete in the Michelin Le Mans Cup.

At all events, except Road to Le Mans, the bronze driver must take part in qualifying. At Road to Le Mans either driver can qualify for race 1 while the bronze driver must take part in qualifying for race 2.

At the end of the season the prize for the winning GT3 team is an automatic invitation to the 24 Hours of Le Mans in the LMGTE Am class.



The GT3 grid will feature eleven cars run by seven teams – 5 x Ferrari 488 GT3, 2 x Porsche 911 GT3R, 1 x Aston Martin Vantage GT3, 2 x Audi R8 LMS and 1 x Mercedes AMG GT3.



With Sarah Bovy making her debut for Iron Lynx in the 24 Hours of Le Mans, Doriane Pin will be joined by Manuela Gostner in the no9 Iron Lynx Ferrari, the young French driver already securing two podium finishes at Le Castellet and Monza so far this season.





Championship leader
Nicolas Leutwiler will be joined in the no2 Pzoberer Zurichsee by TFT Porsche by Julien Andlauer. Leutwiler is currently on 55 points after taking a win and two thirds in the first three races of the season. The Swiss driver is 16 points ahead of Ken Abe in the no51 AF Corse Ferrari who will be joined by Edward Cheever for RTLM.



The Team Championship leading no8 Iron Lynx Ferrari 488 GT3 will see American Logan Sargeant return to the cockpit of the Ferrari. He will be joined by former LMP3 front runner Rory Penttinen.

2017 Road to Le Mans double race winner Ahmad Al Harthy will compete in the no95 Oman Racing Aston Martin Vantage alongside American Michael Dinan.



Former 24 Hours of Le Mans winner and current FIA World Endurance LMGTE Am Champion Emmanuel Collard will race in the no83 Racetivity Mercedes alongside fellow Frenchman Charles-Henri Samani.

Reigning champions DKR Engineering have won

three of the nine Road to Le Mans races held since 2016, with Cool Racing, Graff, Eurointernational, Lanan **Racing, United Autosports and DC** Racing all winning on one occasion.







The Road To Le Mans LMP3 grid

will consist of 35 cars run by 21 different teams, with 25 x Ligier JS P320, 9 x Duqueine M30-D08 and 1 x Adess-03 EVO.



Round 3 winners and championship leaders Scott Andrews and Gerald Kraut (no22 United Autosports Ligier) are on 50 points, just two points ahead of Tony Wells and Colin Noble (no7 Nielsen Racing Ligier), with John Schauerman and Wayne Boyd (no23 United Autosports Ligier) on 45 points in third.

With Wayne Boyd making his debut at the 24 Hours of Le Mans with United Autosports he will be replaced by Duncan Tappy at the wheel of the n°23 Ligier.



will see Jean Glorieux and Laurents Hörr reunited. The pair won their first Road to Le Mans race together in 2020, with Hörr also winning in 2019 alongside François Kirmann and **Glorieux winning with Alex Toril in 2017.**



Road to Le Mans will see the first entry by an all-Australian team, Revere Lifestyle. The team are running the only Adess-03 EVO on the grid for Andres Latorre Canon and fellow Aussie Garnet Patterson.



After finishing second in Monza,

Alexander Mattschull and Nicolas Varrone will be looking for another podium finish at Le Mans in the no66 Rinaldi Racing Duqueine.



Matt Bell and Maurice Smith

took a double podium at the Road to Le Mans in 2020. After finishing second at Le Castellet last month, the Anglo-American duo are aiming for the top step of the podium in Le Mans in the no69 Cool Racing Ligier.

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Scotland's Colin Noble has been a regular feature on the Michelin Le Mans Cup grid since 2017 with Nielsen Racing, with all bar one of those seasons driving alongside his English teammate Tony Wells.

The British pairing are currently second in the Michelin Le Mans Cup standings, just two points behind the championship leaders after winning at Le Castellet in June. We caught up with Colin as he prepares for his 9th and 10th Road to Le Mans races.

HOW HAS THE SEASON GONE SO FAR FOR YOU AND TONY?

"The season is going well. We were pretty unlucky at the start in Barcelona where we were looking for a podium, but a late Full Course Yellow caught us out and dropped us from P3 to 8th in the last ten minutes, so that was a little frustrating.

"However, we've been in contention in every race, and we got a win at Paul Ricard, where we had a lot of pace in the car, and at Monza as well where we came through the pack to take a podium. We've had plenty of battles and we've come out of it pretty well."

YOU'VE COMPETED IN 8 OF THE 9 RTLM RACES HELD SINCE 2016, 6 OF THOSE WITH TONY, INCLUDING A PODIUM FINISH IN 2019. WHAT MAKES LE MANS SPECIAL FOR YOU AS A DRIVER?

"Le Mans is such an iconic track, it's the whole atmosphere and the history; it's certainly a special place to drive around. To have the chance to racing on it is fantastic and it's all the sweeter when you make it onto that famous podium."

ENTRY LIST

MLMC RACES ARE USUALLY 2-HOURS AND EACH OF THE RTLM RACES ARE JUST 55-MINUTES. DO YOU APPROACH THE RACES AT LE MANS ANY DIFFERENTLY THAN A USUAL MLMC EVENT?

"Not particularly, the biggest thing in these events is the number of guest entries where the championship doesn't matter to them, so you really have to try and keep your nose clean and keep out of trouble. It's such a short race that if anything does go wrong there is no time to recover; it's such a sprint."

THE 2021 RTLM GRID IS GOING TO FEATURE 35 LMP3 CARS. WHO DO YOU SEE AS YOUR MAIN OPPOSITION AND WHAT ARE YOUR EXPECTATIONS FOR THE RTLM WEEKEND?

"It will be the normal suspects who are there or there abouts in the championship. We will be in contention, but we don't worry too much about that, we just try and do as good a job as we can. We'll just worry about ourselves and hopefully we'll come out near the top."



While the Michelin Le Mans Cup has offered inexperienced drivers of all ages the opportunity to compete in endurance racing on some of Europe's top circuits, there has also been an influx of ambitious and talented teenagers who have chosen to compete in sportscars rather than go down the single seater career path.

The Michelin Le Mans Cup saw young drivers such as Phil Hanson and Thomas Laurent begin their endurance careers before progressing to the very top of the endurance ladder and this year has seen a new crop of teenagers join the grid in the search of glory.

Finn Gehrsitz (16) – no5 Phoenix Racing Ligier JS P320-Nissan

Finn Gehrsitz was born in Stuttgart in September 2004 and after a pretty successful karting career, which saw Finn finish the 2016 Rotax Max Challenge Germany Mini Max as Vice Champion, he switched to cars for the 2021 season, racing for Phoenix Racing in the Michelin Le Mans Cup, the highly successful German team also making their endurance racing debut.

Finn, and fellow German Hamza Owega, finished 8th in Barcelona on his debut and followed it up with a 5th place at Le Castellet. At Monza the young German took pole position for the 2-Hour race in Italy but, unfortunately, a DNF was the result.

The all-German team will be looking to take that next step at Le Mans, with a podium finish beckoning for the Gehrsitz and Owega.

After a successful term in karts, French driver Doriane Pin switched to cars in 2020, taking part in the Renault Clio Cup France that season. At the end of the year, she was selected by the FIA Women in Motorsport and Ferrari Driver Academy to drive for Iron Lynx in the 2021 Michelin Le Mans Cup alongside Belgium's Sarah Bovy.

After missing the opening round in Barcelona, the all-female team bounced back with a third placed finish at Paul Ricard in Round 2 and then moved up one place on the podium at Monza, Doriane crossing the line just 16 seconds behind her highly experienced teammate Paolo Ruberti.

For Road to Le Mans Doriane is joined by Manuela Gostner and she will be hoping for her third podium finish in three races - perhaps even the top step beckons!

Antoine Doquin (17 years)

Cool Racing Ligier JS P320-Nissan









17-year-old French driver Antoine Doquin is racing alongside Britain's Josh Skelton in the no37 Cool Racing Ligier-Nissan. On his debut Antoine shocked the field by claiming pole position in Barcelona and then followed it with a second pole at Le Castellet for Round 2.

In both races Antoine lead from the front, battling hard against some strong opposition. In Barcelona a trip into the gravel for Josh Skelton meant a drop down the order, eventually finishing 12th. In Le Castellet Skelton's bad luck continued with a technical issue resulting in retirement after two trips to the pits and a small fire.

In Monza the pairing had marginally better luck, with Antoine qualifying 3rd and the pair finishing 8th at the end of the race.

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OTHERS TO WATCH AT ROAD TO LE MANS

As well as the young drivers competing full season in the Michelin Le Mans Cup, several others will be joining the grid at Le Mans from the European Le Mans Series.

17-year-old French driver Mathieu de Barbuat and 18-year-old German Niklas Kruetten will be joining forces for the two 55-minute races at Le Mans racing the no19 Cool Racing Ligier JS P320-Nissan.



NIKLAS KRUETTEN

Niklas is the currently LMP3 championship leader in the ELMS after scoring two victories in Barcelona and at the Red Bull Ring, another podium at Le Castellet and fourth place finish at Monza for Cool Racing alongside teammates Matt Bell and Nicolas Maulini.



MATHIEU DE BARBUAT

Mathieu de Barbuat took a stunning LMP3 victory at the 4 Hours of Monza on his ELMS debut, finishing on the top step of the podium alongside Laurents Hörr in the no4 DKR Engineering Duqueine in only his second car race.



MALTHE JAKOBSEN

17-year-old Dane Malthe Jakobsen has already proven to be a driver to watch after securing a podium finish alongside Alex Kapadia and Michael Benham at the 4 Hours of Barcelona in April and a battling 4th place at Le Castellet. The 2019 Danish Renault F4 Champion will race alongside 2018 Road to Le Mans and 2021 MLMC Round 1 winner Michael Benham in the no14 RLR MSport Ligier-Nissan.
